We realize that the ultimate authority in A.A. is a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. As trusted servants, our job is to bring information to our groups in order that the group can reach an informed group conscience. Passing along this group conscience we are helping to maintain the unity and strength so vital to our fellowship. Let us, therefore, have the patience and tolerance to listen while others share, the courage to speak up when we have something to share, and the wisdom to do what is right for our groups and A.A. as a whole.

CONSIDERATION OF THE MINUTES

The 2012 Pre-Conference Assembly Minutes were considered and corrections were:

- ◆ Kathy C– page 3, 1st column – ***SPELLING CORRECTED***
- ◆ Delegate's Report – 9th paragraph "Gmail is sharing experience, strength and hope. You can check on the right side of their email/website." ***REMOVED SENTENCE – insufficient information and an outside issue.***
- ◆ Delegate's Report - Page 4, 2nd column, 1st paragraph – "Another topic that was tabled was the discussion to add 12 Concepts to the 12 and 12; pricing is being obtained" ***CHANGED TO: "Another topic tabled: discussion of a request to add the 12 Concepts to the current edition of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions. The Trustees Committee on Literature tabled further discussion on this item so that further information can be gathered on pricing options." DELETE NEXT SENTENCE: If Tradition 11 is revised, costs could be included.***
- ◆ Last paragraph "There is an opening... Mini-PRAASA has an election..." ***Last Paragraph CHANGED TO: "There will be two openings for Class A (non-alcoholic) Trustees, after the 2013 GSC. Please send resumes for candidates to the delegate, in time to submit to New York by July 1st. A new trustee-at-large/U.S. will be elected at the GSC in 2013. At our CNIA Mini-PRAASA, we will hold an election to select CNIA's candidate for trustee-at-large/U.S."***
- ◆ Page 7, 3rd column – E-Services not Lee W it is Lee P – ***CHANGED TO LEE P***
- ◆ Page 9, 2nd column – 'Lela, you have our group ...' ***conscience*** not conscious – ***CHANGED SPELLING***

Assembly / Liaison Reports

2012 Pre-Conference Assembly – D-31 and 32 – Liz reported that it was an amazing experience. Profit was \$915.15. They did not over budget for dinners. Please remember to Pre-Register because it helps the host committee with the financials and counts. Everything went smoothly with a small committee and God.

Mini-PRAASA – Titia A, Chair, D-22 and D-30 are co-hosts at Jackson Rancheria, Jackson, CA on October 19-21.

2013 Winter Assembly – Terry D, Alt-DCM - D-19's host committee met three times this year. We have secured Franklin Hall at Yuba City Fairgrounds, January 19-20, 2013. This is the same hall used two years ago. A deposit has been paid and the next significant payment due (refundable cleaning deposit) is due 10/19/12. All fees are due by 11/19/12. FCYPAA – Thank you for your letter of recommendation and support. The new 2013 Bid Committee, WACYPAA, has had elections and are moving forward.

H&I – Woody R, No. Calif. H&I Liaison to Area 07 - There is a small display with H&I literature and materials; Pink Cans are available. H&I Steering Committee met last Saturday. They accepted reports regarding reimbursement of travel; a proposed change for the pink pamphlet; procedure for funds and collections. These will be forwarded to General Committee Meeting at Cameron Park. Spanish Regional Chair submitted a proposal to divide Region 80 into four Regions; the proposal was accepted.

Eservices (eservices@cnia.org) Jenn D – E-Services has been doing a number of things -- trying to retire the tape recorder with a digital recorder; and, looking at renting an assisted listening system. The quote was \$300 for the weekend. I gave the cost of purchasing an assisted listening system for members with difficulty hearing to the Finance Committee. I need a sense of how many receivers needed: 8 people raised their hands. Registrant information for CNIA website has not been updated in a while. From now on, every new Panel, the Chair will be the Registrant and the E-Services Chair will be the Technical person. This information used to be public but now, after a little fee, it is now private. Eservices will be doing extensive look at whether our email website, Network Solutions, is meeting our needs and if we need to change our provider as the contract is up this summer. AAGrapevine.org is currently being formatted for use via mobile devices. Completion date is May 1. It can easily be viewed on your smartphone or tablet. Research and discussion into several 2013/2014 new revenue options is underway. Audio Plan was approved at GSC. 2013 calendars and pocket planners are out. I will order some to have at the fall Assembly, but remember that you can order them online at the Grapevine store and have them shipped to your home. This is another way that you and your Group can support the Grapevine. I have Emotional Sobriety 2 and Step by Step and Spiritual Awakenings 2 in stock.

Literature (literature@cnia.org) Celia B – I have free service material in English and Spanish that we haven't carried before: a history of AA around the world, histories of the Serenity

Prayer and the Preamble, and 9-page list of services provided by AAWS and GSO. I am available to come to your events and look forward to sharing our literature with you. I haven't been very busy this month, although I do have some events scheduled for the summer. Please have me come to your events. At the last assembly, we had \$343 in sales. Remember the literature position is not about moving product—it's about increasing knowledge of our literature and helping people use it as a resource for recovery and service. A lot of the free, little known service material is just as useful and important as some of our books. Come check it out. There's a treat for each of you in the DCM box: the service piece "Sharing from DCMs to a DCM". Again, the subject is pretty obvious.

DCM Reports

D-09 Steve C, DCM – The District website is up and we are working on a District hotline that is to be linked to the web group. A 2nd Service Workshop in Greenview and our District Picnic will be at Lake Siskiyou.

D-11 Cindy C, DCM – We had a workshop on Agenda Items with Lela and Vikki attending. Cindy was unable to attend but Maureen stood in and did a good job. We have a new GSR here today, Gwendlyn, who was a GSR 20 years ago when Inez was Delegate. We're having a General Service/GSR School Workshop in Redding with free pizza!

D-15 Jenn D, DCM – Katie, GSR, is at her first Assembly. Tom G needed to step down as DCM. At April District meeting we discussed what other Districts have done and I was asked to take over. We will have elections next week for new Alt-DCM. We participated in Project Homeless Connect and approx 500 people received information. The District Web Committee is preparing guidelines on what to post on the website. Currently a group is looking to post an event and will have to visit a business meeting in order to put information on the website. The website is co-owned by District 15 and two Intergroups. Budget was approved and went to a fiscal year budget instead of a calendar year.

D-17 Jan H, DCM – We have 12 people at the Assembly. Joe is here for his first Assembly.

The District approved a \$200 contribution toward the Unity Day Picnic on June 30 at Discovery Park in Sacramento. This is the first year that D-17 has participated! We welcome D-54 to the picnic - *Hola, amigos!*

D-19 Judy T, DCM – New GSR Sandy is here for her first Assembly! The Finance Committee held their first meeting in April. They developed three goals: (1) Create an Annual Budget; (2) Establish a prudent reserve of \$1,000; (3) Research and recommend answering service options.

Efforts to establish a prudent reserve could include workshops on a variety of A.A. topics hosted by the groups or the District. I gave a report on my research of AT&T telephone answering service options. I researched three more options and that went to the Finance Committee. The committee asked for additional information from other services. The Annual District Calendar has been distributed.

The Sutter Buttes Round Up was held on May 4, 5 & 6th and had low attendance. I presented a summary of the Agenda Item reports from the Pre-Conference highlighting the items emphasized by our Delegate. D-19 members who attended the conference gave brief summaries of their observations and involvement. Historically, D-19 has not been actively involved in

the Agenda Item process. I have been following through with my goal to make this process a priority for this Panel 62 term. Some aspect of this process will be included in every District meeting agenda. Additionally, I am encouraging the GSRs to become actively involved in taking the Area motions to their groups for their input. This process is a priority. · Mike K, Co-Chair, gave a GSR School and Lela M, Delegate, came to give her GSC report.

D-20 Dan L, DCM -- Reportbacks from all those who attended the Pre-Conference Assembly were filled with appreciation for the process. Each GSR expressed gratitude for having had the opportunity to share their Group's Conscience with our Delegate, Lela, and with the General Service Conference. I find that one of the great gifts of service in Alcoholics Anonymous is the constant invitation to participate in A.A. as a whole at every level, and the Pre-Conference Assembly is a shining example of that gift. D-20 sent love to Lela for her service at the Conference, and while she was there she found time to mail off a card to let us know that we were there with her.

D-21 Dick B, DCM – Alt-GSRs: Kimberly T, Rocklin; Ray A, Lincoln Hills; and Wayne C, Auburn are attending their first assembly. We have several events: PI/CPC annual Workshop at Roseville Tuesday Night Group; Rod B, Past Trustee, was speaker at Loomis Ice Cream Social; our Delegate, Lela M, with GSC reportback; and Auburn Unity Day. D-22 Tom A, DCM – Our last District meeting we had 16 in attendance. We have 10 GSRs attending the Post Conference Assembly today. GSR registrations are up-to-date. Groups have reported an increase in the 7th Tradition and it is reflected in District contributions. The District is fiscally responsible. Our West Slope Unity Group is open to new ideas for the Quarterly Speaker Meeting Evening format. Your ideas for possible evening activities are appreciated. The search continues for a Recording Secretary, BTG and Grapevine rep. Our Group Inventory, Our Guideline Review, and feedback of the Post Conference Assembly are on the Agenda for next meeting. I am very much interested in contacting other DCMs who have done a District inventory to get feedback on how to do. It's an honor and privilege to serve as the DCM at D-22.

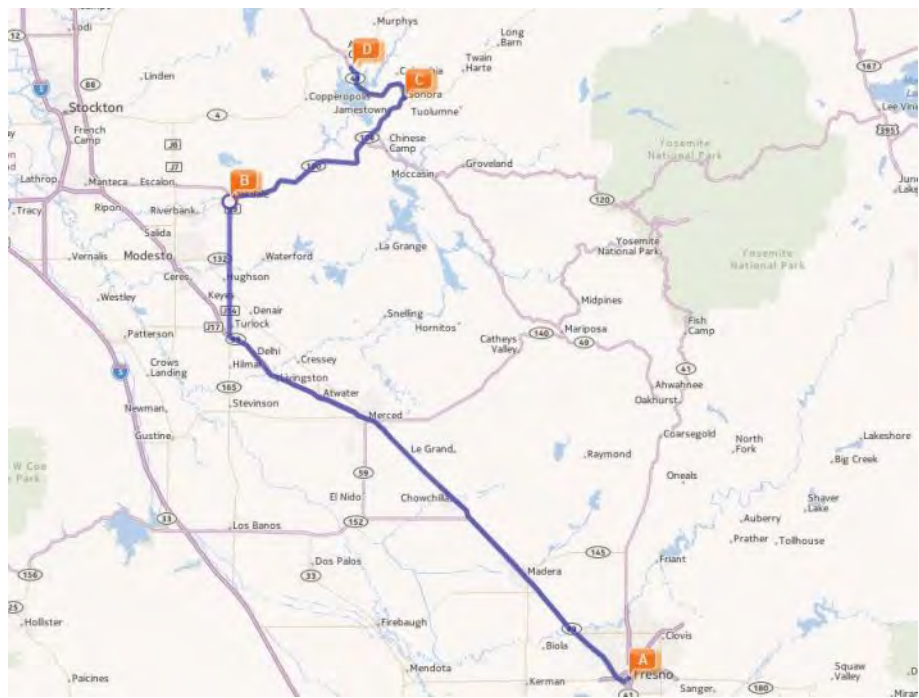

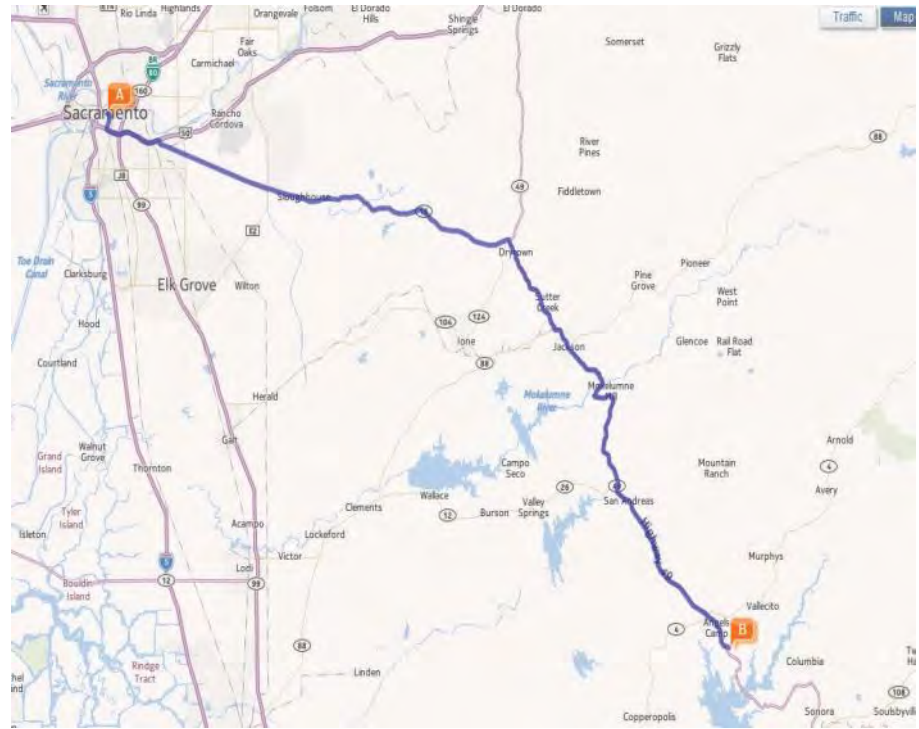

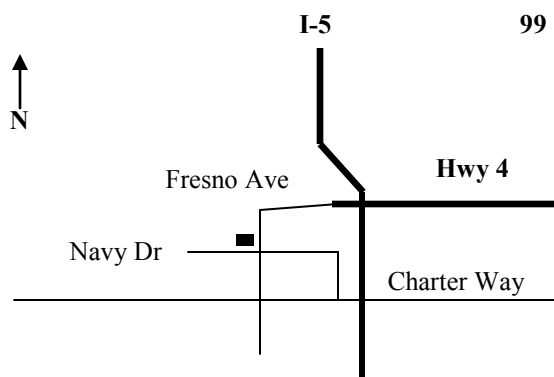
