After the announcements, we went right into the assembly reports, liaison reports, DCM reports, appointed chair reports and officer reports. The Finance Committee presented the preliminary spending plan for 2013. Please review the spending plan and be prepared for discussion, and perhaps, approval at the Winter Assembly.

In my report, I discussed the letter I received from our accountant. Attached to the letter, were the 2011 taxes that I signed and sent. Yay! The letter states that there is no indication that CNIA is a California non-profit corporation or has a California corporation identification number. We have one with the Federal government, but not with the State of California. Nor was the accountant able to find CNIA listed as a charity with the State of California Registry of Charitable Trusts. Both of these items are required. We are not sure why these items were omitted in the past, but we are going to do everything we can to make it right.

The accountant has agreed to file the Charitable Trust with the California Department of Justice and file the necessary forms for the non-profit status with the California Franchise Board for a fee of \$250.00. We do not know what penalties, if any, are involved. But the program of Alcoholics Anonymous has taught us how to be responsible and accountable. And how to get things done "straight forward and unafraid". So that is what we are going to do.

After the reports, we briefly discussed old business:

This motion will be discussed and perhaps voted on at the Winter Assembly in January 2013.

Translation – **translation@cnia.org** – **Luz Maria** – I attended my first Mini-PRAASA in Angels Camp Oct 19-21. I translated the assembly, Grapevine and PI/CPC roundtables in Spanish. On Oct 23, I translated at the Un Nuevo Camino AA Group in West Sacramento for Kelley M who shared about PI/CPC. Saturday, December 1st, I will translate at the Foro XI in Fresno. A member gave me an enlarged and laminated Spanish Preamble, Traditions and Concepts for future use at ACM and assemblies.

DISTRICT REPORTS

D-09 – **Steve C, DCM** – The D09 meeting on November 3rd had 18 in attendance. We had 12 GSRs representing 30 meetings. A new Sisqypa Representative Sean was welcomed and we are committed to assist in any way possible. We are planning a Traditions Workshop in January 2013 and the Post Conference Assembly in May 2013. Three groups have bid to host the assembly.

D-11 – **Cindy C, DCM** – We had 96 attending the Traditions Workshop on Nov 4. We sent flyers out early; had free pizza and YPAAs gave a Traditions skit. GSRs are encouraged to attend the Tradition 7 Workshop planned for February 10; and, YPAAs want to do a skit on T7. Our last meeting had 10 GSRs.

D-15 – **Jenn D, DCM** – Oct 27 our District met; we need a new treasurer. November and December meetings are combined to Dec 10 instead of the last Monday of the month. We hope to send District Officers to assemblies and are investigating that possibility.

The District is hoping to host a workshop on Archives, Trusted Servant -What It Is, and Safety after the Winter Assembly.

Our District met 10/27 and distributed the 2012 General Service Conference Reports. Our District Inventory Committee gave 23 recommendations to discuss and possibly implement. Our 2013 Spending Plan was approved unanimously. On Oct 27, we hosted a Grapevine Workshop with Connie G giving Grapevine history and a 4 member panel on various topics. November 3rd, D27 and 29 co-hosted an Acronym Workshop to learn more about BTG, NCCAA, CNIA, etc. We will have an election for the Alt-DCM at the November meeting.

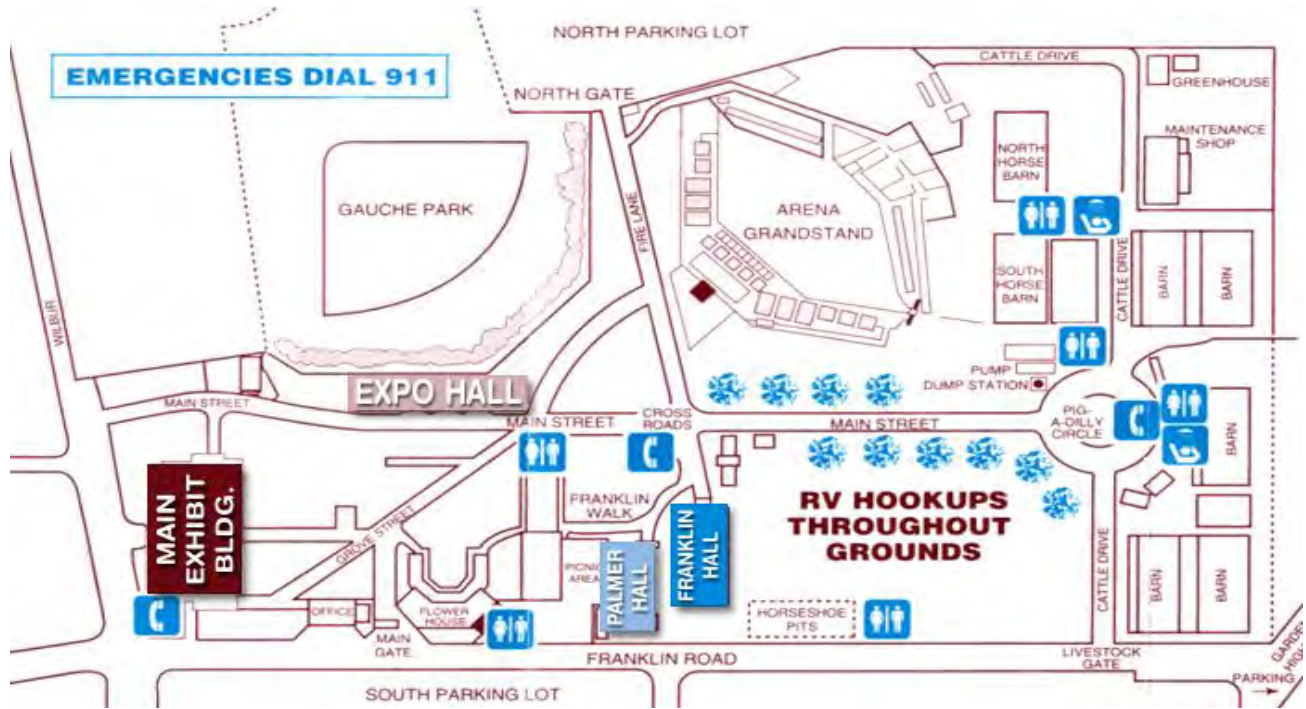

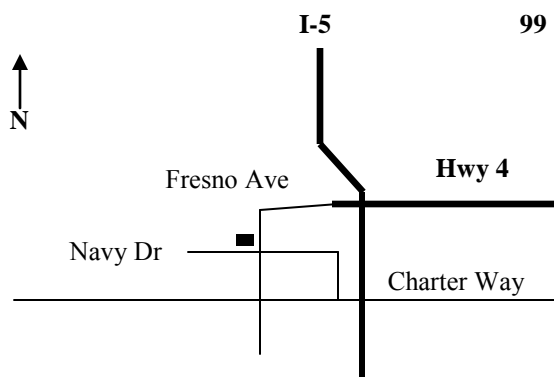
