Rod's report was emailed to you from the October board weekend, and the AAWS Highlights for October in English. Please let me know if you did not receive a copy.

Highlights from Rod's report are:

Literature

The subcommittee on the devel-

opment of literature focused on spirituality requested a rough draft be prepared. The committee agreed to forward the draft copy of the revised pamphlet "Circles of Love and Service" to the 2013 Conference Committee on Literature. The committee agreed to forward the request to replace language in the second paragraph of the dust jacket of the 4th edition of Alcoholics Anonymous to the Conference Committee on Literature. The committee agreed to forward a request to change the wording in the pamphlet "Questions and Answers on Sponsorship" regarding "when newcomers resist the spiritual side of the program" to the Conference Committee on Literature.

General

Corrections - A staff member attended the BTG workshop weekend.

Some attendees for the World Service Meeting were stranded in New York when Hurricane Sandy hit; all were returned home safely.

eBooks sold – since 12/9/2011 4,351 Big Books and 3,852 12x12s. AAWS board agreed to forward an agenda item to the 63rd GSC on the selling of ebooks through 3rd party vendors.

There are 19 pending international translations of the big book

Grapevine is in the positive. The GV Board discussed possible restructuring, overall digital plans, social media technology committee, re-naming of the

isay forum. GVB approved a request that the GSB develop a process to share existing mailing and membership lists. What do you think? AAWS and GV are sharing about website infrastructures – to foster compatibility.

GS Conference – The committee reviewed list of agenda items submitted to conference assignments. The committee forwarded an agenda item to change due date for topics from January 15th to December 15th. The committee discussed and took no action to form a BTG conference – much autonomy and better handled locally.

Corrections – discussed making a digital copy available for “Sharing from Behind the Walls”. Subcommittee on Corrections engagement Planning – agreed to review all materials used by Corrections to take a strategic look at how our message is carried to the incarcerated alcoholic. Request for sharing on “AA in Correctional Facilities” I will ask H&I. They discussed how different areas carry on pre-release contact programs, and requested that consideration of this work be in the scope of the subcommittee on engagement planning.

International Convention – planning is under way. The logo was reviewed.

Nominating Committee – are discussing possible new description for duties of the Chair of the GSB, and hiring of the GM GSO, and GV Exec Editor/Publisher. They are discussing possible creation of a trustees committee on GV.

Public Information – Tengo Esperanza. (Note CCF was very grateful for cooperation between CNIA and central offices). There was a DECISION for A.A. to not have a Facebook page.

Finance – Committee heard a verbal report concerning 2013 budget projections. Currently the draft version projects a \$400,000 loss.

AAWS finalized a policy on literature published by AAWS which does not require consideration by the GS Conference and forwarded it to the Board.

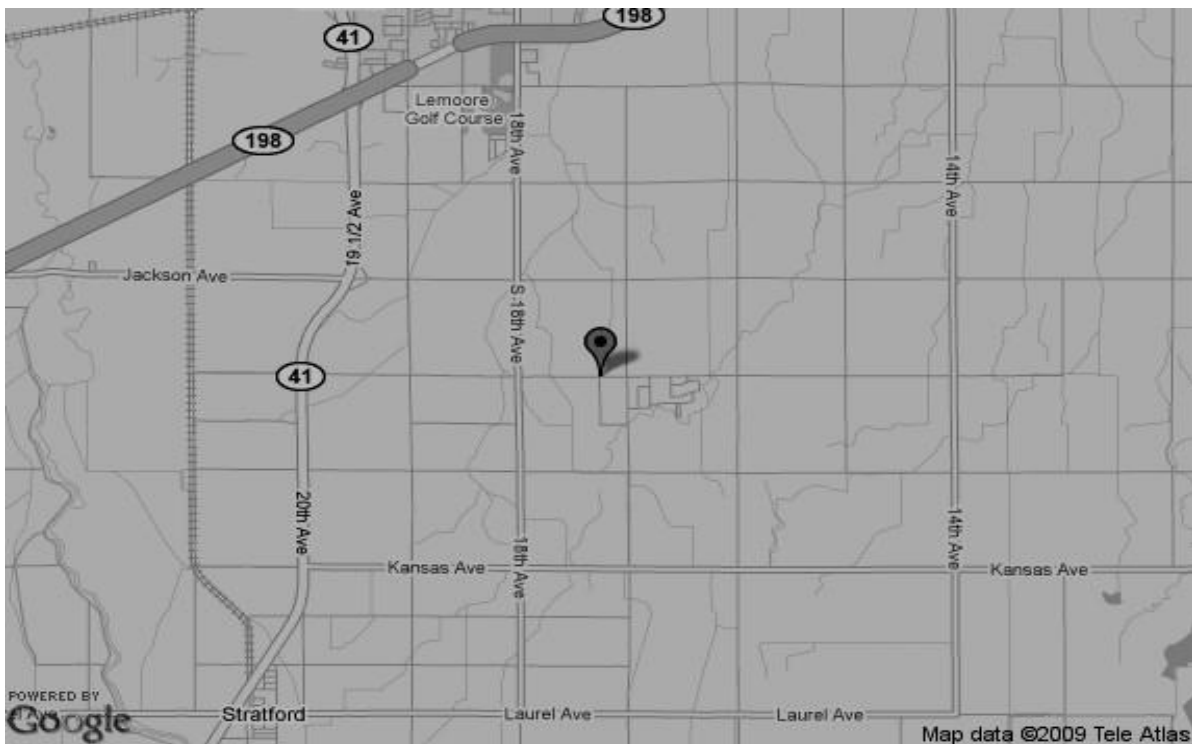

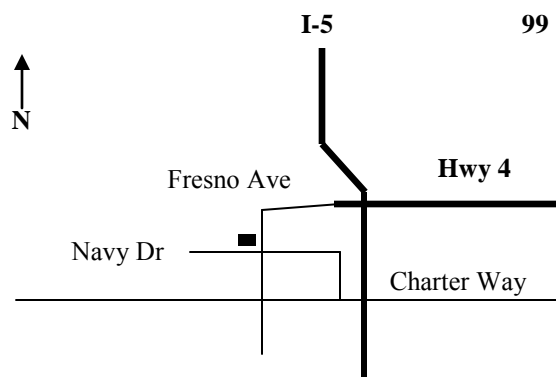
