**DELEGATE'S REPORT – LELA M.
ACM December 16, 2013**

From Phyllis H, General Manager at GSO with 2 items:

1) The digital 4th Edition of Alcoholics Anonymous is expected to be on iTunes by the end of December. Barnes & Noble and Amazon have the digital publishing program in English. Other publications will follow accordingly. Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions will be available from all three (Apple, Barnes & Noble and Amazon) shortly. Over the next few months, our entire catalog of A.W.W.S. titles will be offered as e-Books through the major third-party vendors in the 3 languages of our General Service Conference.

2) iOS6 A.A. reader app: our app for e-Books (the Big Book and the Twelve and Twelve for certain apple reading devices) will continue to be available to the Fellowship until further notice. The A.A.W.S. Board met last week and made a decision to discontinue all further sales of our proprietary app, effective immediately. We will continue to support the app for current customers for a period of time – the end date yet to be determined. Look for future announcements on GSO's website: www.aa.org.

Personal experience of Phyllis H:

At a recent Regional Forum, a young man from Somalia now living in Minneapolis, came to the microphone with broken English and needed literature in his language in order to carry the message to others. We currently have 70 languages (18 new translation pending), nothing in Somali. Our Publishing Department is now working on the project! Your contributions support the Regional Forums and we were able to receive a face-to-face conversation about needing literature. Your contributions continue to help cover the costs to translate A.A. literature for others. Thank you!

CNCA member request: A 12 and 12 history play was done in San Francisco supported by the local Central/Intergroup Office and they are thinking of doing in Sacramento (CCF has been contacted). CNIA Officers chose not to formally support this activity as it was not coming through the General Service Conference and keeping in mind the Traditions of self support, affiliation and anonymity.

Box 459 Highlights: Pacific Regional Forum is scheduled for July 11-13 in Boise, ID. Adrienne B is retiring from GSO. Write up about our 1st Edition of Alcoholics Anonymous Commemorative reprinting. 2015 AA International Convention in Atlanta, Georgia – “80 Years, Happy Joyous Free”

Rod B (Pacific Region Trustee) Report: Gratitude for hospitality given by Area's at Assemblies! Watching the 3 Legacies in action and going to the hat – the trust and unity on filling general service positions to carry the message to the still suffering alcoholic.

AAWS: Considering an electronic voting system to be utilized on all nonelection votes at the General Service Conference. AAWS Board approved the redesign of www.aa.org as presented and agreed to move toward a launch in January 2014.

AA Grapevine, Inc: GV is in the black! LaVina net loss is larger than the budgeted loss. The Spanish weekly quote was launched. They reviewed the Grapevine 70th Anniversary efforts and discussed adding AAGV questions to the next membership survey. 2 CNIA members had recent stories – 1 in Grapevine and 1 in LaVina!

Trustees' Committee on General Service Conference: Agreed to forward a request to consider granting the approval to use the “circle and triangle” with recovery, unity and service as an official service mark on AA literature where the Publishing Department determines appropriate. The committee asked that the chair of the 2014 Conference Policy & Admissions Committee attend the February meeting to observe discussion of Agenda Items that could be forwarded to the GSC.

Trustees' Committee on CPC/Treatment/Special Needs-Accessibilities: 2 pamphlets are to be forwarded to the 2014 GSC with suggested changes in “If you are a Professional ...” and “AA as a resource for the Health Care Professional”.

Trustees' Committee on Corrections: Strategically looking at how AA is currently carrying the message to

incarcerated alcoholics; available resources are being reviewed and engaging more members in Correctional service.

Trustees' Committee on Literature:

Reviewed a new draft of spirituality pamphlet and requested minor changes; final draft to be brought to the February 2014 GSB.

Received 13 suggestions and additional changes on Questions and Answers on Sponsorship and requested the subcommittee to review and bring report to February 2014 GSB.

Agreed to forward to the 2014 GSC Conference Committee on Literature a change to the 1st paragraph on Concept XII in the pamphlet "Twelve Concepts for World Service Illustrated" to read: "like the Twelve Steps and the Twelve Traditions - be changed only by written consent of three-quarters of all responding groups in the world!"

Reviewed a suggestion to consider developing and publishing an early history book, tentatively titled, "AA's Early Adolescence: Rapid Growth and Threats to Unity" and took no action. They agreed current history books are sufficient; costly; problems related to historical information and importance of local archives.

Forwarded a suggestion to 2014 GSC to remove the following text from page 5 in "Living Sober": 'Many of us have come to believe that our alcoholism is an addiction to the drug alcohol; like addicts of any sort who want to maintain recovery, we have to keep away from the first dose of the drug we have become addicted to.' The committee agreed the text added confusion regarding AA's Singleness of Purpose.

Considered Revising video "Your General Service Office, the Grapevine & the General Service Structure" took no action – years of low sales, proposed production costs and not prudent to remake the video.

Considered Adding table of contents to the pamphlet - "Frequently Asked Questions about AA" took no action – it is adequate as currently published and is short in length not requiring table of contents.

Closed with reading from Alcoholics Anonymous, Chapter 2 ... There is a solution...

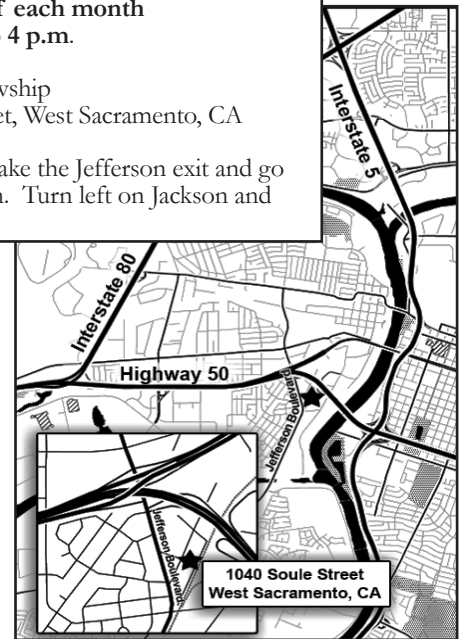

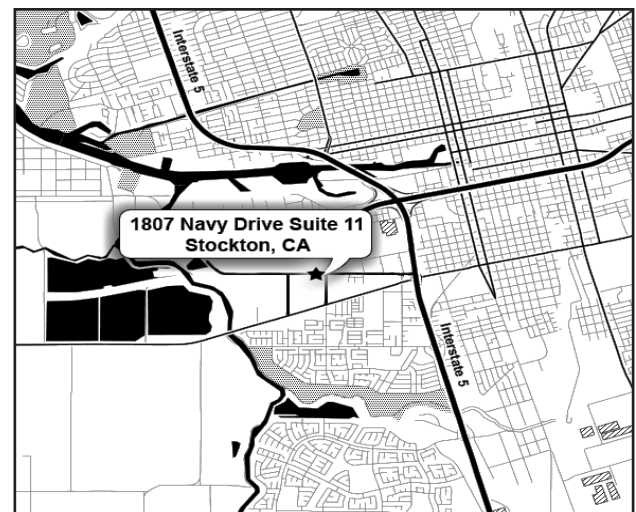
