**The Beginnings?**

The first PRAASA was in 1968 in Fresno, California, for the Pacific Region Delegates. It was initially designed to discuss and prepare for questions asked at the General Service Conference in New York. The new, current and past Delegates learned from each other. Initially, Areas only supported their Delegates to attend; however, in 1986 discussion began for Area 07 Officers to attend. Sacramento hosted PRAASA in March of 1987 and it was the first time Roundtables were held. Our Area Officers attended, paying their own way, and other AA members became interested in attending. On December 12, 1987, Area 07 voted to support all Area Officers' attendance. Since then, the Area has tried to send as many Officers to PRAASA as we can afford – this, of course, depended on the location! Attendance began with a small number and has increased to more than 1800 attendees. Since PRAASA began in our Area, other Regions have adopted similar assemblies to carry the message between the members, groups, Areas and the General Service Board. In the spirit of cooperation, Al-Anon is invited to attend, is self-supporting, and they develop their own agenda for the weekend. **PRAASA's Purpose Now?**

The purpose of PRAASA is to develop greater unity among the members, groups and areas of the Pacific Region; to encourage the exchange of ideas and experiences; and to provide an opportunity for members to discuss pertinent aspects of AA. The Pacific Region Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly and its Committee should always foster the Recovery, Unity and Service legacies of AA.

**My Experience?**

The very first PRAASA I attended was in Spokane, Washington, in 2001. There were Delegates, Officers, DCMs, Alt-DCMs, GSRs, Alt-GSRs and members-at-large in attendance! Some were paying their own way just to learn more about AA. I was amazed and learned so much more about Alcoholics Anonymous than I ever had at regular meetings! It was exciting and a spiritual awakening of its own kind! So much information shared such as:

- ◆ Understanding the purpose for specific expenses
- ◆ What it takes for a pamphlet to be put together
- ◆ Why we have trustees and their function
- ◆ More languages in which the book Alcoholics Anonymous (Big Book) is printed
- ◆ AA meetings beginning in another country for the first time
- ◆ Learning how motions are made, discussed and voted
- ◆ Understanding what unanimity means

Then listening to comments, questions and concerns at the mic:

- ◆ Someone attending their first time at PRAASA whose group passed the basket to pay for all the expenses so they could attend
- ◆ Questions being asked and getting answers
- ◆ Changing 'contempt prior to investigation' to understanding
- ◆ A young person sharing a phrase for a pamphlet
- ◆ Tears from long sobriety members saying they thought this was all politics and discovering it isn't at all
- ◆ Hearing "I had no idea this was more of AA!"
- ◆ Respectfully listening to other thoughts and suggestions
- ◆ It's 'data overload' and so helpful to know the real information
- ◆ Meeting members from other states
- ◆ Handling controversial issues with patience and respect for all points of view

I love to attend PRAASAs! Each time I learn more; I love how AA works; I appreciate what others offer; and, I have intense gratitude for the spirit of the fellowship! There were 100 men who put the 'Big Book' together and now we have thousands working to keep AA alive for others – it's an AMAZING RIDE! I look forward to attending more PRAASAs, and, our California Northern Interior Area (CNIA) hosting the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of PRAASA in 2017! WOW!

Lela received a memo from Phyllis, GSO Manager, that the 2013 AA Directories will not be published for cost saving purposes. There is better communication via electronic meeting schedules that are more up-to-date for members to find a meeting. Phyllis thanked members for sending in their meeting updates and asked groups to continue to do so for the GSO Registrar.

Agenda Item B more information – GSB recommends there be a thorough re-evaluation of LaVina and to continue the production and support of LaVina. An ad hoc committee has been formed with Rod B, Trustee, as chair. There are 3 ideas that have been formed:

1. Have Spanish and English edition of

same magazine (same stories and information)

2. LaVina retain its own editorial design of black and white for 6 times a year with 32 or 48 pages

3. The magazine to be produced by Spanish speaking members in US and Canada very similar to the model we have with La Vine. The spiritual ownership would rest with the fellowship and there would be help from New York to move to that model.

Presenting PRAASA 2017 Bid – I've been working with Jan P, Tom A, Toni S, D22, and Chase from Oregon. The bid will be refined with the Convention Center. A presentation will be made at the Pacific Region Delegate luncheon even with the new rotation; we need to demonstrate good faith.

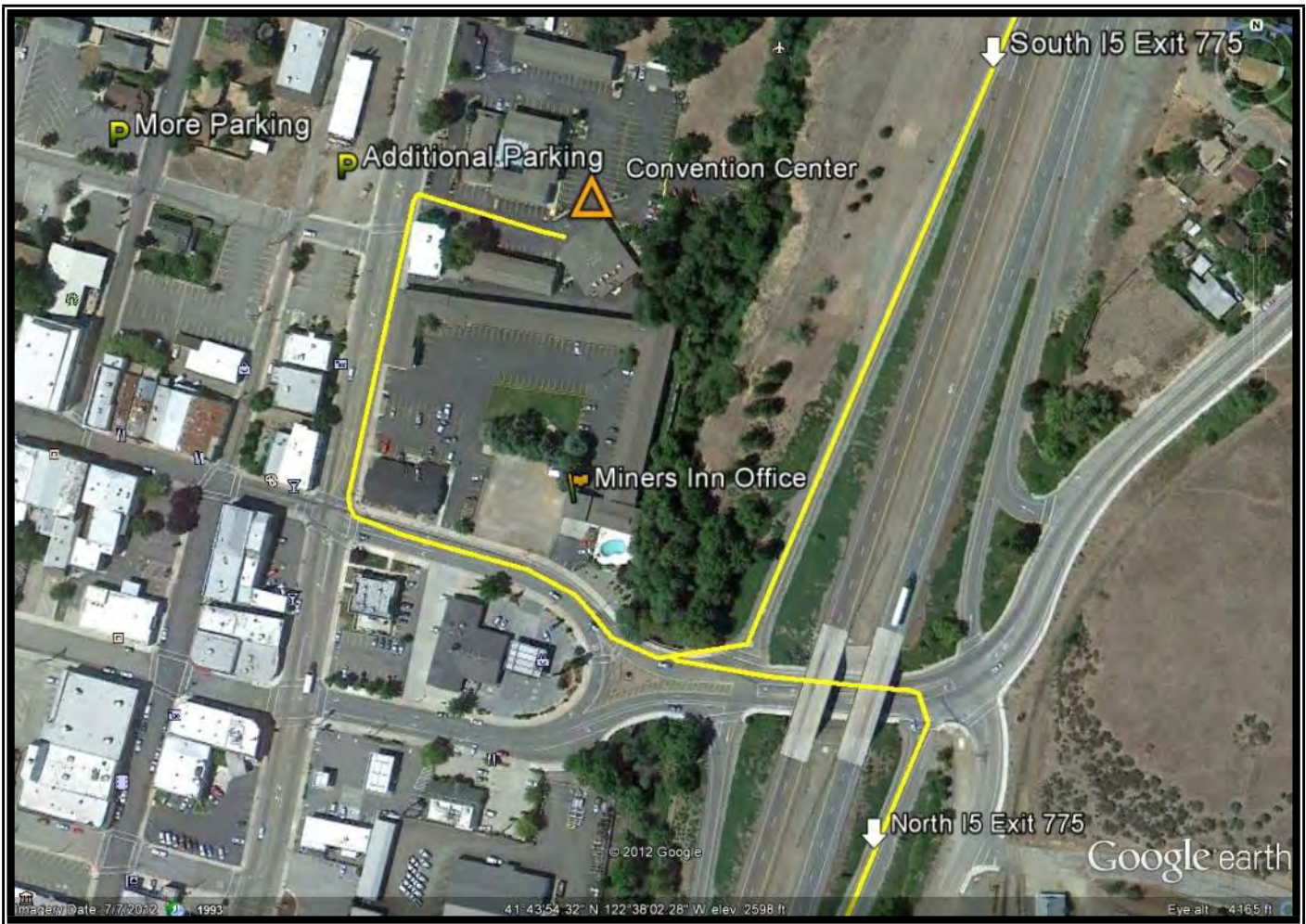

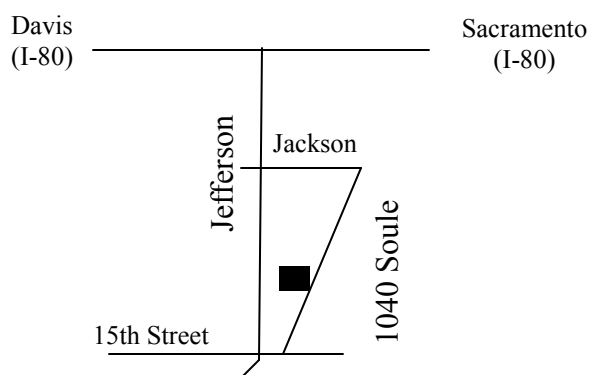

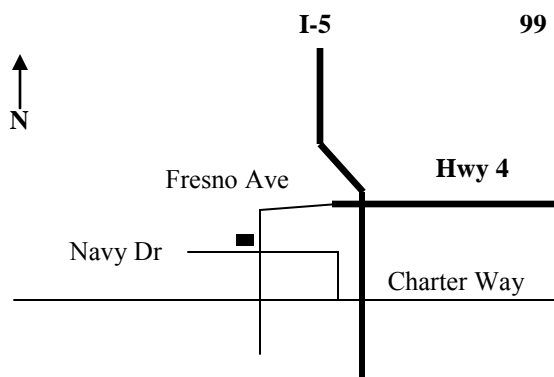
