CHAIR'S REPORT

I think that many oldsters who have put our AA "booze cure" to severe but successful tests still find they often lack emotional sobriety. Perhaps they will be the spearhead for the next major development in AA – the development of much more real maturity and balance (which is to say, humility) in our relations with ourselves, with our fellows, and with God.

Those adolescent urges that so many of us have for top approval, perfect security, and perfect romance – urges quite appropriate to age seventeen – prove to be an impossible way of life when we are at age forty-seven or fifty seven...

Thus I think it can work out with emotional sobriety. If we examine every disturbance we have, great or small, we will find at the root of it some unhealthy dependency and its consequent unhealthy demand. Let us, with God's help, continually surrender these hobbling demands. Then we can be set free to live and love; we may then be able to Twelfth Step ourselves and others into emotional sobriety.

The above was taken from Bill Wilson's essay on Emotional Sobriety – The next Frontier. I thought it was perfect for this month's Accents because we as an Area have been examining "every disturbance, great or small".

At our Officer's Meeting on August 15th, we discussed some very important issues. It was brought to our attention that the CNIA taxes were not filed with the federal

government and the State of California in 2010, 2011, and 2012. Also our accounting program is not "user friendly". It does not meet general accounting practice principles. There were thank-you letters and other financial tasks that had not been completed due to faulty programming.

So... I have to tell you. The other Area Officers and I had the most amazing conversation. Instead of blaming and finger pointing, we went right into solutions.

In the morning, before our last ACM, I attended an Area Inventory Committee Meeting. We discussed the format of the inventory and some of the possible questions. The questions will be published in the October Accents.

The ACM started at 10:00 am on Saturday, August 18th. After the morning reports, we went directly into new business. Tom A, Finance Chair, recommended the following: **Based on immediate need, and as per the CNIA Service material, the Finance Committee makes a recommendation to allow the Finance Committee to spend up to \$2,500 to: 1. To bring the current finance accounts up-to-date to accurately reflect generally accepted accounting principles; and, 2. To review and file our outstanding tax returns. This recommendation needs to be approved by 2/3 vote of those in attendance today at this ACM to allow us to act on this immediate need.**

The recommendation of the Finance Committee to seek professional tax help and spend monies to get our tax situation with the IRS and State of California resolved was unanimously approved. The thank-you letters were sent out on Saturday. Thank you to the E-services committee and the other volunteers for generating those letters.

Next, it was time for the topic discussions. The first item was the possibility of the Area paying an old debt acquired by a "dark" district. We still have not received an actual invoice for this debt. We will continue discussion in September. The next topic was the possibility of having a YPAA appointed chairperson in the Area. Regina K. was there to highlight some of the responsibilities and duties of the position. There was some excellent participation in this discussion. And I look forward to more conversation in September. The last topic was the anonymous and non-anonymous versions of the Accents. It sounds like the body would like the Accents completely anonymous with exception to the last page. More will be revealed.

Also I want to remind you about the NCCAA Fall Conference to be held in Sacramento!!! It is scheduled for October 5th, 6th, and 7th. It is going to be super fun and informative. Please let me know if you plan on going. I am looking for victims...uh, I mean volunteers.

We still have a lot of work to do. But I am encouraged by the love and the support that we give each other in General Service. After Saturday's meeting, I am convinced that there is nothing that our God and our fellowship cannot accomplish. Thank you for allowing me to serve with such an amazing area.

SHHH—Don't Tell! Grapevine Chair Report Connie G

Almost everybody knows about Grapevine and La Viña, whether they subscribe or not. The average monthly circulation of the Grapevine is 85,000 but it has about 225,000 readers monthly. La Viña averages 9,000 monthly subscribers and is read by 15,000 monthly. Grapevine, Inc., is supported totally by Grapevine subscriptions and book sales. It cannot, by conscience of the General Service Conference, accept contributions from members. La Viña is supported by the General Service Board as a service to our Hispanic community and is not yet self-supporting.

So the best kept secret - AA Grapevine, Inc. books! The most frequent comment that I hear when standing behind a table of AA Grapevine books is, "I've never seen these before." We hide them on the shelf at Central California Fellowship (CCF Central Office) in Sacramento and, no doubt, other intergroup offices as well. Somehow, we never get them to the literature table at our home groups, or discuss them at meetings or assign sponsees to read them. The books are comprised of articles written for the Grapevine since 1944, when it was founded. "The Language of the Heart" tells us in the introduction, "From the first issue of the eight-page newsletter, Bill W. was a prolific contributor, an enthusiastic advocate, and for many years a consulting editor."

The two books many are familiar with are "The Language of the Heart" and the "The Best of Bill". "The Language of the Heart" contains the writings of Bill W. which appeared in the Grapevine between 1944 and 1970. Personally, I use this book in addition to the "Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions" when studying the Traditions with sponsees. Did you know that the articles on the Traditions in the "12 x 12" were first printed in the Grapevine and are still copyrighted to the Grapevine? "Language of the Heart" and "The Best of Bill" both contain a letter that Bill wrote to a friend which was printed as an article entitled, "The Next Frontier: Emotional Sobriety." For me this article is worth reading several times a year. It was published when Bill was about 24 years sober and talks about how our emotional dependencies can trip us up.

But what about the other books? The newest ones are "Into Action" (just released), "Young and Sober" and "Step by Step". I am currently reading Step by Step (as an ebook). The first article was written in 1944 and sounds like it could have been written by someone in my home group, calling the admission of unmanageability and powerlessness the "first success on the road to well-being." In another article I highlighted the line where her sponsor tells her "...I had a choice: to live life reacting to everything with childish emotions, or to try working the remaining eleven Steps." All of the new books are being issued in

print and as ebooks that you can download to your device.

You can support the Grapevine by subscribing and gifting subscriptions (\$28.97 per year or less than one gourmet coffee drink per month); buying, reading and sharing AA Grapevine Inc. books; making sure your home group has some Grapevine books for sale; and by contributing an article. Grapevine wants not only your paragraphs, but your photographs. Send a photo of your meeting place for "If Walls Could Talk" section of the Grapevine. Or submit a photo for the 2014 calendar by December 1, 2012. The 2013 trilingual (English, French and Spanish) calendar (available right now) has beautiful photos submitted by members. The Grapevine Magazine, La Viña and the AA Grapevine books share our stories of struggle and recovery. They describe our spiritual journeys and our quest for emotional sobriety. Their purpose? "Like the Alcoholics Anonymous movement it is to mirror, there will be but one central purpose: The Grapevine will try to carry the A.A message to alcoholics and practice the A.A principles in all its affairs." New Business

Tom A, Finance Chair, recommended the following:

Based on immediate need, and as per the CNIA Service material, the Finance Committee makes a recommendation to allow the Finance Committee to spend up to \$2,500 to:

1. To bring the current finance accounts up to date to accurately reflect generally accepted accounting principles; and,
2. To review and file our outstanding tax returns.

This recommendation needs to be approved by 2/3 vote of those in attendance today at this ACM to allow us to act on this immediate need.

COMMENTS: *It is custom to have cost budgeted; however, a motion was made, in the past, and passed in an instance where we need to make an unbudgeted expenditure. Service Materials says we need to vote – we need to follow what the guidelines are that do exist and the Finance Committee*

has authority to request expenditures that must be approved by the ACM and cannot exceed 5% of the approved budget for the year.

Question: Expense could be over or under \$2500? *Ans:* Yes

Question: How many years tax returns to be filed? *Ans:* Tax year 2011 ended this past June – yet to be filed; Tax year 2010 has been filed; Tax year 2009 is uncertain if it has been filed.

Question: Do we owe taxes? *Ans:* Perhaps. Penalties for late filing are negotiable.

Response: We do not owe taxes – it is filing an amended return; we received notices from IRS and State of non-filing of past returns and we are working with both agencies as to what was and what is. We need a tax professional to do this work for us to be sure it is correct and fixed. Professionals will advise us as to what we need to do and we will keep the officer and Area informed. We need to do this as we receive contributions and need to keep ourselves non-profit with IRS and State of California, just as our Trustees do for US and Canada.

The recommendation of the Finance Committee to seek professional tax help and spend monies to get our tax situation with the IRS and State of California resolved was unanimously approved.

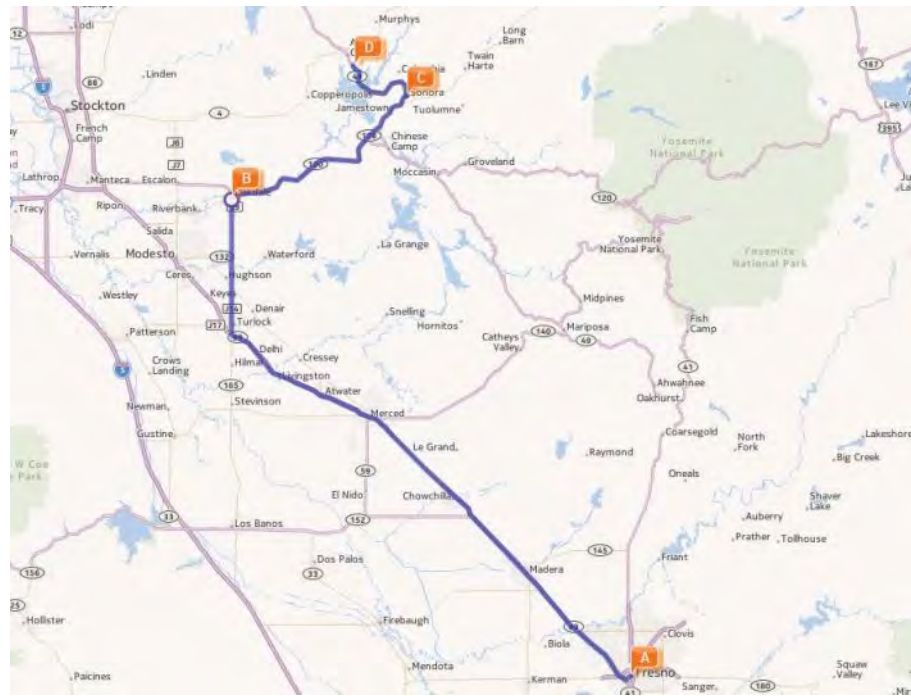

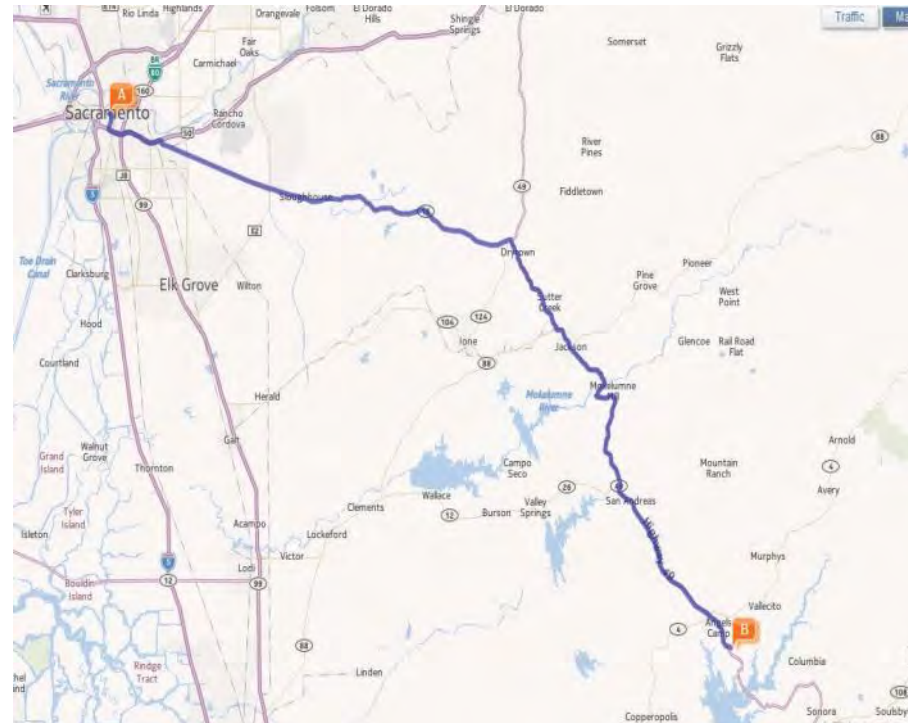

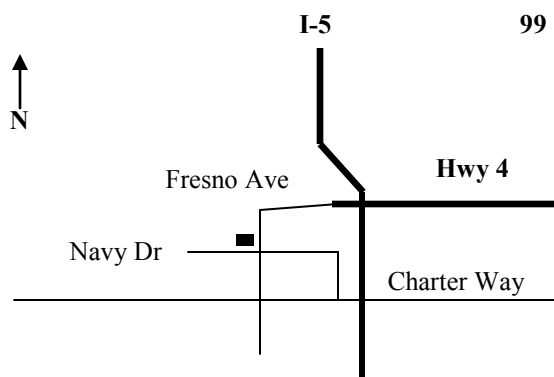
