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Chair's Report September 2018

CNIA 07 AREA COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED)

JULY 21, 2018 · WEST SACRAMENTO, CA

North Valley Intergroup, Martha: Our Unity Day was held on 6/3 and Lake Almanor campout held last month with 185 members in attendance. Our two intergroups are merging beginning in January 2019. Only took 5 ad hoc committee meetings. Will lead to less duplication of services, combining finances, and the possibility of starting a much-needed central office

Fresno Intergroup, read report: Things are not slowing down. Last weekend we had two events that provided proceeds to the Central Office. Our speaker meeting, hosted by ODAAT group, was standing room only. Next was our annual ice cream social, hosted by the Village group and the All Welcome speaker meeting. At the Intergroup Council meeting, there was a discussion concerning our calendar and how best to avoid scheduling conflicts in our area.

N. CA Council of AA (NCCAA), Mona: Hope you are excited about the Fresno conference. Time remaining to pre-register, either today or on norcalaa.org or mail in a check. You can always sponsor someone. 10/5–10/7 in Fresno. Now in 71st year, support from H and I and General Service is very important. Always looking for volunteers. Need to have a minimum # rooms booked to keep costs down.

SACYPAA: Speaker meeting this month is a river float. In addition, we host a service event, Servicepalooza, 9/22, St Marks Church, 6 pm.

N. CA Accessibilities Committee (NCAC), Jon: We last met on 8/11. Made a presentation to D25 and will present to D23 on our plan

to provide ASL interpretation for deaf alcoholics. Have filed for non-profit status, waiting for response. Considered coming up with a flyer about how to contribute, but decided it would be better as talking points.

Announcements

La Viña Anniversary Regional Event, Lee: District 53 did win the bid to host the La Viña 23rd anniversary celebration next year, late summer. Victor is the chair. We are requesting the support of the Area. We invite groups, districts, and committees to support our efforts. We need volunteers.

District Reports

D11, Stacey: Been difficult in our district because of the Carr fire. Members have been evacuated, lost their homes, etc. Alano Club opened and had 24-hour marathon meetings for about a week. 8 people at August district meeting. Bridging the Gap (BTG) co-chairs busy getting connected to community. PI/CPC liaison is going to joint committee communication meeting tomorrow. DCM has been added to bank account. REDYPAA is active. Women of Red Bluff AA event 9/13–16.

D15, Colleen: GSRs are reporting that attendance and contributions have been consistent. New PI/CPC chair collaborating with web committee to put a PI/CPC tab on our website. District is going to participate in a local probation dept. training. Online schedule does not indicate wheelchair-accessible meetings, working on fixing that. Other district officers will attend Pacific Regional Forum.

D17, Barb: Haven't had our meeting yet this month. Will be discussing need to prepare for Post-Conference Assembly. The facility is willing to work with us on date change.

D19, Brad: All officers and 7 GSRs in attendance at last meeting. Moving forward with purchase of PA system. Doing well financially. Unity Day, 9/23 at Hammond Grove park, Matt L is main speaker. PI/CPC committee participating in Veterans Stand Down and we're having our Delegate report 9/22. Planning activities around 12 Concepts, with a workshop in February and discussion sessions after district meetings.

D20, read report: All is well. Busy finalizing Unity Day celebrations for 9/29 at St Canice Hall, Nevada City. There will be a talent show, round table topic/discussions, and great food. Several people attending Regional Forum and looking forward to meeting representatives of GSO and learning more about AA.

D21, Julie: July meeting well attended. First sub-committee formed to do outreach to groups. PI/CPC committee continuing presentations, looking for ways to target professional community. BTG has 2 men and 2 women that are presenting to treatment centers each month and to Roseville jail this month.

D22, David: Mini PRAASA coming up soon. Can register online at westernsloped22.org. 14 people at last meeting. Mike is coming on 9/12 to give his report. Treasurer will now have the bank statement for review at each meeting. Joint committee meeting

held this past month with 13 in attendance.

D23, not present

D24, Claudio: 7 people present at last meeting. Good presentation on Traditions. Group One has had some safety issues and is working to address them and update the bylaws. Tahoe Park having trouble finding secretaries. Other groups doing well overall. Oak Park annual picnic on 9/15 at East Portal Park, 10 am–5 pm. We had a good discussion about making contributions to all the service entities.

D25, David: Fairly quiet this month. We had a visit from NCAC, who discussed what is going on and the need for donations. Possibly putting on a 12 Concepts panel.

D27, Jeff: Last meeting had around 20 people. Jon C visited our group and talked us into giving him money. I'm going to Regional Forum and the Joint Committee Communication meeting on 8/19.

D29, Diana: Have been making it to a dark meeting once a month. Went to a group on the unknown list and brought up GSR and General Service ideas. Not much feedback. But we did get a new GSR and alternate from a N Sac meeting. We have funds in a separate account for a Unity Day. We donated \$500 to NCAC after Jon's visit.

D30, read report: We have a replacement for our district treasurer, Susan R. New meeting directories were distributed. Archives history day was a success. In process of compiling group histories and individual histories of older members. Upcoming activities: Gold Country Roundup, 9/22, 11am–8pm, 24 Church Rd, San Andreas. Unity Day, 10/13, 12:30–7pm, 1385 Britchen Rd,

Copperopolis. Secretaries workshop, 10/20, 2–4pm, 10 Water St, Jackson.

D33, Jason: Last district meeting had 12 in attendance. The treasurer of our biggest fellowship, Motherlode group, embezzled all their money, around \$9,000. Looking for other people's experience. Minority opinion was heard and how wonderful that was. Group conscience was not fully resolved, but they decided not to have him arrested at that time. PI/CPC chair and I attending sharing session tomorrow.

D34, read report: We continue to do well financially. We are sponsoring hotel rooms for several GSR's to the Pacific Regional Forum. We also sponsor rooms for assemblies. We are in the planning stages of a Concepts workshop, tentatively scheduled for January. We are also planning a Traditions workshop and an All Services Panel workshop.

D36, Eran: Good things happening. Secretaries workshops, new members. We're reaching out to meetings that don't participate. Last panel, there was always an argument about finances. Has not happened this panel. I'm funded to attend the Regional Forum and our committee chairs are attending the joint service workshop.

D37, read report: Things are going good. At last district meeting, 12 district trusted servants and GSRs in attendance, as well as some visitors. NCCAA crew gave a presentation on purpose, structure, and history of NCCAA. Presentation was very well done. July net balance of \$1,647.47. Outreach is an ongoing effort. We have a policy to assist GSRs whose groups have difficulty financially supporting them to attend Area Assemblies.

D41, read report: 5 present at last meeting. We continue planning for our 3rd SOBERAMA Picnic. Having a chili cook-off, karaoke D.J., and games. All are welcome to drive down and bring your family. Intergroup: Intergroup is running fine, but there are some problems with the Central Office. Advice is welcome.

D42, Mike: Things going good. We made \$950. Disbursements are being made, including to the Area. We are going to San Jose. Financially doing good, fellowships doing good. Two fellowships have new construction and new flooring. Kudos to D40, they have a list of AA meetings at the front desk of the mental health office.

D43, Louie: Several visitors to district meeting, including someone who is considering becoming a GSR. Recording secretary has resigned. Linda M volunteered to be alternate until someone steps in. Unity Day 11/10, with the theme of Unity and Service. LOLT annual picnic 9/22 at Roeding park. Want to invite the Spanish-speaking districts and all near-by districts to our Unity Day.

D47, read report: We had our Delegate's presentation on 8/4, with a great turnout and presentation. Thanks to Mike, and to all the Area officers.

D49, no report

D53, Audencio: We keep working visiting the groups every Thursday to motivate them. The district thanks all of you for your support for the 23rd anniversary of La Viña next year. Committee has formed and is working already. 4 of us went to the archives on 8/4. We continue to support the 17th Foro.

D54, Epimegnio: Last Thursday we had 15 in attendance and studied Concept 6. We are having the 17th Foro assembly in Thornton. D54

23rd anniversary is 11/10. We'll see you at the Regional Forum.

Appointed Chair Reports

Accents, Kendyce: Newsletter went out a bit late because of issues with translations and getting stuff in on time. Thank you to Victor for pulling it together this month. Participated in eServices conference call. I'm going to start looking at other area and intergroup newsletters to see what they're doing. Stats: Acentos: 60 subscribe, 19 opened the email, 7 clicked on PDF, 30 sent by postal mail. Accents: 1110 recipients, 457 opened the email, 81 clicked on PDF, and 95 sent by postal mail.

BTG, read report: Received 5 contact requests this month, 2 were letters received at the Central Office and 1 though the Google voice phone number set up last panel. 1 contact made so far. The BTG page being developed by eServices looks great. Have started to make the BTG Service Manual more useful in Spanish. Save the date: annual Area BTG workshop 10/13, 2-5 pm at Porter group in Stockton.

eServices, Eran: 5 ongoing projects. Landing page for PI/CPC - work in progress. Contact form for BTG. Accents and html for easy reading on smart phone. Backing up archives on cloud service. Update, redesign district page. We would like information from the central offices and intergroups so we can get you listed.

Finance Committee, Julie: We have discussed spending plan and have recommended to bring it to the Area. It has been a breeze.

Grapevine, Gina: Don't forget about the GV challenge. 9/4, putting out a call to hear from

people about how the magazines are doing and how they can change and grow. Thank you to past GV chair, Judy B, for helping me out. Still have plenty of open time on my calendar.

Literature and Oral Translation: no reports

Delegate's Report, Mike: Pacific Regional Forum had over 200 registrations in the first week. Newton P, US Trustee-at-Large, will be there with interactive data map. Special writing workshop for Spanish-speaking women's pamphlet. Only one story submitted so far and none for pamphlet on Three Legacies. Submitted two resumes for Class A Trustee. NCCAA in Fresno, 10/5-10/7. Please support them. \$7.40 contributions— income about the same as last year. I encourage distributions to all service entities. New Traditions checklist, dated January 2018. Mike discussed Tradition 9 and Concept 9 and the checklists. AAWS- YouTube channel has more than 1,300 subscriptions, which moves us up the Google search results. GSO has an announcement for a staff member position, one of the 13 service desks. Grapevine— as of 6/4, La Viña SMS digital community has over 1,500 members. New GV book on atheist and agnostic member stories will be released next month. CPC— next issue of About AA will address rise of alcohol abuse among seniors. Corrections— 76 men on waiting list for corrections correspondence. Board agreed that direct contact with corrections professionals regarding BTG and corrections should come from local committees. Developing new material for corrections service and workbooks. Finance— through June, contributions ahead of budgeted and ahead of 1st 6 months of 2017. Literature—

\$100k less than budgeted, and less than 2017. Expense— expenses are up. 8 staff positions filled, after they went vacant last year, now FT permanent. ASL project and settlement from manuscript lawsuit. And General Service Conference (GSC) in NY, A/V expenses more than anticipated. Literature— New book on Bill's Conference talks will be out early 2019. Pamphlets: God Word, LGBTQ, Mental Health all out by end of Aug. AA for Woman, Inside AA, GSR are out. Understanding Anonymity, not out yet. Translation projects: Brazil, Bali, Czech Republic, Morocco, Poland, Ukraine. Big Book translations— Bulgarian and Quechua are being worked on. 12 and 12 in 44 languages, Big Book in 71. GSO has opening for non-trustee appointed committee member to serve on literature committee, requesting experienced bilingual to carry the message to Spanish-speaking women alcoholics. PI— doing review of our methodology for the membership survey, consultant hired at a cost not to exceed \$8,000. Young People's video has been added to aa.org. Google ad words and grants— looking into costs of trial. GSC date change— now May 19-25, 2019. "Are we Inclusive?" was Clement's topic at board weekend. He reported that in terms of racial diversity, GSO staff is the most racially diverse in the history of GSO. However, we still have big problems. Class A trustee, African American, heard attendees say "the Conference was okay until that black trustee spoke." Does AA population represent the population of the US and Canada? Kathi, Pacific Regional Trustee's report: Even though our doors are wide open, we have to ask ourselves who are not here and why. How would they like to be approached? I was the only Asian at the GSC, there were only 2 black

women and 3 black men. It was largely old and white.

New Business

A. Pre and Post Conference Assembly 2019 dates

Discussion of rescheduling the Pre and Post Conference Assemblies because of the date change of the 2019 General Service Conference. Current dates are April 13 and 14 for the Pre-Conference and May 18 and 19 for the Post Conference. The GSC is now scheduled for to start May 19. It is impossible for Mike to tell us on May 18 what happened at the GSC, even if he were in California.

Area Alternate Chair, Matthew, reported that we are unable to move time and date of Pre-Conference and keep the same venue. For the Post Conference, the 3rd weekend in June is available, although this is Father's Day weekend. 2nd weekend is NCCAA Conference. That leaves the 1st weekend in June. Or, if we have the assembly on the 3rd weekend, we could potentially have a one-day assembly.

We briefly discussed having the Pre-Conference later so we would have more time to get group consciences on the agenda items. The sense of the room was to keep the date the same.

Discussing the potential dates of the Post Conference, it was summarized that if we have it the 1st weekend in June there is no time for Mike to prepare; the 2nd weekend is the NCCAA Conference; and the 3rd weekend (15th and 16th), Father's Day is on Sunday. The host district reported that the 4th weekend (22nd and 23rd) is also available at the venue. Those in favor of a one-day assembly stated that the purpose of

assembly is to hear Mike's report, and we could try doing it in one day, as Coastal does. It was also said that the point of the assembly is for GSRs to learn and experience General Service. We took a sense of the room with 3 options: one-day assembly on the 15th, 14 people in favor; two-day assembly on the 15th and 16th, none in favor; and two days on the 22nd and 23rd, 14 in favor.

On the potential of having a one-day assembly, it was said that it is hard to travel for one day and that many people would probably have to stay overnight anyway; Father's Day events might be happening Saturday also; to have a one-day assembly should be a more deliberate, thoughtful decision; and that all the extra stuff at an assembly is valuable. Mike K said he would make any weekend work, but that his personal preference was for the 22nd and 23rd.

A motion was made that we move the 2019 Post Conference Assembly to June 22 and 23. It was seconded and there was no further discussion. One person was opposed. The minority opinion was that we didn't care what day it was when we were in the bar and that the 4th Saturday is my district meeting. No one changed their vote. The date for the 2019 Post Conference Assembly was set as June 22 and 23.

The question was asked if we want to not hold an ACM in May, or have it some Saturday we're not normally here? We agreed to think about it.

B. 2019 Spending Plan

Area Treasurer, Herminia N, presented the proposed 2019 spending plan, which she defined as a general idea of our yearly contribution and expenses. After presenting each line item, she stated that we have \$9,236.66 in the prudent reserve and have not

touched it over the last few years. We will continue discussing the spending plan in September.

Motion passed unanimously.

Officer Reports

Registrar, Margie: August has been pretty smooth. Continuing to process group forms. Will be gathering district addresses and putting them on the website so people know where to send contributions. 244 unknown groups in the area – that means a group that the GSO doesn't know if they meet or not and don't have a contact person. I'm willing to share ideas on what you can do.

Secretary, Celia: Have not been up to a whole lot. Attending Foro planning meeting tomorrow. Was on officers' conference call on Monday. Although it is not part of my service position, I went to the CNIA archives this month for the first time. It was awesome and I hope you can all visit. Removed the staples from old issues of the Grapevine and bound them with cord, saw an old copy of a publication called Folsomite, put out by the inmates at Folsom prison. It is like a combination of the Accents and the Grapevine, and a beautiful example of carrying the message.

Treasurer, Herminia: All bills have been paid. I continue to work on your contributions and the spending plan. Looking forward to attending Pacific Regional Forum. Thank you for your contributions and for letting me be of service.

Alt-Chair, Matthew: Forming a committee of DCMs to put together inventory questions for the Mini-PRAASA. Should be published in Accents next month and again in October. Review them with your districts. Working with D21 BTG committee, tomorrow they are making first presentation inside the jail.




We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.
