The Area Committee Meeting of California Northern Interior Area (CNIA) was held at the East Yolo Fellowship, West Sacramento, CA from 10 am-3:16pm on September 15, 2018. Area Chair, Jenn D, called the meeting to order at 10 am followed by the Serenity Prayer. The 12 Traditions were read by Jason, the 12 Concepts were read in Spanish by Epigmenio, the GSR Preamble was read by Sparkles, and “Why Do We need a Conference” was read in Spanish by Rogelio.

Past Delegate Introductions: Jenn introduced Past Delegates Lee W, Panel 58, and Marianne H, Panel 56.

Assembly reports

Post-Conference 2019, Barb: Have confirmed California Ag Museum and secured dates of June 22 and 23. At the next meeting, we hope to elect two people to fill chair positions.

17th Foro, Celia: Attended Foro meeting last month. Coming together, groups sending in contributions. No registration fee,

good lunch. 3 speakers, including Mike K and Vikki R, and roundtables. 12/2 in Lindsay.

Pacific Regional Forum (PRF), Herminia: Was this past weekend in San Jose. 900 registrations and over 600 first-time attendees. Lots of Hispanics who did attend. I go to **Chowchilla women's prison**. Ran into a woman in the restroom who remembered me from the prison. She had gotten out after 17 years and was attending the Forum for the first time.

### **Hispanic Women's Workshop**

(HWW), Julie: We met for another planning meeting with around 24 in attendance. Brainstormed topics. Each liaison pulled a topic out of the basket. Discussed proposed budget. Were questions about how much money should be spent on food.

Approval of Minutes: August 2018 ACM minutes approved as distributed.

### Liaison reports

Central CA Fellowship (CCFAA), Kim: [aasacramento.org](http://aasacramento.org) is our website. Great picnic in August, **good fundraiser**. **Oldtimers' event 10/6**. **Donations are good so we're doing well financially**. Soon opening Sat afternoon.

North Valley Intergroup, Martha: 17 in attendance at last meeting. Merger going well. Next event is our speaker meeting 11/17. Planning our **New Year's Eve speaker meeting and game night**.

Fresno IG, read report from Keith: Better than expected turnout at last meeting. Finances are looking better. Group contributions are down somewhat, but revenue from special events and lowering of expenses wherever possible has helped significantly. Expect to have a 2019 budget ready on time. We are looking forward to the NCCAA Fall Conference. In November, TUFYPAA is hosting the **ACYPAA Summit in Visalia**. **Can't wait for next weekend's D 41 Soberama Unity Day Picnic**.

N. CA Council of AA, read report from Mona: Planning for October Fresno conference is going well. Have also been attending Foster City planning meetings for the 2019 Spring conference. Happy to announce a new venue for 2019 in Rocklin. New motions made and passed at last steering committee meeting, which will be voted on in our Delegates meeting in Fresno.

2. Motion made for Treasurer requirements to include having experience serving with NCCAA, experience with 12 Steps, Traditions, Concepts, as well as other AA service positions as a treasurer, with appropriate financial background, with a minimum of 8 years of continuous sobriety.

Have created new BTG pamphlet specific to our district, for members who have just been released from treatment centers, etc. PRF was awesome. Ran into a woman I got sober with in San Diego 32 years ago.

D19, Brad: Attended PRF. In one word: “**connection**”. To listen to trustees and directors was to listen to friends who really care about AA. **Unity Day and Mike’s delegate report** coming up. Planning activities around the 12 Concepts.

D20, Lisette: Unity Day coming up. Looking for a new location for D meeting. Gearing up for Pre-Conference. Agree that one word for PRF is connection. Sat next to GV editor. I was grateful that a group of us attended.

D21, Julie: Our business meeting was well attended. Jon from NCAC came and talked about the committee. We voted to contribute \$1000. PI/CPC chair is meeting with Kaiser executives in Sept. BTG had a busy month, presenting to 7 different pods at

Roseville jail, and had 6 requests come in. Still looking for coordinator. Over 50 group in Auburn discussed 7.40 contribution and decided to contribute \$7.40 for each member of the group. Favorite part of PRF was meeting and talking to Michelle G., Chair.

items in spending plan for mileage for Foro and HWW liaisons. Should they be **permanent line items**? **Don't know** totals for this year yet. Lots of questions and unknowns.

### Officer reports

Registrar, Margie: Thank you for sending me to the PRF. What touched my heart is about the interpreted Big Book and how the groups with Muslims, Jews, and Christians all being able to read the BB in their native language. Nice to see faces of upcoming pamphlets. Continuing to get info from districts on where to send contributions. See me or email me with any questions.

Secretary, Celia: Other than PRF, **hasn't been real busy**. **Went to the** last Foro meeting. Thank you for sending me to the PRF. Most amazing part for me was seeing a mock-up of the pamphlet AA for the Alcoholics with Mental Health Issues. A few years ago, my homegroup had the bright idea of talking about that literature again, and it went all the way to the GSC and is now coming out. I got to sit next to David, the publishing guy, and read parts of it.

Treasurer, Heminia: Thank you to all the groups for sending me to participate in the Forum. All 3 days were amazing. **Went to Hispanic women's workshop and wrote my story**. Meeting the staff and looking at all the pamphlets, seeing and touching the book that was stitched

together. Bills were paid. I am about a week and a half behind in contributions because I was under the weather. Looking forward to presenting the draft spending plan at Mini-PRAASA. Has been a busy month.

Alt Chair, Matthew: Busy month. **We're working on Mini-PRAASA**. Going to be taking an inventory for the Area, with the questions in this **month's Accents**. **Working with** Winter and Pre-Conference Assemblies this month. Missed PRF, attended BTGWW. Sacramento won the bid for next year. It is 9/6-9/8, 2019 at Hilton Arden West hotel.

Chair, Jenn: This month I attended NCAA steering committee meeting with Mike. Talked about responsibilities and duties of chair and treasurer. Looking forward to Fresno Unity Day. Incredibly grateful for funding to attend the PRF. Most meaningful for me was to hear all the conversation about our new literature. Grateful that we are continuing to tell the stories of all our members and reflect the collective conscience of AA and what it looks like today. Will not be at Mini-PRAASA. Glad BTGWW is coming to Sac next year. The bid came together at the last minute. In general, we try to check with the **Area and make sure it's not going to conflict with anything on our calendar**. **Let's do everything we can** to do so in the future.

Alt Delegate, Tom: Thank you for

allowing me to attend the PRF. Activities in Area PI/CPC are incredible. It may be time to start some kind of standing committee. Had services coordination meeting, with Coastal in attendance. At PRF, I met the Chair of the GSB and our trustees for the first time. 12 Current alt delegates got together to share experience.

A second meeting with 6 CA area CPC chairs (most areas it is separate from Alt Delegate). This past week was the CA Association of Collaborative Courts conference in Sacramento. A lot of questions and conversations about needs that they have. A lot of conversations about atheists. Usually clients excuse not to go to AA. Idea that if we do it again next year to have an open meeting at the venue.

Delegate, Mike: Attended PRF and am grateful that the officers and appointed chairs had some funding to attend. What really stuck me was the personal sharing from our trusted servants about why they serve, especially the non-alcoholics. Loved Past Trustees panel. Went to archives this month. Also attended NCCAA steering committee meeting.

Regarding the social services organization asking for 60 total Big Books and 12 and 12 in Spanish and English— D37 was only able to supply a few books. Please send contributions to D37 or Delta Intergroup and tell them it is for this literature.

Received email from GSO regarding suggestions for 2020 General Service Conference (GSC) theme. Final Conf. Report electronic version received, up on CNIA website. Literature: everything behind schedule. Communications audit received from GSC. Will be discussing at next GSC. GV: Please support the GV. There should be a GV subscription in every doctor's office in the US and Canada. \$7.40 contributions — it's not too late to send in for this year. Mike discussed the 10th Tradition and Concept.

### Old Business

Proposed spending plan: Jenn said she asked the finance committee to look at if we need better language in our service material handbook about what we reimburse for. What items have we been voting on separately at the ACM that are not permanent line items in the spending plan. Maybe what we're putting in the spending plan doesn't accurately reflect what we're spending money on. We do not have to resolve this before we pass the spending plan, but it is something to look at.

Concern was expressed about a small line item for archives supplies. Request that it be raised to \$600. Concern was expressed about creating line item for CPC conferences. These move around the state and can be unforeseen or state-wide. Maybe we need to cooperate with other areas and not have an annual line item. Concern was expressed that these unanticipated expenses are supposed to be approved by the ACM. Aren't we bypassing that? Do we want to make the funds

available as a line item, or do we want to make the decision on a case-by-case basis? It was also expressed that we should trust our trusted servants. Point was raised that this proposed plan shows a deficit. It was observed that we currently have around \$33,000 in the bank and have some wiggle room. Also, that this is a spending plan, not as rigid as a budget.

Discussion of funding travel expenses for liaisons for HWW and Foro. It was expressed that we should be supporting this so we don't end up with a special elite class of servants. We should put it in permanently as a line item. It was observed that liaison positions have not been made part of any particular officer/area committee positions. We can take a look at that in the future. And that liaison mileage should not be tied to a particular position. Question was raised if an ongoing contribution to support the HWW is called for. Will the HWW be self-supporting? It was stated that all 6 CA areas contributed \$600 each this year and that the HWW is taking a look at this. Suggested \$1000 for HWW— \$600 to support the HWW and the rest for HWW liaison mileage. \$2000 for Foro liaison travel.

Sense of the body of the potential line items under discussion:

Archives supplies increase of \$300, total \$600— all approved. Adding \$1000 to CPC for statewide conferences— 3 opposed, sense of body is in favor. \$1000 for HWW, \$600 for the workshop, plus some money for liaison travel— all in favor.

\$2000 Foro liaison travel reimbursement— 2 opposed, sense of the body is in favor.

Line items to be added to proposed spending plan to present to assembly for approval.

Discussion item

Archives position: What can we do to have a longer pass-it-on? This could mean an alt chair, or chair and archivist, etc. Jeff, Archives Chair, talked about his experience. Other areas: Archives chair is liaison from archives committee to area. Archivist appointed by archives committee and reviewed every 2 years, can serve up to 6 years. As a start to change how we overlap, we could appoint the next chair this January and have there be overlap. Wouldn't have to increase the spending because we would split the duties. Will continue discussion in November.

### New Business

Discussion continued from old business of reimbursing Foro liaison mileage for this year. Celia to bring with a mileage estimate for the ytd 2018 Foro meetings for November.

We had a "What's on your mind?" session.

The meeting closed at 3:16 pm with the Responsibility Statement.



## GSR Preamble


We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.


