**Secretary, Celia:** I did the minutes and had the pleasure of attending the CNCA Election Assembly. It was a good experience, and I got good at counting small pieces of paper and sticky notes, always a good life skill.

**Treasurer, Herminia:** I am available for questions, (916) 969-3889. All bills have been paid. Continue to receive, record, and report all contributions. Spending plan was approved at Mini PRAASA. Attended CNCA Foro, participated in CNCA Election Assembly, celebrated 23 years of sobriety, and participated in D53 23rd anniversary. No finance committee meeting this morning.

**Alt Chair, Matthew:** Attended Modesto speaker meeting and went to CNCA elections and counted ballots. Accolades to D22, great job at Mini-PRAASA. We are compiling answers to the inventory and will get that out in the Accents soon. Schedule filling up with GSR schools. Please contact me if you would like one.

**Chair, Jenn:** I was not at Mini PRAASA, in England and Scotland for an academic conference. Attended CNCA Election Assembly. Attended Service Palooza for D11 and D15. Grateful for all the support, texts, and calls over the last ten days.

**Alt Delegate, Tom:** Could not attend Coastal Elections. Went to 58th

Hawaii convention. Seems like there is a need for PI in our Area. The PI breakout group was good, reached out to several districts. D43 invited me to give a presentation at their Fresno Unity Group. If your district has any need for PI/CPC information, I am happy to visit. Going to have more sharing sessions at North Hall starting in January.

**Delegate, Mike:** Coastal has reached out to us. I'm going to share that information with Craig in D15. Received an email from GSO. Everyone at GSO is thinking of us. Rick W, Pacific Region correspondent, has already received requests for literature. Spring issue of Box 459 discusses dealing with disasters — directs us to the AA Guideline Responding to Disasters. Often we don't know what to do right away. Please support the upcoming NCCAA Foster City conference. PRAASA: Received email that [praasa.org](http://praasa.org) website is active for 2019. If you are planning on attending, please register and make your reservation. Read article in *USA Today* that alcohol kills more people than overdoses. We need more PI/CPC work. *About AA* newsletter is about the elder community. New meeting guide app: Meeting information provided by intergroups, central offices, districts, or areas. 100,000 meetings already on the app. Grapevine: Free shipping through the end of the year. Book bundles, really a great deal. Monthly Grapevine is going to be on sober holidays. La Viña accepting Spanish-language stories for the 80th Big Book anniversary. They also have audio stories in Spanish. Conference call with Kathi, Pacific Regional Trustee. At GSO, AAWS, and Grapevine, there's really a lot of unity. They had an IG/CO (Intergroup/Central Offices) seminar, they requested that people be encouraged to purchase literature from intergroups, central offices, districts, and areas. Enterprise Resource Planning is being worked on. Will replace FNV. Going to lower our costs, make it easier to track literature, groups, etc. Should be done in March. GV has two new books — *AA in the*

*Military*, sales below anticipated. *One Big Tent*, far exceeds anticipated sales. Archives: Book on Bill's Conference talks should be available in all three languages next March. Video *A New Freedom* will be available in a 15 minute and a 3 minute version. International: St Louis in 2030. Sharing Session at Board meeting: Theme was rigidity in AA, our greatest danger. A staff member gave a presentation about the importance of our literature, the fellowship is often walking around with untreated alcoholism. Humor, tolerance, love, responsibility and vision are all antidotes for rigidity. Rigidity is based in fear. AA is bigger than any one of us, and than all of us put together, bigger than our Big Book and bigger than our Service Manual. We all have a role to challenge the status quo and to compromise and be accountable to each other. Quarterly Contributions through 9/30/18: 38.2% contributed in 2017; 36.5% in 2018. D27 and D40 over 60% of their listed groups have contributed this year. 32 items currently submitted for agenda topics. Some have been sent directly to publishing or committee. 18 are under consideration. Anyone can make a request for an agenda item. We have until early next Jan. to submit an agenda item. Mike discussed Tradition 12 and Concept 12.

## New Business

**Request from NCAC for \$2,500:** All committee expenses, primarily for deaf alcoholics to attend meetings. Looking into agencies that reach throughout the area. Currently rely on 6-7 volunteers. One member attends one meeting a month in Citrus Heights. One member attended a meeting at East Yolo Fellowship, wants to utilize the service for a meeting every day. Captioning is another option. Once we get closer to the \$5000, we will spread the word.

**Q:** Have you looked into speech-to-text apps that can be used on the phone? **A:** Yes, we briefly discussed it. Would appreciate more information. It was stated that the fund is to be utilized for any meeting, contacting us three days in advance. We haven't discussed travel. That is included in the translator contract. **Q:** Is the \$5000 fund enough for a year? **A:** If we were to have the

money and we started to publicize it, it might not last a year, hard to say. **Q:** Is this your target prudent reserve? **A:** That's a good way to think about it. **Q:** Are these rates set by the organization, and is this a standard or non-profit rate? **A:** As far as non-profit rate, we only want to receive that if it is available to other non-profits. That is the rate we receive.

It was also stated that NCAC would like to speed up the authorization to spend this money. How long are we going to sit around and deny this to deaf people? Also, could the contribution be split in half so we can get it passed?

Jenn stated that we will not be discussing this next month because it is the Area Planning Meeting. January is an Assembly and I'm not sure we're ready for this to be assembly business. We will bring this up at the February ACM again.

**Motion at Mini PRAASA to accept payments for GV, literature, and assemblies using square.** Jenn opened discussion by saying she spoke with Nancy, who made the motion, and that there are two parts to this motion.

**GV and Literature payments:** Has to be linked to our bank account. Finance and e-services would need to figure out how to make it work. Also, not everywhere has WiFi or cell service. Also, puts a burden on our appointed chairs that they have a cell or tablet and a large enough data plan.

**Assemblies:** Each host district is responsible for the finances for each assembly. It is easier for each district to meet with the caterer, the venue, write the checks, etc. Not all districts have bank accounts. They do not all have the technical capability to set this up. We have always given our districts the autonomy to determine how they are going to do their part of it.

It was noted that last panel we passed a motion to accept online contributions through our website. Then nothing really happened with it. It was also expressed that each district should be autonomous as far as how they handle payments. It was observed that a handful of people didn't buy the meal because they didn't have cash with

them. As far as the district, it should say "suggested" in the packet. It is so easy to set up. As far as literature and GV, we should do it.

Jenn reported that Nancy is ok with withdrawing her motion from the assembly. The literature and GV motion does not need to happen at an Assembly, it is more of a housekeeping motion.

It was suggested that DCMs tell their GSRs that GV and literature take cash or checks. It was said that we need to remember that there is a cost for this and it adds up. Also, are the appointed chairs going to be able to do this comfortably? The issue of data charges was also raised. What about data charges? The charges add up quickly. And is it feasible for the appointed chair to use their own phone or for Area to pay for a phone? And what about keeping the phone charged?

It was shared that regarding online contributions last panel, the person who wrote the website wasn't sure we could protect personal data. Eran has assured us that the problem is solved and that we can do it. Jenn said she will ask Eran, Julie, and the Finance Committee to look at their parts so we will have more information at February ACM.

**People are asking what they can do to help after the wildfire.** Jenn read from the service piece "Responding to Disasters" about how GSO waits until the local conditions are stabilized. It was stated that some groups have reached out to GSO. We currently can't even get in to Paradise and Magalia. We have no idea where we are going to go from here. We have no idea what is going to be needed. It was suggested that notes of support would be welcome. They can be sent to North Valley Intergroup at PO Box 1144, Chico, CA 95927; or District 15 at PO Box 6531, Chico, CA 95927. Or if you email [chair@cnia.org](mailto:chair@cnia.org), it can be posted and shared with other groups. Martha T, intergroup chair, said that 801 Washington St in Gridley is a place to drop off donations. (530) 632-7615.

It was also said that a Go Fund Me account has been set up: help paradise california friends of bill.

## NOVEMBER 2018 AREA COMMITTEE MINUTES (UNAPPROVED), CONTINUED

**Archives:** Jenn raised the topic of preserving continuity at Area archives. Archives has a real learning curve-- how can we get a longer pass-it-on? Archives chair, Jeff, shared how other areas have handled it: in Western Washington, they have an archivist, archives chair, and archives committee. Work at repository is done by archivist, who is appointed by the committee and reviewed every two years. He also suggested that, as a start to getting there, we could have overlapping archives chairs. If we appointed the next chair in January, we could work together for a year. When I stated as chair, I had no idea what I was supposed to do until I went to the National Archives Workshop in September.

A lot of enthusiasm was expressed and there was a bit of a push to make the decision today. Then the question of funding was raised and concern was

expressed that we would have to fund the new chair and that the decision would need to be made at an assembly. It was stated that we wouldn't have to fund both, we could split the duties. They could share rooms, travel expenses, etc. It was stated that the end result would be that we would have two chairs, one that rotates out at the middle of the panel, and one that rotates at the end of the panel.

**Q:** Is a one-year overlap sufficient? Or would a chair/alt chair be better?

**A:** Yes, maybe we could get there.

**Q:** Would a four-year commitment to the archives be better? **A:** Yes, someone would still make themselves available. The point was raised that we would need to draft a position then put it out there, and put it in the Service Material Handbook.

It was suggested that we could let Jeff serve 6 years, three panels. Jeff said he would agree to a third panel. Jenn

asked if we would be willing to carefully think this through in detail and take it to an assembly, talk about funding, a whole new position as alt chair, or have Jeff serve an additional 2 years. Sense of the room is in favor.

**Foro travel reimbursement:** Celia reported that YTD she has traveled about 1,539 miles to the Foro planning meetings. Travel was almost all from Paradise to W. Sacramento to meet D54 and ride with them. At \$0.545 per mile, this comes out to \$838.75. Motion passed to reimburse Celia this amount.

The meeting closed at 3:55 pm with the Responsibility Statement.

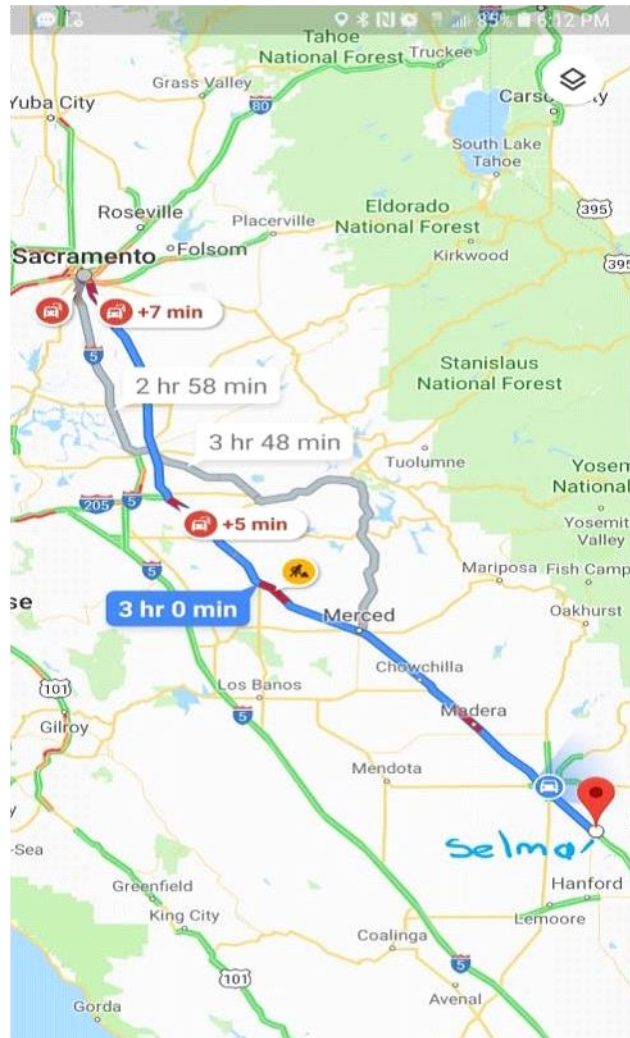

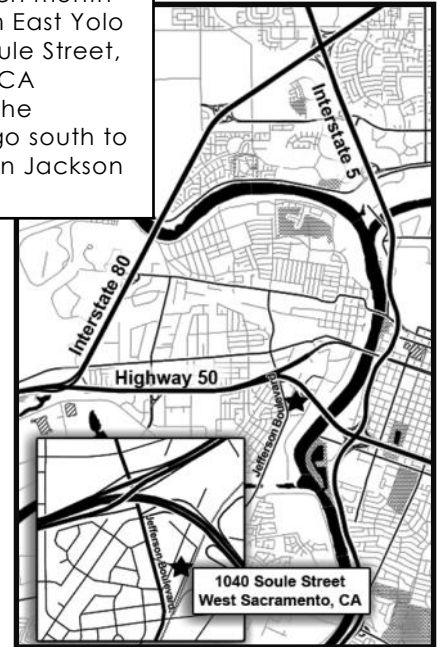
We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.

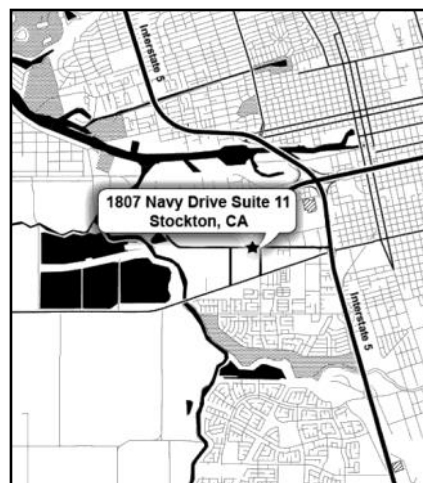
