Assembly Reports

Mini PRAASA 2018, Loren: We came out in the black with \$785.60 income for the Area.

Winter 2019, D53, Jose: Registration flyers available. Meals will be carne asada and pasta primavera.

Pre-Conference 2019, D20, Lisette: www.preconferenceassembly2019.weebly.com. Bottles available for water with unlimited refills. Pushing back to basics housing. Group that registers the most people in January will receive a pie of your choice.

Post-Conference 2019, D17, Barb: We’re working on it, we’ve had a few meetings. I’m working on accommodations. Don’t have information from the other committees yet.

Hispanic General Service Foro, not present

Hispanic Women’s Workshop, Julie: Attended workshop. Words can’t describe the feelings and joy of that day. Experience of hearing it all in translation — it’s hard. There’s a delay, items are missed. But I felt the language of the heart. Grateful I got to be a part of it. Santa Ana area won the bid for next year. Since the first Hispanic women’s meeting registered with New York in 1989, 5 more have started in S California this

year.

La Vina Celebration, Audencio: We are working hard to host you on the 23rd anniversary next July 26–28. December 23rd, we are going to get together to make the flyer. We would like to see all of you at the event.

BTG Workshop Weekend, Cindy: BTGWW 9/6–9/8, 2019. We are about to sign a contract with the Hilton Arden West. I have some of the chairs signed up but there are still openings. Hope to have more people signed up at our first meeting in January.

Approval of minutes: November 2018 ACM minutes approved as distributed.

Liaison Reports

H & I, Vikki: We have revised the handbooks and they are available on handinorcal.com. We are going to be able to reach many more alcoholics.

Central California Fellowship (CCFAA), John: We just had our elections. Appreciate all the help, just learning what’s going on.

Central Valley Intergroup, Phillip: We have extra money and I’m having fun spending it.

Fresno IG, read report: In December, we held our second round of elections for the upcoming year’s Intergroup Association Board. New PI/CPC Chair is Ron C; Dana Q is the new Treasurer; and Reyna B is the new Recording Secretary. Our 2019 budget was approved at our December meeting. Bad news is our Central Office rent will be going up, so we are looking for a new location.

Nor-Cal Bid for ICYPAA, Michelle: Putting in a bid to bring the conference to northern California in 2020. We have positions available and have our meetings on the 4th Sunday of every month at the Napa recovery center. Our committee is looking for opportunities to be of service.

SACYPAA, Emily: This month we’re hosting a New Year’s Eve event. Please join us. In January, we’re having a speaker meeting followed by a lip sync battle. Monthly business meetings on the 2nd Sunday from 1–4 at St. Mark’s Church.

N. CA Accessibility Committee, Jon: At our last meeting, we had virtual attendance available, but no one contacted us. We elected our officers for 2019. We plan to have two new smaller banners at the Winter Assembly. We decided to give the right of decision for

Delegate's Report, Mike: I made some mistakes in my last report. The agenda topic deadline was Dec 19th, so it has passed. The “responding to natural disasters” is a service piece, not a guideline. Communications report is now on the CNIA website. Please read and give input. Pacific Regional Forum final report also posted. The Spanish version is not available yet. Emailed GSO about the Camp Fire and they are willing to help out with literature. Conference agenda background material should be available at February ACM. NCCAA next March, please participate and support them. PRAASA 2019 registration open online. Grapevine: Please submit articles for GV. Upcoming topics: working with prisoners, due 1/10; African-American AA members, due 2/10; getting sober young, due 3/10.

Received minutes and reports from October board meeting, and a trustee of the GV board shared. The only way to support Grapevine and La Viña is to purchase materials or subscribe. Please participate, send stories, photos of your group, subscriptions. Subscription challenge: we have a 700% increase with over 1,000 new subscriptions. Percentage-wise we are behind a little bit. Scope of Trustees Committee on CPC/ Treatment and Accessibilities will be expanded to include remote communities. Corrections report in August, 217 requests from incarcerated AAs plus 160 corrections correspondence requests. PI: hired a consulting company to handle distribution of PSA “Changes”. Archives workshop was September 28-30 with 160 registered attendees. GSO management authorized a vendor for implementation of the Meeting Guide, for a cost not to exceed \$50,000. Literature: discussed expanding AAWS ability to update and revise AA pamphlets and books. Will discuss again. Cathi did not share information on this. Proposal to consider working on 5th edition of Big

Book. May be on agenda for next year. Translating Big Book into Plain Language has come up again. May be on the agenda again. Sharing from a trustee at large that rigidity is a problem around the world and leads to disunity. In Ghana, showing appreciation is shown by jumping up and down, instead of clapping. An AA from the US said “this is not an AA custom. That’s not how we do it.” Mike discussed Tradition One and Concept One.

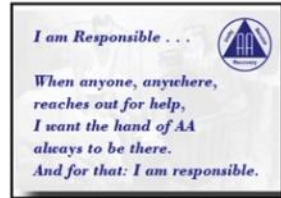

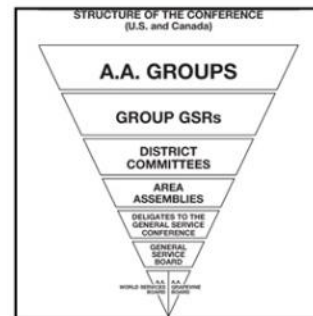

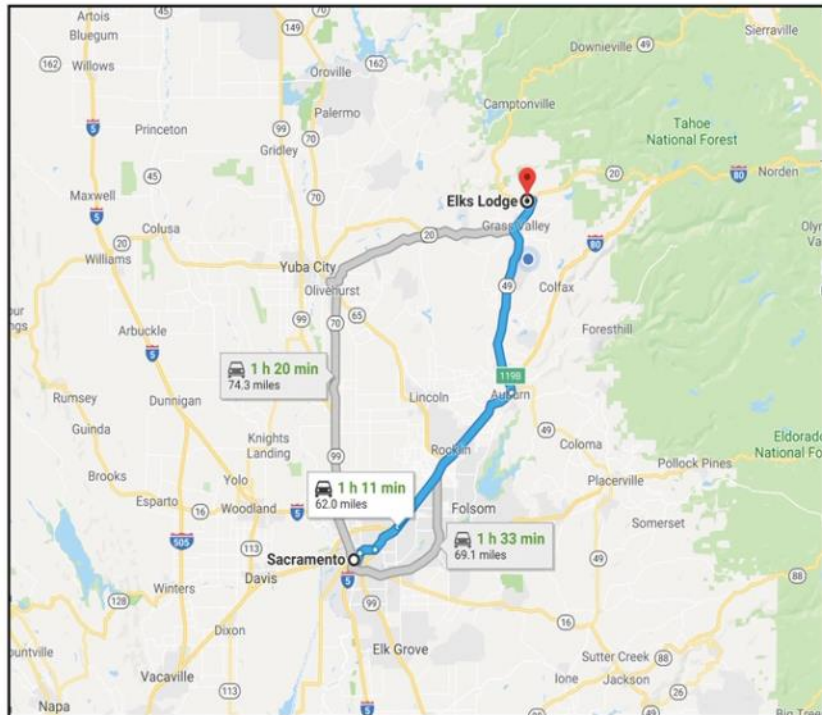

GSR Preamble

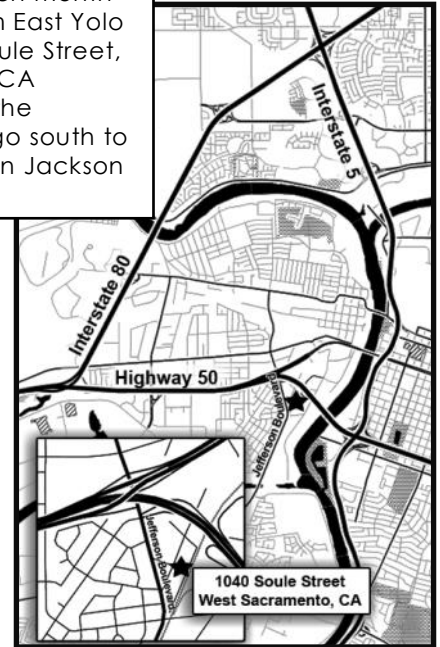
We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.

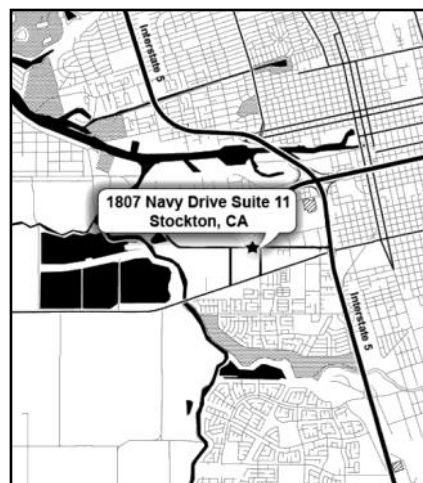
