Area Committee Meeting Minutes (unapproved)
July 20, 2019 · West Sacramento, CA

The Area Committee Meeting of California Northern Interior Area (CNIA) was held at the East Yolo Fellowship, West Sacramento, CA from 10 am-3 pm on July 20, 2019. Area Chair, Jenn D, called the meeting to order at 10 am followed by the Serenity Prayer. The long form of the Traditions was read by Mona; the Concepts were read by Norene; the GSR Preamble was read in Spanish by Victor; "Why Do We Need a Conference?" was read by Cindy.

Introductions

Jenn introduced Past Delegates Lee, Panel 58 and Inez, Panel 44. New attendees went to the mic and introduced themselves.

Assembly Reports

Post Conference, Barb: 176 registered. Our Square program worked really well. Everything flowed smoothly and no problems. Cost \$3,072 for facility. We came in over our budget. Expenses were \$539 over our income, but the district covered the difference.

Foro, Celia: We have not met since the assembly and our next meeting is tomorrow. Gave a description of what the Foro is, said that translation is available, and all are invited.

La Viña Celebration, Victor: We have visited areas in 6 states. Event is next weekend. We have about 750 subscriptions and registrations. For the banquet, it will be buffet style. Our

delegate Mike and several other people from the Area are going to participate, as well as the new La Viña editor.

Bridging the Gap Workshop Weekend (BTGWW), Cindy: Event is at Hilton Arden West in Sacramento, which we toured last week. Sept 6–8, 2019. 8/15 is the cutoff date for the special room rate. Let me know if you want to help at the event.

Alt Delegate, Tom: Assisted in a group inventory. Two PI/CPC events coming up: Collaborative Courts event in Sacramento; we will be having an AA meeting there. Also, Probation, Parole, and Corrections Conference in S Lake Tahoe. Get to participate in the La Viña Anniversary Celebration. Going to CNCA Joint committee meeting event. Regarding the International Convention, 2020ic@aa.org allows you to reserve more than 10 rooms.

Finance Committee, Brad: Accents Chair brought to our attention that our printer is increasing our costs. Not enough information yet. Increase for this month is around \$140. We are preparing the 2020 proposed spending plan. We looked at the past couple of years, and the net income for 2018 was -\$3000 and 2019 is -\$8000. for 2020, -\$13,000. Next month we're going to give the ACM a detailed proposed spending plan. If there are questions contact Julie or me.

Delegate Report, Mike: Have given eight Conference reports already. Several reports coming up, all are on the CNIA calendar.

Mike talked about the *BTGWW*.

Grapevine — Submit your stories: Aug 20, getting through tough times; Sept. 15, emotional sobriety; Oct. 15, my home group.

NCC — Next conference, Oct. 11-13 in San Ramon.

New Box 459 — Mike discussed some of the articles in the most recent issue.

AAWS — ERP go-live date is Aug. 5th. New book, first original book to be published in 30 years. Over \$91,000 in sales in first month. Archives checklist, F-221, new service material.

Corrections Correspondence Service — currently no longer a waiting list for male inmates. Lot of requests at PI desk about PSAs. New YP video, title changed to Young and Sober in AA — From Drinking to Recovery.

Meeting Guide App — they have redone some of the code and there are new features. 1st 6 months of 2019: 32.5 percent of our groups have sent contributions to GSO, over \$60,000. One district had over 58% contribute.

\$8.60 on 8/6 — this is not something that comes from GSO, it's the idea of one of the areas. We can also make distributions to other service entities, such as the district, NCAC, etc. Mike talked about the 7th Tradition and 7th Concept checklists. Two new staff members at GSO.

Old Business

Young People's Appointed Chair / Standing Committee

Most people and their districts were in support of a young people's position. A lot were in favor of a standing committee, with some in favor of an appointed chair or unsure of the structure.

Q: What is the difference between an appointed chair and a standing committee?

A: Jenn explained that candidates for appointed chair or standing committee submit a resume and are chosen by the officers and appointed by the Area chair. A standing committee, like our finance and eservices committees, is composed of currently standing DCMs, GSRs, etc. Less cost to Area with standing committee.

It was also suggested that the YP have their own district, like the Spanish-speakers do, or possibly two districts with Sacramento as the dividing line. Someone added that having their own district would make the young people feel a part of the Area as a whole.

It was also said that if there were an appointed chair, there are so many YPAA groups that it would be overwhelming. The liaison system we have is good and we should get more participation in it.

Then it was stated several different ways that the young people should have input on how they want to participate or be represented. Someone said they really feel for the young people who want to be a part of, but don't know how they fit within our system. Others said that a committee here should not make the decision for them and the young people should decide for themselves.

Finally, it was said that if we had a standing committee we would reach young people who aren't a part of YPAA and could have people on the committee throughout the Area. It's up to us—we are the Area in a sense.

Jenn said she would put together an ad hoc committee to start considering forming a standing committee and what that would look like.

Potential Conference Agenda Item about changing language in the 12 & 12: Consider changing the sentence "lustful enough to rape".

Most discussion was against the idea of changing the sentence. Feedback included:

If we change this, are we going to change the 12 Steps, the 12 Traditions. If we got rid of the words some people don't agree with, there wouldn't be a Big Book.

It's not the responsibility of AA to deal with someone's trauma brought up by

wording in the literature. The person needs to address this with a professional, not with their sponsor or AA.

It was also stated that although there is a lot of resistance to changing the literature, 90 percent of the women I spoke to were really in favor. But pretty much all the men think it's stupid. It was also suggested that the changed language be put in as a footnote. Someone said that every time we bring up a change to the literature it gets shot down. Maybe we shouldn't focus on that. This is where ideas come from.

It was also said that this discussion reminds me of some of the sharing I heard at the Conference. Last year, three ideas that came to the Conference about our literature didn't pass, and four this year. The message I get from the Conference is to not change the Big Book and 12 & 12. One of the things I heard from our trustees is to have big ideas. What if we came up with a plain language translation of the 12 & 12?

Jenn said she would email everyone the proposal brought forward by D15. Also, that if we decide to move forward with this, we don't have to use D15's proposed language or even specify exactly what we think it should say.

Spending Plan

Will bring the proposed spending plan to present next month.

It was stated that we have budgeted in the red for the last few years. What have our actual results been? We have a lot of money in the bank, where is it coming from? We have \$20,000 in the checking account over our prudent

reserve, we've accumulated a lot of money. I wonder if we've been doing conservative spending plans.

A member of the finance committee stated that we have a nest egg in the checking account that's not addressed. Oct. 2018, balance was \$32k; July 2019, \$27k. It may be decreasing and end up at zero.

Q: Is this based on a decrease in contributions or an increase in expenses?

A: Don't know at this point.

Jenn explained that the first year of a panel, when we are doing the spending plan for the second year, we know who our trusted servants are and can estimate their expenses pretty accurately. Second year of the panel, we have no idea who our next officers and appointed chairs are going to be. Spending plan is then based on an average of the last three years.

Someone observed that historically our projected expenditures end up being higher than the final result.

New Business

Housekeeping motion: Request to use translation equipment, PA equipment, and timer lights at BTGWW.

Sense of the room is in favor.

Meeting closed at 3:00 with the Responsibility Statement.

Articles from CNIA Trusted Servants

Literature Appointed Chair

Hi everyone. My name is Darrel and I am an alcoholic. I'm privileged to serve as your Panel 68 Area 07 Literature Chair. I will attempt to describe the position sufficiently to give an idea of my approach to the position.

My goal was to have up to date AA literature available for sale and presentable at AA events I attended as your literature chair. I found it important to have a clean, dry and secure place to keep books and pamphlets where they wouldn't be in the way and they would be safe from damage. It takes up an area about half the size of a compact car. I also had to have the means to haul all of this literature long distances, sometimes in foul weather. If you are spending the night at a hotel prior to an event, the material needs to be kept secure. I was fortunate to own a Ford Excursion to haul it with and keep it secure and dry.

In order to maintain a complete supply of current AA literature I would inventory the stock occasionally. It was convenient if I could do this while at an event and keep an ongoing list of items I would need to order. However sometimes I would just need to break it out and go through it to be sure what I had.

While at an event, I had to keep a receipt of all sales to track dollar amounts so that our Area Treasurer, Herminia (bless her heart), could pay taxes on the sales and track income and expenses. We more recently started using "Square Point of Sale", a credit card reader that attaches to my phone for use on purchases over \$5.00. That made it much easier for me but I don't know how it affected her. After an event

I accounted for the money with the receipts and made sure they matched. I deposited the money at the Bank of America and sent the receipts, copy of the deposit slip and the bank deposit receipt to Herminia. I had to keep about \$40 in change in the cash box for the next event. The amount I charged for each item was enough to cover the cost of the item plus shipping and tax.

After an event, I would take my list I was compiling while there and order new material from GSO. Once you get the hang of ordering, it works pretty well. The folks in the literature department at GSO were very helpful and would work with you on the phone if need be to complete your order. In just a few days, boxes full of literature show up at your house. I usually stored with the rest of the literature and organized it at the next event.

Once a month, prior to the ACM or Assembly, you need to give a report of your activities of the month prior and your plans for the following month.

I hope I haven't missed too much with this article. I'm willing to work with the new Literature Chair to help them understand their duties. If you can handle the logistics, Literature Chair is a good way to be of service. I'm grateful to have had the opportunity.


We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.


