ASSEMBLY / LIAISON REPORTS

Winter Assembly – Martin, D56 – The assembly will be at Doubletree in Modesto with Mexican food choices. Flyers will be at the October ACM.

Pre-Conference Assembly – April 12-13, 2014 – Paul K, GSR, D17 – We are moving forward with Heidrick Ag Center in Woodland for next April. More to come.

PRAASA 2017 – March 3-5, 2017 – Lela M, Delegate; Tom A, Treasurer; Jan P, Secretary – Four locations have been reviewed for the first week-end of March in 2017. We are continuing to negotiate with them.

H&I Liaison – William R – H&I voted to recommend the amended reimbursement motion to the General Committee. We discussed the proposed

budget with a proposed increase to the Prudent Reserve of \$90,000.00 (two month operating expenses). We discussed ways to participate with other service committees to spread the message. Reports reveal that scheduled meetings are not into Corcoran. Our General meeting will be October 13 in Modesto. Our H&I website, www.handinorcal.org, has the date, times and location of the local Area H&I Committee meetings in your Region. In order to find a meeting, select "How Can I Help" – a map outlining Northern California Counties H&I Regions and Areas will appear for you find the meeting(s). We need A.A. members input and encourage you to attend meetings and represent your groups.

SACYPAA – Claudio B, GSR/ Liaison – We are bidding for WACYPAA to come to Sacramento. We went to San Joaquin area to help with newly formed SANJYPAA. They had an event to help young alcoholics with a Q&A about AA. They will have elections on October 19. Currently there are no Spanish speaking YPAA meetings in Stockton. Service Palooza is *tentatively* scheduled for November 2nd at St. Mark's Church at 2391 St. Marks Way in Sacramento.

APPOINTED CHAIR REPORTS

BTG – btg@cnia.org -- Matthew L – CNIA 07 BTG Workshop hosted by D53 in Fresno was successful with 36 attendees and with Alt-Chair Mike K, and translators Luz Marie and Rose. BTG received 8 contacts with 2 successes and several letters from Chowchilla and Ione requesting other information. Those letters were forwarded to the GSO Corrections Desk. I attended the BTG Conference in Shaumburg, IL (suburb of Chicago) on

September 6-8. Steve G, Special Needs desk at GSO attended. There were panels of judges, special needs and treatment centers that shared information. I was elected as the Alternate Chair for the next 2-year term panel. We will be updating the website; create BTGs guidelines with treatment and corrections; and, plan an inventory. We have discussed Eservices extensively this year for the next committee.

We decided that figures in the Prudent Reserve should be considered or changed at the beginning of a new year. Today sent out survey about Special Needs Committee - if you have experience with special needs and wish to share, please send to GSO. Grapevine has a call for articles for Special Needs, due date is December 1st.

Contributions report available today in hardcopy for viewing for every district – to date we are at 30% of groups contributing. Groups contribute all throughout the year. The average for our area for a year is 43% contributions. Thanks to all you who contribute. For those who aren't – are they voting with their dollars, do they have concerns with GS services, are they aware of the services we provide?

Helpful to share how contributions are used. For example, the many languages our Alcoholics Anonymous book is translated for others as just one avenue in carrying the message and how your contributions are used.

GSO Staff rotation occurred in July. 75th Anniversary Commemorative Edition of the first edition is being printed and to be published April, 2014. Cost is \$12.00. The book Alcoholics Anonymous was translated into Albanian, Burmese, Quechua (Argentina, Columbia, Equator) and progress with translation on Arabic, Indonesian, Navajo, Twi (Ghana), Thai and Vietnamese.

GSO is receiving more Q and A about anonymity. Why is it important in AA? Is it OK for members to be involved in legislation? Is it OK for a group or member to be involved in legislation? We need to keep the guidelines and information updated and refreshed to members and to talk more about anonymity.

Updating your group records continue to keep track of trusted servants and those reaching professionals.

Box 459 – Laura V encourages groups to have a Literature Chair – someone to show members the wide variety of Conference approved materials; coordinate an order with other group chairs (rural areas); learn more about what is available; obtain our A.A. videos that can be shown at a meeting or special event. Central Office/Intergroup 28th Annual meeting will be in Palm Springs, CA, October 25-27, 2013. Managers, representatives, GSO/Grapevine staff and reps from AAWS/Grapevine Boards attend.

New Chairperson of the General Service Board Terry Bedient was selected after the 63rd GSC in April and 2 new Class A Trustees and 5 new Class B Trustees rotation began their 6 year term.

AAWS Adrienne Brown will be retiring November 15. The possibility of Ebooks being available thru 3rd party vendors discussion has been initiated. AAWS reviewed sharing contact with Grapevine and LaViña.

Trustees' Archives Committee has improved "Markings of the Journey" video and will be viewing it in November.

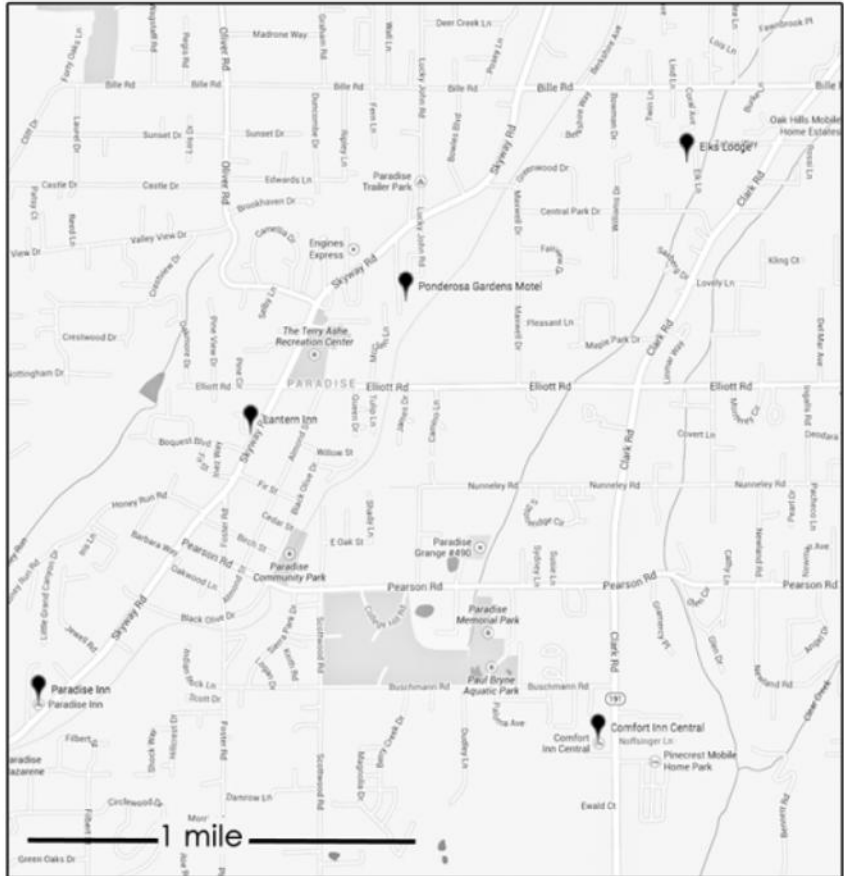

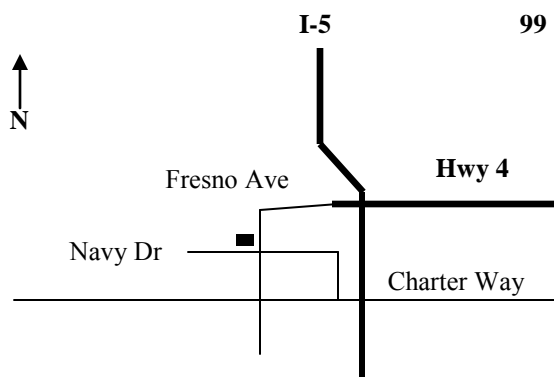
