ASSEMBLY / LIAISON REPORTS

Election Assembly – November 15-17, 2013 – Jenn D, DCM, D15 – The Election Assembly will be Paradise. We have 80 Pre-Registrations. There is online registration available and the Registration form is in the Accents.

Winter Assembly – Martin C, D56 – We have a committee formed. The flyer will be available at the Election Assembly.

Pre-Conference Assembly – April 12-13, 2014 – Jan H, D17 – The location is the Heidrick Ag Center, Woodland in April, 2014. Hotels and caterers have been contacted. We are working to have online registration. We hope to have flyers at Elections Assembly.

The travel expense reimbursement was passed at the H&I meeting in Modesto and one more approval is required by the General Committee at the meeting in 2014.

We have an event every month on the 4th Saturday at St Mark's United Methodist Church. October 26th Kari W, ACYPAA (Redding) will be the main speaker. Group inventory facilitated by Nancy M, D29 DCM occurs October 20. November 2nd we host the 5th Annual Servicepalooza co-hosted by D27 at North Hall, noon until 5 p.m. Panels include: AA Guidelines, Teleservice, H&I, YP Conferences, 12 Step Calls, Sponsorship and 12 Concepts. New Year's Eve speaker meeting will be at Crawford's Barn off Tiber and Folsom beginning with marathon meetings at 10 a.m.-1 a.m. We were able to make distributions and cover old debts. We discussed September financial statements regarding fully depreciated computer assets, checking with our accountant for further input and how we could track Grapevine and Literature inventory to help the incoming Appointed Chairs. GSO was contacted about the possibility of online contributions on the cnia.org website, similar to GSO contributions online. Tracey, from GSO, called me and explained that their system is not cost effective for an Area or intergroup but that there are multiple ways to accept online contributions to non-profits. After further research I found PayPal to be the least expensive at 2.2% per transaction plus \$0.30. (For example: a contribution of \$100 would be charged \$2.50.) The Finance Committee decided it was a good topic to discuss at the ACM. Jenn D, D15 DCM, was contacted and will have additional information.

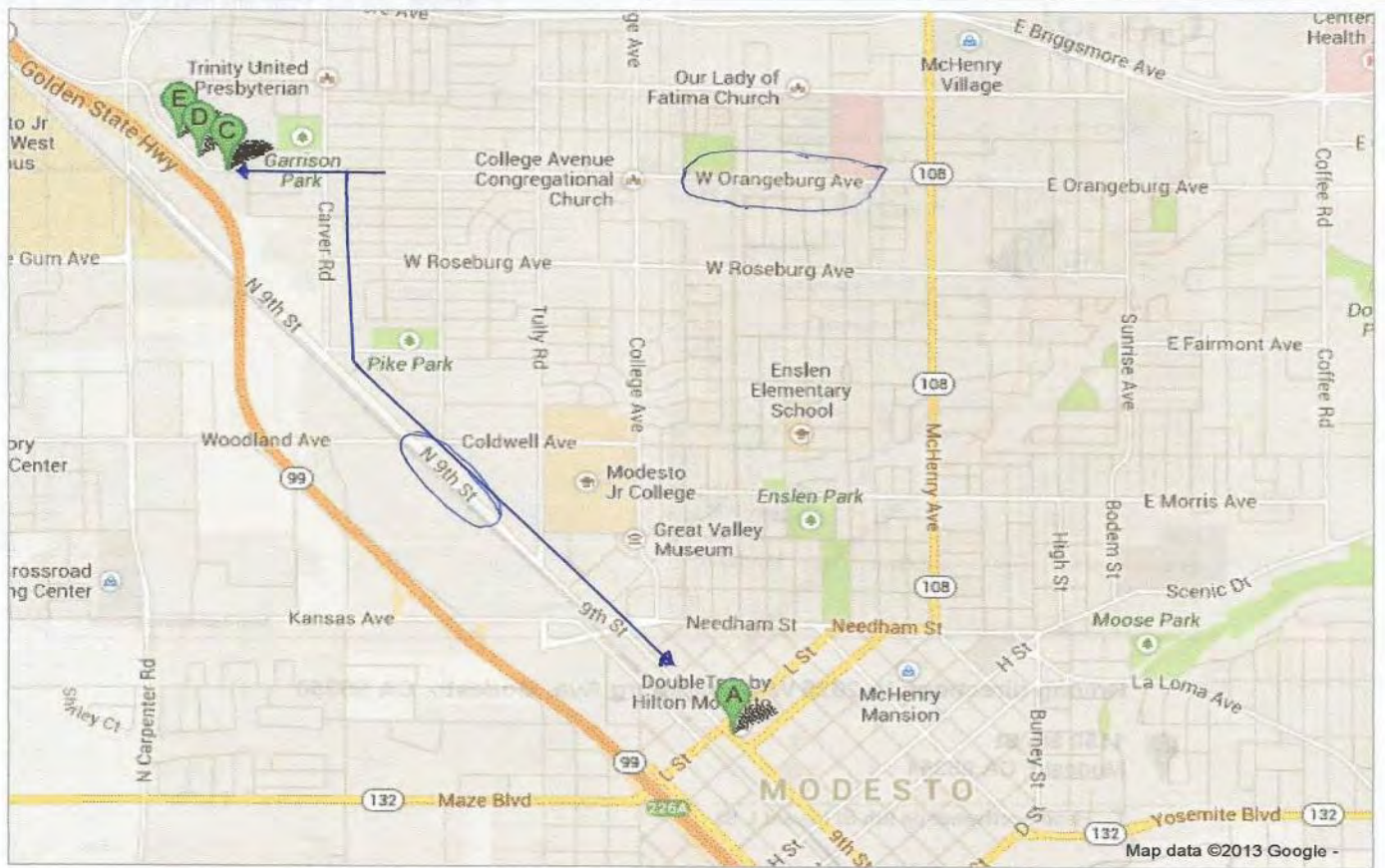

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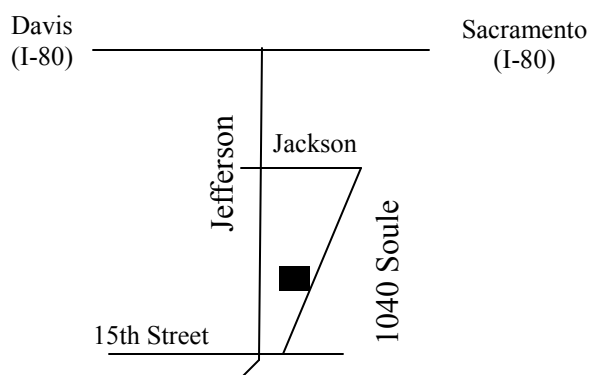

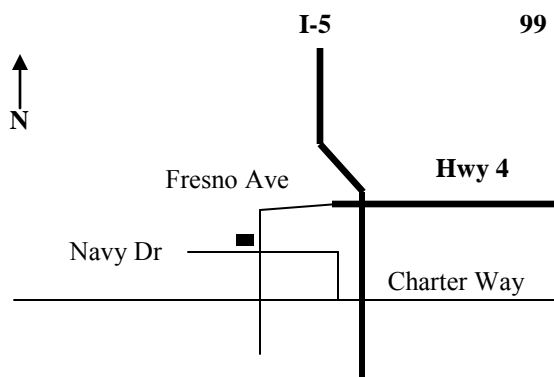
