The next item of discussion was the results of the General Service Conference Inventory presented by our Delegate, Lela M. This is the first time the Conference has ever taken its inventory. There were many ideas and suggestions. Some highlights were: What can we do overall to improve our Conference process? We could do better with the timing and publishing of Agenda Items? How well do we do floor actions? Should the Conference be rotat-

Basically the Recording Secretary maintains all the minutes, motions and ensures security of anonymity for any public media (Tradition 11). The Area has been diligent with purchasing updated equipment for the position. Officers, Chairs and DCMs have been very helpful by sending monthly reports via email prior to OR giving them at the ACMs and Assemblies. I found it is easiest to prepare the minutes as soon as I returned from an ACM or Assembly. The minutes can be done by the end of the week thus meeting the deadline for the Accents/Acentos Publisher.

As I wrote earlier – I LOVE serving in General Service!!! I've learned more about how the Traditions and Concepts work in A.A.! Treasurer Job Description

It would be short of the truth if I said that there was no fear when I made myself available for this position. While serving as the Finance Committee Chair, I had a chance to see the responsibilities of the Treasurer. I was willing to work at getting caught up with a Panel that had already started the year prior. The support from the other Officer's was amazing during this journey, and I am truly grateful. There seems to be a stigma surrounding the position of Treasurer that may be excessive. This service position may not be for everyone, but I believe there are those amongst our members that can fill this position and do it well.

The position does need to have someone with an understanding of bookkeeping and basic accounting. Being comfortable with computers and QuickBooks will help, though this is something that can be learned over time. If you cannot balance your own personal checkbook every month, this may not be a position for you; however having work experience, or some college education in this field is a plus. If you are comfortable in this field, consider making yourself available for the position.

You can expect to spend about 15 – 20 hours a month in this position doing the regular duties of this position. Contributions need to be collected, recorded, and deposited in a timely fashion, and then followed up with a "Thank You" receipt. With a little bit of repetition this will get simpler over time. There are some monthly expenses like rent and printing that happen on a regular basis, reimbursement of Officer and Appointed Chair expenses as incurred, and other miscellaneous checks that need to be printed and sent out in a timely fashion. Monthly Financial Statements for

the ACM's, Assemblies, and Accents/Acentos can all be done rather quickly using QuickBooks.

We have an Accountant that files our Federal and State tax forms and our Sales Tax Form. It is the Treasurer's responsibility to get the financial information to him so that these forms can be filed.

The Treasurer is responsible for producing a Spending Plan. This is a great opportunity to work with the other Officer's, Appointed Chairs, and the Finance Committee. The full duties of the Treasurer position can be found in the Area Service Material.

I have learned that I do not have to do this alone; the knowledge and experience of our fellow trusted servants goes far beyond that of financial matters and I have grown by that experience. I thank the God of my understanding on a regular basis for the opportunity to serve this fellowship, I am overpaid! I have been asked to do things, go places, and be a part of so many things just because I was willing to raise my hand and make myself available for service.

Thanks for the opportunity as your Treasurer; it has been an honor and privilege to serve my Area.

PRAASA 2017: CNIA 07 is hosting the 50th Anniversary of PRAASA in 2017!

Election Assembly: Trusted Servants Panel 64 - GSRs and DCMs - Please read the Officer and Appointed Chair 'job descriptions' in the Accents and talk to current trusted servants to be familiar with the position for election in November. If submitting a resume, ask family for their support.

Updates from GSO: Eva S. rotated out as the Conference Coordinator and Mary C. is the new Conference Coordinator. GSO Staff rotations occurred on July 15. Adrienne B retires the end of November and an additional staff person will be needed. Regional Directories are not being printed at this time. Mary Claire L and Phyllis H traveled to Ukraine for their 15th General Service Conference. With fewer than 90 groups in all of Ukraine, the excitement of membership has created a growing AA structure.

Literature: A calendar function was added for Daily Reflections so you can navigate to all dates and entries. The Publishing Dept. has begun the production facsimile edition of 1st printing of the Big Book to be published in April 2014! Large print of the soft cover

edition of the Big Book has been approved.

Grapevine/GSO List Sharing: GSO will send notification to GSRs or Group Contacts informing them of the opportunity to receive updates, news and info about Grapevine and LaViña publications. GSO will then provide AA Grapevine the GSO email lists in order for AA Grapevine or LaViña to send an email notice offering to receive further info from Grapevine or LaViña. Individuals may opt to receive or opt out.

Class B Pacific Regional Trustee will be elected at the Conference in 2014. The selection process for a candidate from our Area will occur at the CNIA Election Assembly.

AA Grapevine Corporate Board has an open position as Non-Trustee Director to begin 2014; resumes are due by September 9, 2013

General Service Manual: A paragraph about the principal of rotation will be added as approved by the Conference.

Finance: The Board shared some findings for United States and Canada:

2012 cost of service per member per year \$6.43 – contributions received at GSO toward that cost per member is \$4.67. Only 42% of groups participate; this is an all time low. The support from the General Service Board for La Viña was \$115,000 for 2012. Compared to the GSO budget that is \$9 million. (Tom A, CNIA Treasurer, figured on an Inflation Calculator: If you had \$1.00 in 1945 it had the buying power of \$12.90 in 2013 AND if you have 8 cents in 2013 it had the buying power of \$1.00 in 1945.) D-11 – Larry W – I am honored to be of service. Our DCM & Alt-DCM were unable to attend. We thank Lela, Vikki, Tom and Woody for sharing at our quarterly workshop last month. At D11 meeting we had a new GSR, Alex, who replaced David of Steps We Took. We also received a new group, Experi-

ence, Strength and Hope from Red Bluff that began in January with 4 meetings a week at Bethel Assembly of God. We're having discussion about BTG & PI/CPC and our involvement since we have an Intergroup Office that includes District 9 and other counties covered by Nevada's AA Service Structure. ACYPAA (nee REDYPAA) 2014 Conference Planning Committee meets 2nd and 4th Sunday at Shasta Regional Medical Center in Liberty Room #2 @ 2 p.m.

D-15 – Jenn D, DCM – District meeting is the 4th Wednesday each month. We discussed Election Assembly: D15 and CNIA websites have flyers; Steve W is Chair; Back-to-Basics housing is available. We are moving forward with our new website: district15cnia.org. We will have an election for the Alt-DCM and Recording Secretary to complete this panel.

D-17 – Jan H, DCM – We had 10 at our District meeting (Alt-DCM, committee chairs and 6 GSRs). We selected a Chair, Dan G (past D17 DCM) for the 2014 Pre-Conference Assembly in Woodland.

D-19 – Judy T, DCM – The August District meeting included reports, review of Tradition & Concept 4; summary of Traditions & Concepts 5 and 6. We prepared for Area Election Assembly and District Officer elections. The GSO Anonymity Letter to the Media and the GSO Memo about the Bill Wilson Commemorative Stamp was read. We discussed paid subscription motion to discontinue Accents/Acentos with no feedback. PI/CPC will be participating in Veteran's Stand Down in August. Considered our involvement with CCF as hotline provider.

D-20 – Dan L, DCM – D20 meeting on July 27 had 9 GSRs, Officers, a new GSR from Ridge Runner Express Group and 2 visitors. Beth, Co-Chair with Haidee R, discussed D20 Unity Day on September 28. D20 will fund one night in Paradise for the Election Assembly. Thank you D20! I thanked Jon C and Judy T for emailing the financial information and appreciated Lela addressing the question: Who gets paid for work done in A.A.?

D-21 – Rick B, Alt-DCM – Thanks to the Finance Committee for giving the talking points regarding the Area needs. These were well received by GSRs. We had the honor of Lela presenting her Conference experience last month. Thank you, Lela! Rocklin Fellowship (a vocal group passionate about the AA program) is doing a Group Inventory. Thanks to Rick B, Alt-DCM, for attending the ACM so I could work.

D-22 – Becky B, DCM met August 14 with 22 present including 1 new GSR and 3 visitors. Our Secretary position was filled. Groups were reminded that D22 elections are in October and Area Elections are in November. GSRs are to share the importance of attending to vote at the Area Election Assembly and ask groups for funding. As a result of our inventory meeting on April 11 with 19 attending, we have discussed about what makes General Service attractive and are tentatively planning District and General Service Workshops. Groups have asked our Grapevine Rep to share about Grapevine. Our Archivist is requesting group history for presentation boards. The Spanish language meeting invites all Spanish AA members to come to their meeting.

D-23 – Athena W, DCM – We met on July 29 with 3 GSRs and Alt-Delegate Kelley M who helped with our Group Inventory. We continue to reach out to meetings without GSRs. Our next meeting is August 26 when we hope to elect an Alt-DCM.

D-24 – Catherine N, Alt-DCM – We met on August 14 with 9 attending including a new GSR and Alt-GSR from Freedom Group. About 30 groups are without GSRs and we will be attending meetings about the purpose of a GSR for their group. North Hall had a Group Inventory on July 29 with 20 members present. Overall, group contributions are low. We are sending District position descriptions to prepare our GSRs for District Elections in October. They were reminded that Area Officers' responsibilities are in each Accents since the June issue for November's Area Elections Assembly.

D25 – Deanna C, DCM – We met on August 14 with 8 GSRs and 1 new Alt-GSR. Many groups are experiencing low contributions. We discussed upcoming District and Area elections and position requirements and encouraged them to be available. 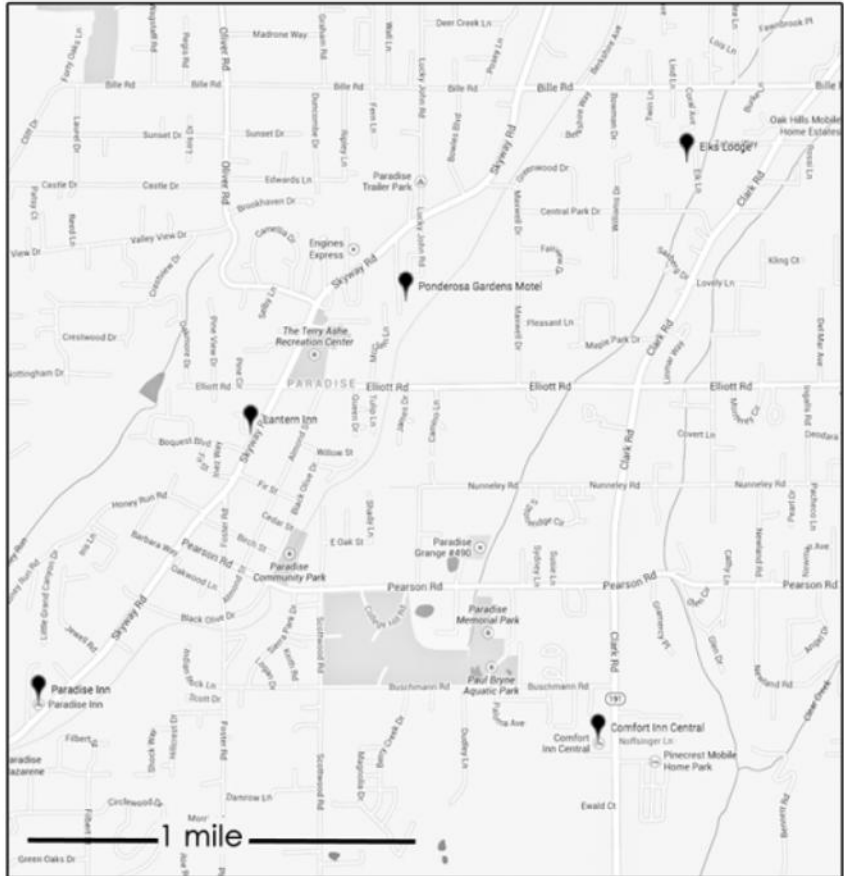

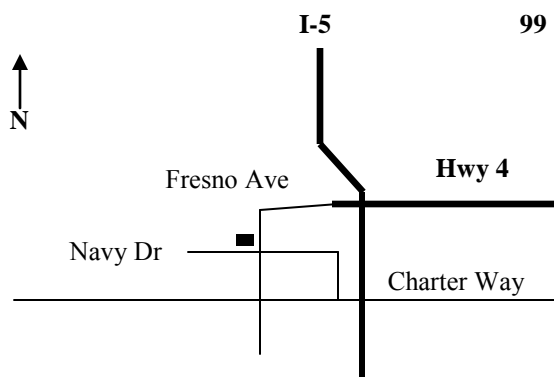
