Final General Service Conference reports will be shipped the last week of August so I will bring them to the September Area Committee Meeting where you can pick up copies for all the GSR's in your Districts.

As promised, I've compiled the results of Delegate Sharing throughout the United States and Canada on the topic: "Does your Area (or any service entity within your Area) offer professional American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters for group meetings? If so, how are the professional ASL interpreters funded? Twenty-one areas participated in the sharing. The results have been forwarded to you for your review.

Thank you for those groups who participated in our Triennial Survey. Special thanks to the DCM's who stepped up to help me administer the surveys and talk with the GSR's in the selected groups.

The General Service Office (GSO) A.A. Website at AA.org has new pages for Trusted Servants including "Information for New Trusted Servants" and "Getting Involved in A.A. General Service" with pages for DCM's and GSR's. Check it out online.

Also the pamphlet "Many Paths to Spirituality" and "Circles of Love and Service" are now available. (Many Paths to Spirituality in Spanish will be available soon.)

The General Service Board met the first weekend in August and our Pacific Regional Trustee, Joel C. sent highlights of the meeting that I would like to share with you.

Here are some of Joel's highlights:

- Registration for the 2015 International Convention will open at 9:00am EDT on September 3rd
- Recruitment is underway for the new position of G.S.O. Information Technology Manager. The position has been posted internally and on external websites. An October 2014 hire date is anticipated.

- Members are now able to make recurring contributions

through the Contributions on Line portal at aa.org

- The Conference-approved video, "Hope: Alcoholics Anonymous," will be posted on aa.org, and the revised "Markings on the Journey Video" is now available.

- A literature price increase was approved, and I believe you have received the new pricing structure that will go into effect in October.

- A request to produce a book that combines Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions with Twelve Concepts for World Service was reviewed by the trustees' literature and committee and is being forwarded to the 2015 Conference committee on literature.

- The trustees' literature committee discussed the idea of creating literature or A.A. Guidelines, or of adding text to existing A.A. literature, to address the subjects of individual safety in A.A. and anonymity as it relates to possible criminal behavior. Two subcommittees have been formed to follow up on this discussion.

- The trustees' P.I. committee has begun work on developing a new Public Service Announcement.

- A.A.W.S. will be following up on the 2014 Conference Advisory Action regarding translation of Conference background material and will report further at the November General Service Board weekend.

Remember these were only some of Joel's highlights of the General Service Board Meeting. Many other items were discussed, debated and worked on. I am available by phone, email or text to answer your questions or be of service as needed. I am forever grateful for your loving support and amazing service.

Discussion on National Technology Workshop

I wanted consideration of

translation challenges. The Conference Finance Committee recommended GSO create a plan to translate all Conference materials, including background material. Bilingual AA members need to do this huge task; professionals can't. This would allow full participation. We talked about the Steps, Traditions and Concepts. Technically savvy newcomers gave viewpoints. People recognized service autonomy. We agreed to continue with a roving meeting every year. // People wanted centralization, removing autonomy. Just because we can do something, doesn't mean we should. Thinking about technology, we need to ask, "is it the best way to do it?" Joel mentioned a template for all groups. Districts and Intergroups don't all fit together.

Q: software for translation? A: AA language is specific and doesn't translate well. Technology may help but will not completely solve issue. // All software is work in progress. We start with a translator but it must be fixed. // I work at a corporation that invests in translation. If we found a middle ground, that would help. Principles and love come first. If we can utilize resources more efficiently and prudently, I'm hopeful.

District Reports

D-09 – Lance V, DCM – District picnic is soon. GSRs are asking groups for a 3rd quarter workshop location. PI/CPC and Grapevine positions are vacant. We are good financially.

D-11 – Maureen R, DCM – GSRs are encouraged to share about General Service. PI/CPC Workshop, July 26, had 26 attendees. A PI/CPC Committee is forming and we hope to have a Chair and Grapevine Chair (new vacancy) next month. August 2 was the Intergroup picnic. Alt-DCM

Leah attended Pacific Regional Forum. We encouraged attendance at Mini-PRAASA.

D-15 – Brooke D, DCM – On August 30, Kelley M will give his Delegate's Report. D15 BTG is contacting county jails and treatment facilities in addition to coordinating with PI/CPC and H&I to meet with facility administrators about AA. D15 unanimously supports new AA literature regarding mental health issues and will request Area support.

D-17 – Paul K, DCM – Alt-Chair Nancy Mc may give GSR School at September meeting. We are considering a Delegate Report by Kelley in the fall. Five D17 members are ready to visit groups without GSRs or contacts. A Concept is discussed each month. BTG Chair and Alt-DCM are vacant. Our Workshop Chair has been gone.

D-19 – Terry D, DCM – D19 Unity Day on June 28 was financially positive and Vickie W chaired. Thank you to speaker Celia B! GSRs were given the Spending Plan/Budget, asked to review with groups and prepare to vote. D19 BTG Chair, Steve M, will do a 10 minute BTG presentation in September. Our PI/CPC Committee will participate in the Veterans Stand Down in Marysville. Delegate Kelley M is invited to present with Q&A by GSRs. They desire information on General Service and current issues. We are moving district meeting agendas toward Conference agenda and services we provide each other and the community.

D-21 – Betsy L, DCM – Alternate DCM John M is at ACM today. Young People's Appointed Chair position information was distributed, and we encouraged GSRs to get group consciences. Rocklin Fellowship was excited

to participate in the Membership Survey. Our PI/CPC Chair is working diligently and was invited to participate in the DUI program. Volunteers attended a well-received DUI session. District21cnia.org has events.

D-22 – Becky B, DCM – PI/CPC met before District meeting and discussed meeting with jail coordinator to explain BTG, H&I and PI/CPC. We are creating a list of who could receive AA literature. PI/CPC meeting information will be on the D22 website, westernsloped22.org. We are creating a 12-step call list for Marshall Hospital and others. We will create 12-step guidelines and host a workshop. Intergroup newsletter with coming events will be posted on D22 website. There is effort on everyone's part to open communication between H&I, Intergroup and District. I shared my experience at the Pacific Regional Forum.

D-23 – Joey W, DCM – We elected a Recording Secretary. Minutes were shown to the bank and post office to get new signers and order new keys. Members decided District meetings will begin 15 minutes earlier and discussed having a District inventory.

D-24 – John B, DCM – The district is financially healthy; district will develop bylaws to include defining our prudent reserve. Our Treasurer proposed a budget and the prudent reserve will be added. Unrepresented groups list sent by Area Registrar will be visited by Alt-DCM and DCM. Our Registrar position was filled. Our H&I Liaison resigned. We welcomed an Alt-GSR from an unrepresented group. Kelley M gave his Conference report, distributed draft Conference Reports, and answered questions. Thank you, Kelley! Alt-Delegate Vikki R will give a PI/CPC presentation soon. A District inventory committee was

formed. I emailed GSO regarding La Viña not being referenced with Grapevine in AA materials.

D-25 – Tim K, DCM – Group 3 has an H&I Workshop on August 31. Precisely How We Have Recovered will celebrate its six-month anniversary. We secured a BTG Workshop location for January 10. D25 agreed to send me to 2015 PRAASA. Galt AA members have their own volunteer hotline not done through Central Office or District. Kelley will provide a Delegate report at our meeting.

D-27 – Rick K, DCM – Our new Registrar is Lori. Alt-DCM Margie is leading our outreach program. We are discussing where surplus funds will be distributed; we approved a \$300 'loan' for 2015 Post-Conference site deposit. We discussed six possible workshops and approved one about Safety in AA, co-chaired by Tom, Andy and David. More info to come.

D-29 – Judy B, DCM – Rio Linda Fellowship will have a Concepts Workshop from 6–9pm on August 22 (Concepts 1-6 with Jan P, Mike K and Vikki R) and August 29 (Concepts 7-12 with Jan H, Jon C and Nancy Mc). On August 2 we traveled to CNIA Archives in Stockton. Welcome back Steve! Tahoe Park Group and Natomas Group are doing a cake/muffin booth at the CCF Picnic. Jan P will share about service sponsorship at our meeting.

D-30 – Laurese M, DCM – We welcomed a new GSR from Jackson. Our webmaster has almost created a new D30 website! Due to lower group contributions, our Finance Committee formulated an amended budget. We discussed dropping our 800 number. We are working on a November service workshop.

D-33 – Gordon Norris, DCM – Three groups have recently held inventories, assisted by Nancy Mc, Jon C and me. District records, updated by Alt-DCM Gina and me, were given to Registrar Matthew with new GSRs and contacts. Our August workshop is on Concepts 1-3, August 25 at 6pm in Sonora. Winter Assembly efforts continue and online registration is up. The July highlight was Kelley M presenting his GSC experience. Thank you Kelley.

D-34 – Jenny M, DCM – We have a new BTG Coordinator, Chris M, and H&I Liaison, Andrea C. I attended Modesto Fellowship's inventory follow-up session. I also spoke at the Primary Purpose Fellowship business meeting and explained group inventory. Two other group inventories are upcoming. Committee volunteers will create District Bylaws or Guidelines. We are interested in a PI/CPC workshop but need an organizing group. I created a worksheet for D34 groups to update information. D34 event details are at cviaa.org under Special Events.

D-36 – Gary M, DCM – Several Fellowships are experiencing fluctuating attendance. Committee H&I meetings are on Tuesdays. BTG is vacant. PI/CPC 4th of July event participation went very well. Future events include Fall Festival. D36 Unity Day, September 28, will be at Veterans Cove at Yosemite Lake in Merced. Speakers will be Vicki R, Alt-Delegate, and Nancy Mc, Alt-Chair. Mary O, Literature, and Steve H, Archives, will have booths. Theme is "Sobriety Begins with a Single Step". Thanks to Kelley for giving his GSC Report on July 20 at Beachwood Fellowship in Merced, a wonderful way to stay connected with the world of AA.

D-37 – Jeff P, DCM – Our Anonymity Workshop on

September 6 begins at 9am at Primary Purpose with four presenters and Q&A – also homemade cinnamon rolls! On September 13 at 1pm at Cherokee Fellowship, we will host Kelley M and his Delegate report. D37 has been discussing the Young People Appointed Chair and ACM rotation. This month we will discuss Assembly rotation.

D-41 – Dave D, DCM – We read and discussed Concept Eight. Mini-PRAASA registrations were sent and 3 rooms were reserved at the Best Western for 2 nights. On July 26, Kelley M provided a Conference report and Nancy Mc gave a GSR School.

D-42 – Darrel D, Alt-DCM – PI/CPC gave 25 Big Books to the public library and is arranging to get Big Books to Fresno County Public Schools. They have attended several community events and want a High School Coordinator. We're donating \$100 to PI/CPC towards their goal for book donations to the library. \$700 was split to GSO and Area. I reported on the July ACM and that Area Officers will participate in our activities. I emphasized the \$50,000 cost of returned mail at GSO due to no meeting contact and urged everyone to register their groups.

D-43 – Hurley T, DCM – We opened with the General Service Preamble and Concept Eight reading. On July 26, many attended a Delegate's Report and GSR School hosted by D41. We are planning Gratitude Day on November 8 with panels and a speaker; we will ask other Districts and Intergroup to participate. Jesse is in charge of the 2015 Pre-Conference food. To contact any D43 officer, go to district43area7.org.

D-47 – John H, DCM – On September 27, D47 will have a workshop on an informed group

conscience and sponsorship. We discussed our budget and a Finance Committee will handle the 2015 budget.

D-53 – Rogelio R, DCM – We have two study meetings, a topic meeting and an information meeting. We continue to look for a 2015 Election Assembly location and have a committee. We are visiting groups without a GSR.

D-54 – Luz Maria G, DCM – We visit two groups per week and thank them for participating. Rose Mary finished an all groups meeting directory. I asked GSRs to ask whether D54 can host the 14th Foro in 2015. We are attending the 13th Foro on December 7 and attend committee meetings on the 3rd Sunday. D54 is sending me to Mini-PRAASA. I have room reservations and have registered.

D-55 – Jesús R, DCM – Currently we have 5 GSRs. We are also working with 13th Foro. We are encouraging subscriptions to La Viña. Every Tuesday we visit a group. We are working on District 55's anniversary on December 28.

D-56 – Rosa, Secretary – We agreed to meet in Modesto in even months and Stockton in odd months. District agreed to make copies of US and Canada structure and distribute. We continue work with the Special Needs committee. The 13th Foro subcommittee is progressing. We continue to motivate subscriptions to La Viña and Mini-PRAASA registrations.

Draft Spending Plan

7th Tradition reflects average per meeting. Lit/GV sales/purchases match as well as Assembly income/expense. Accents/Acentos expense is dropping. General Service Conference is fee plus \$900. Accounting Fees is CPA tax filings. Sales Taxes is 8%. Assembly mileage and lodging assumes

sharing. ACM mileage assumes no ride sharing. Assembly registration estimates \$30 each. Officers are funded to PRAASA.

Questions/Comments: Q: What is suggested travel reimbursement for something like InterDistrict meeting? A: Area suggested 3547rate is \$0.415 per mile. // Service Material Book needs to say "if funds are available" on some items if this passes. Districts that cannot fund need leeway. // Only Delegate is funded to International. // 8180 is lower due to sales change. // Why do we increase contributions to GSO? // Does Area include Districts paying travel as income? No. // Regarding GV/Lit, we carry much inventory; we could consolidate. We can demonstrate literature without carrying \$3,000. We can carry two copies, not 25.

Communication with Linguistic Districts

I'm seeing more motivation in groups and am grateful for enthusiasm. // Each flyer could request translators. // Brooke D, DCM D15, Celia B and committee work hard translating written material. I make a motion that the Officers look at all our Translation needs and consider making that an Appointed Chair position at Area 07. // Chair Mike K: please write the motion. We will discuss now and vote at an Assembly where it needs substantial unanimity. // What have people from our District been tasked to do? They have helped with both written and verbal. // Celia helps a lot. We explain differently than Google. Written Translation should be an Appointed Chair. // Celia is already doing it. // When we created a District BTG committee, we had great response to many flyers. // Potential job description would help. // Someone needs to coordinate two parts – written and verbal. Rodney and Celia know

different people.

ASL Interpretation

ASL interpreters could donate time. For Assemblies, host District is responsible. // Q: Would we over-step intergroup? A: It's easier to start big then down-size, harder to start small then expand. // Newcomers constantly called when I was CCF Special Needs. // Are we trying to provide ASL at Area events or be a clearinghouse. That might overtake local autonomy. We facilitate carrying the message.

D15 Letter

On July 28, D15 unanimously supported readdressing mental health literature at 2015 GSC. D15 wrote a letter with reasoning. Please see your DCM. // Chair Mike K: idea had substantial unanimity in Kelley's travels. We will discuss at ACM and discuss/vote at Mini-PRAASA on whether to submit to GSB. // Conference Literature Committee took no action on this. Padee M and Kelley M made a floor action that did not pass. Class A Trustees were interested. Other Areas will request consideration. Challenge is focusing. // Letter does not limit literature format.

Young People's Appointed Chair Motion

If we saw willingness from young people, we would be willing create an Area position. It's a District responsibility. // We don't have young people's meetings. It does not have to exist forever. Would we need it in 10 years? // Both young people's groups with GSRs feel it's unnecessary. I brought information.

How well are we reaching out to the Districts/Groups that do not have representation in our Area, in General Service?

What can we do for the DCMs/GSRs from the outermost districts or districts with financial limitations so they can participate fully?

Do we always consider & include the small, remote and/or bilingual Districts?

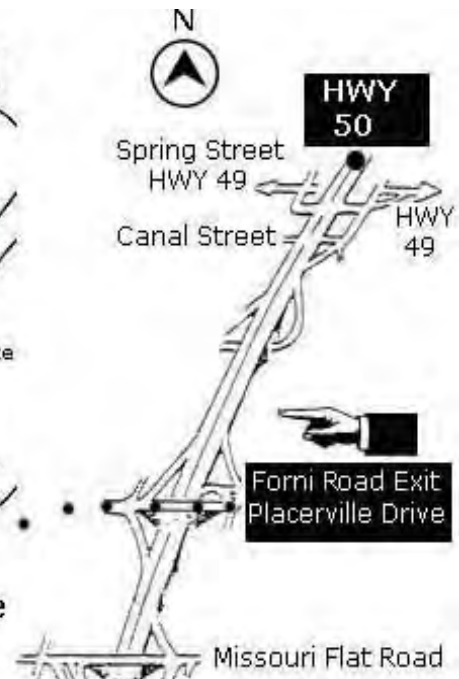
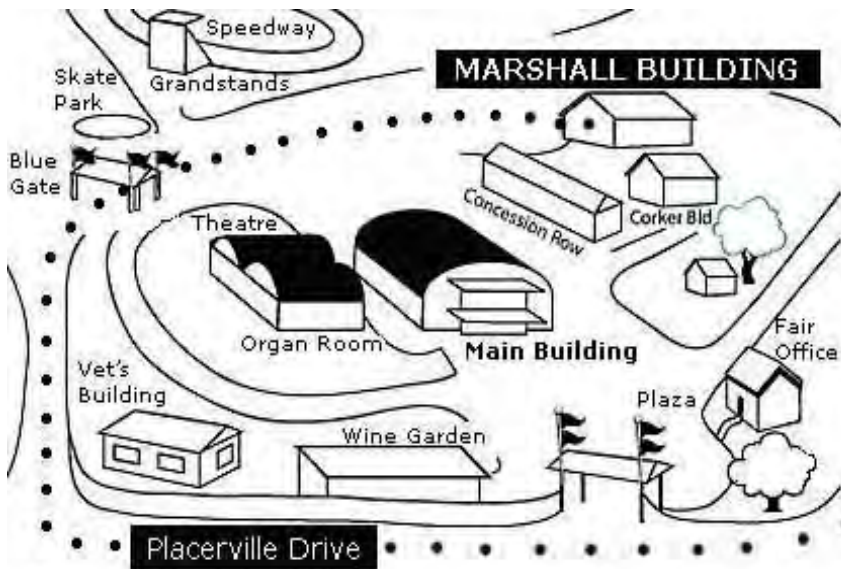

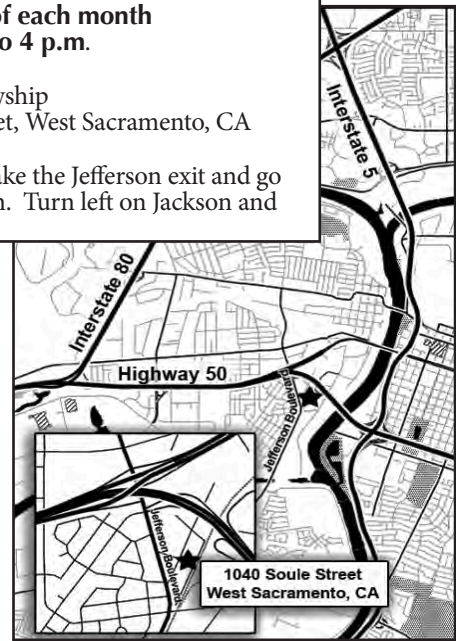
