AREA COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED) · MARCH 16, 2019 · WEST SACRAMENTO, CA

The Area Committee Meeting of California Northern Interior Area (CNIA) was held at the East Yolo Fellowship, West Sacramento, CA from 10 am-3:52 pm on March 16, 2019.

Area Chair, Jenn D called the meeting to order at 10 am followed by the Serenity Prayer. The 12 Traditions were read by Cindy; the 12 Concepts were read by Mike; the GSR Preamble was read by Victor; and Why We Need a Conference was read by Darrel.

Introductions: Jenn introduced Past Delegates Vikki R, Panel 66; and Inez Y, Panel 44.

People attending for the first time came to the mic and introduced themselves.

Assembly Reports

Pre-Conference 2019, Lisette: To be held at Nevada City Elks Lodge. Bottomless water for \$2 if you bring your own container. We have Back to Basics Housing. Snack bar going to be fabulous.

It has been my pleasure to Chair the E-Services Committee for CNIA Panel 68 and I was privileged to serve along with Tom A. (Alt-Delegate), Cindy A. (BTG), Kendyce M. (Accents), Loren A. (Alt-DCM D22), David G. (GSR D47), & Kevin B (GSR D22). I would like to thank each of them as well as Gary M. (D22) for their service. The guidelines for the committee suggest that "The E-Services Committee (be) comprised of one DCM, the Alternate Delegate or a Past Delegate, one Spanish-speaking member and two others with technical experience." Unfortunately, we didn't have any Spanish-speaking members this panel but we were blessed with diversity of other talents and perspectives and coverage for both hardware and software needs.

E-Services fills the role of an IT department for the Area.

Responsibility for area laptops, the website, email, maintenance of audio and now Square payment equipment falls to this committee. We hold conference calls prior to area events to discuss open support requests and projects that originate from the area in order to meet a need or extend our capabilities.

I was delighted to find a modern, organized, and easy to maintain website upon assuming the role. We have continued where the last panel left off and added some new features. We fully redirected the older site, added contact forms that automatically mail the BTG chair, implemented SSL on the site, and now offer online 7th tradition contributions.

A major improvement has happened as the culmination of ACM discussions: Literature and

Grapevine can now accept credit card payments at events. Teaming with the Treasurer and Finance Committee we identified Square as our preferred platform and have implemented it.

I would like to see all assets on our site moved to HTTPS, Accents online in a mobile friendly format, and establishing a reasonable standard for laptops.

Officer Reports

Registrar, Margie: Back to over 200 unknown groups. Recently set lots of Paradise groups to unknown. Busy month. Loved attending PRAASA. Represented the Area at NCCAA conference in Foster City. One of the motions they came up with was to rotate the location of their quarterly business meeting. Had a lot of returned Accents and treasury receipts. Make sure people are updating their addresses.

Treasurer, Herminia: Liability insurance has been paid, first installment. Continue to receive and record all contributions. Last two weeks I have been running behind because of a death in the family. Will get caught up. Continue to meet with finance committee. Have been participating in agenda item workshops. Had a wonderful time at PRAASA.

Secretary, Celia: Attended the Foro business meeting, went to D17 agenda workshop and the Mock Conference. I am caught up on the minutes.

Alt Chair, Matthew: If you feel overwhelmed, know that you are not alone. Look forward to seeing you at the workshops coming up.

Chair, Jenn: PRAASA was full of special moments. Inclusivity and diversity was emphasized. Participated in several agenda workshops. Mock Conference was great, with all the support. Attending workshop tomorrow at High Flyers. Have put together ad-hoc committee for proposed archives position. Hopefully will have some kind of proposal by May ACM.

Alt Delegate, Tom: Have been part of many agenda workshops and it's been great. PRAASA was amazing. A lot of area PI/CPC participation with new committees getting involved. Several sharing sessions and workshops coming up.

Delegate Report, Mike: Spanish translation of background information was late, didn't get literature committee until last Thursday. How can we be inclusive when we can't share this information with our Spanish-speaking members?

Summer NCC in Rocklin will be my first Delegate report because of the General Service Conference schedule.

GSO received over 5,368 letters from inmates in 2018. Linked over 1,268 men and over 368 women through corrections correspondence service. Mike talked

about the *Sharing from Behind the Walls* newsletter, which consists of letters from inmates and is available from aa.org.

Big Book has 21 pending translations, 16 are new languages. 4 new pamphlets are out and all available online. One has a story from a current officer and one has a story from a past officer.

International desk: FAQ handout available. Will start accepting registrations on Sept 9th. Registration fee goes up after April 15th.

Grapevine: April issue has a story from our area. Please support Grapevine by subscribing. It is the most underused public information tool in AA. Sign up for la Viña! A subscription is included in every registration to the La Viña anniversary celebration.

Received minutes from January board meeting. Revenue for 2018 was up, but contributions were down compared to 2017 (literature was up).

Box 459: Mike discussed the articles in Box 459. New archives book, "Our Great Responsibility", is out soon. Openings for non-trustee director positions — one for AAGV and one for AAWS. Deadline for AAWS is July 1st, and for GV is May 31st.

Old Business

- A. Financial support of Northern California Accessibilities Committee (NCAC)
The committee asked the Area for \$2500 to help fund ASL interpretation services.
- B. Several people expressed support for the committee, especially if they could stretch their services beyond the Sacramento area. Others expressed concern that we can't afford it. One person pointed out that according to the current income/expense report we are running \$630 behind. Area Treasurer responded

that we have funds in our bank account and most of our expenses happen early in the year.

A couple of questions were raised:

Q. Is this a one-time contribution or ongoing?

A. Just asking for a one-time contribution at this time. Wouldn't put something in the spending plan at this point.

Q. What will this money go towards?

A. Will fund interpreters for the deaf so they can attend meetings. About \$160 for an hour and a half meeting. We are providing services for one member in the Sacramento area. Going to reach out to other professional interpreting agencies in other parts of the Area and get contracts with them.

In support of the contribution several statements were made:

A. How many people will die before we get the interpreters going?

B. The officers got funded for the Regional Forum; it was over \$2000 and it was a one-time thing.

C. Because of the ASL interpreter once a month at Citrus Heights group, there is at least one individual who has a sponsor and is sober through AA.

D. What can my district do to help this out? One person pointed out that we don't know yet if it is feasible or will work, and that we can try it out. It was also stated that we don't have to figure out exactly how the translation will work or what app they should use instead, and that it is up to the committee.

We discussed if we could approve this as a committee or if it needed to go to the

assembly. Jenn explained that if the expense is over 5% of spending plan, it is an assembly decision. If it is less, we can approve it at the ACM.

A motion was made and seconded that CNIA contribute \$2000 to NCAC.

The question was called, with one person opposed to voting on the motion. 17 people were in favor of the motion and 3 were opposed.

Minority opinion: Guidelines say 5% for the year. By making an ACM decision of \$2000 we may be putting ourselves in a bind for the year.

There was no motion to reconsider and the motion passed.

B. Archives

Ad hoc committee working on proposed

CNIA TRUSTED SERVANTS – FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIR

I have the privilege to serve as the Finance Committee Chair for CNIA 07, Panel 68. I was really excited to be on this committee, but then the other members put my name in a hat and all of a sudden I was the Chair. Oh my goodness, what does that mean?

The Finance Committee is composed of the current CNIA 07 Treasurer, a Past Delegate and three current DCM's. The Past Delegate does not have a vote but their input and experience is essential.

The primary duty of the Finance Committee is to discuss any proposal of unbudgeted or unanticipated financial impact of more than \$300. It is carefully considered and its recommendation(s) are passed on to the Area Committee and/or Assembly as soon as possible. Other duties include quarterly reviews of treasury reports and bank statements, assisting the Treasurer in developing the annual spending plan and to stress the importance of 7th Tradition Self-Support.

The Finance Committee meets at 9am on the

morning of the ACM and before an Assembly.

We recently had the opportunity to discuss the possibilities associated with using different POS (point-of-sale) devices for use at Assemblies for literature and GV sales. We had to look at cost, usability and other factors. This gave us the opportunity to talk with Eran S, our E-Services Chair. Now, if we forget to bring cash or checks to an Assembly, we can use PLASTIC to purchase AA or GV Literature. What great gifts they make!

A Big Thank You to the other members that serve on this committee: Vicki R (Past Delegate), Herminia V (Treasurer), Brad E (DCM D19) and Barb N (DCM D17). Your help and support are essential!

And Thank You to our Area Chair, Jenn D, for her continued support and guidance.

language for a second, overlapping archives position. The idea is to get better and longer pass-it-on for our archives.

It was stated that GSO recommends 6 years at a minimum. Someone also said that they are finding out with their district archives that most people don't know a lot about archives or what to do with a box of material. This is a step in the right direction, but still might be following a little bit short.

Jenn asked us to take this to our district meetings and talk to our GSRs. She also said to tell her if we have any ideas and she will pass it along to the ad hoc committee.

C. Area Calendar in Accents:

Do we want to add other events?

Sense of the room last time was that we wanted to list the BTGWW. It was stated that BTGWW and La Viña Anniversary should both be listed because they are hosted by our area and will need support and volunteers. It was said that the Regional Forum and International Convention should both be listed also. Possible to put the dates somewhere else in Accents, not on back page. The point was made that we are expected to attend the events listed on the back page, that's why they are listed. Flyers for other events can be printed in Accents. This started a discussion of other options for publication in the Accents: Flyers, a little box somewhere else in the Accents, etc. It was then said that publishing flyers is expensive and a line item on the back page is cheaper.

A motion was made and seconded to add 4 events to the calendar of events in the Accents: BTGWW and La Vina Celebration for 2019 and the International Convention and Pacific Regional Forum for 2020.

Someone said they were against micromanaging the Accents publisher and the Area Chair who oversees it.

The question was called and we agreed we were ready to vote. There was substantial

unanimity for the motion, with a few people opposed.

Minority opinion: It keeps things simple to limit it to the items we are expected to attend.

There was no motion to reconsider and the motion passed.

D. Area Contribution to Conference

Some people thought we should make a set limit of \$3000. It was also said that we trust our trusted servants and approve the contribution as an Area when we approve the spending plan. If we do it as a motion to set it to a fixed amount, we need another motion to revisit the decision.

There was general consensus to leave it up to the finance committee when they do the spending plan.

E. YPAA Appointed Chair Proposal

Emily distributed a handout on what the position might look like and Jenn read it to us.

Q. This is mostly stuff is already being implemented by YPAA, isn't it?

A. We struggle outreaching to various communities, such as those that have language barriers. We don't have the same type of support that the general service structure provides. We find we are disconnected from other groups because of stigma. Many people expressed support for the idea, saying it would be very helpful to have an Area contact:

A. We need to be inclusive and help another alcoholic; we need to facilitate young people throughout the Area to share the word that we can get sober young.

B. We have 7 active YPAA committees that are trying to bid for conferences.

C. In our inventory a while ago, we failed in several areas, including YP. What are we supposed to do?

D. Area 8 has a standing committee, Area 9 has a chairperson.

E. General service was made attractive to me by other YP. YP don't see themselves

as part of general service.

F. Membership is flat. YP are the future and formalizing their significance is important.

G. Someone read part of "Why Do We Need a Conference?", expressing support for the idea.

We also discussed what it means to have an appointed chair. It was stated that they would be appointed by the CNIA chair, funded to assemblies, not have a vote, and have an email accessible from the CNIA website. There was some discussion of the difference between an appointed chair and a YPAA liaison, which we already have. It was pointed out that an appointed chair would serve all YP and YP groups, not just YPAA committees.

It was asked if there would be an age limit on the appointed chair, and if the YP could appoint their own chair. Then concerns were raised about funding. It was stated that, looking at the job description, there is potentially a lot more funding needed and that perhaps it wasn't ready. Others said that it seemed we had plenty of funds and shouldn't be scared, and, also, that only attendance at ACYPAA would need to be funded in addition to regular appointed chair expenses.

It was said that maybe we could look at the resources we have already and what additional resources and work will be required; may be good to form another ad hoc committee — do some research and come to an informed group conscience. It was also asked if we should have a standing committee instead of an appointed chair.

The meeting closed at 3:52 with the Responsibility Statement.




We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.


