ASSEMBLY REPORTS

Post-Conference, Claudio: June 20 on Zoom. Has been in contact with E-Services to try and make it feel like in-person as much as possible.

Mini PRAASA, Brad: No action at this time

LIAISONS

H&I, Vikki: Steering committee meeting 5/9. Was unable to attend but does have a report. Website: handinorcal.org has contribution page and COVID-19 resources. Vikki asked GSRs to discuss with groups: Whether Northern California H&I should consider assisting H&I local areas for rent, printing and storage. A lot of the local H&I committees are struggling financially especially now because we're not getting contributions in the pink cans.

CCFAA: Pierre: CCF activities have been hugely impacted by the COVID-19 emergency. Continuation of service is due to the efforts of the incredible volunteers who have stepped up to meet our needs. Our website aasacramento.org continues to be up and running. All financial obligations are being met. The need for group contributions has not diminished, so we urge all groups to continue their support to the best of their ability. Special events are being evaluated on an event by event basis. Monthly meeting is 5/16.

NCCAA: no report

PLAYPAA: Mary Jane. Meetings 2nd/4th Sundays on Zoom. First Saturday speaker meeting and event. Next one is 6/6.

SACYPAA, Jennifer: Business meetings 2nd Sundays. "Sufficient Force of Memory" speaker and trivia event, 5/23.

Fresno Central Office: Office is open, conducting business, holding meetings as usual.

D09: no report

D11: no report

D15: no report

D17: see email.

D19: Annette: No new meetings. Some meetings have an electronic method to collect contributions, using an address or PO Box. Through June, this may create more financial hurt. D19 is doing good financially. District meeting 5/16. May host Unity Day in late Sept./early Oct.

D20: Todd: We formed an ad hoc committee to look into assisting groups that would like to create 7th Tradition virtual baskets. 2 groups will provide feedback at next meeting, 5/30. Considering feasibility of holding Unity Day this year, and have asked for volunteers to help with planning. Zoom meeting continue. Quite possibly, having larger attendance than in-person meetings. May set up Zoom for a meeting that shut down about 2 years ago.

D21: Holly: District meetings 4th Tuesdays, 6 pm on Zoom. 4/28 meeting, 11 GSRs and 6 officers in attendance. 164 listed meetings. Many via Zoom or conference calls, some are not meeting. Don't know of in-person meetings. Groups doing 7th Tradition by digital payments, mailed to treasurer, keeping an envelope at home. GSRs reported they shared with the Delegate. GSRs have not received Service Material. Starting the process for district inventory. Put a PSA in local newspaper. BTG, PI/CPC, H&I are meeting on Zoom.

Contributions down slightly. Working on website redesign.

D22: no report

D23: read report: All meetings that are still going are meeting on Zoom only, and are listed on CCFAA website. One of our larger groups has expanded its Zoom schedule from 3 meetings weekly to 6 including a 12x12 study. A local church asked for assistance with a group that began meeting on their property without permission. I have been fortunate to work with the committee and help with hosting duties for the pre-conference meetings.

D24: no report

D25: Joe: District meeting 5/13. Seven of nine active GSRs attended. Continuing to work on guidelines and contacting dark groups. Asking committee chairs from Area and other districts to make presentations, hoping to get committee chairs. May: BTG, SACYPAA. June: H&I. Sat in on second round of sharing with the Delegate. One group is conducting physical meetings at noon and 7 p.m. daily. They found there were more than 30 people, breaking the landlord's rule to limit it to 15 per meeting. They had a business meeting on 5/14 and a motion was made to stop all meetings but it won't be voted on until next month. We wish Tom the best as he makes this unprecedented virtual journey to present our Area's collective conscience.

D27, Amanda: Most meetings still meeting virtually. Monthly meeting 5/19. Some smaller groups are talking about meeting in person.

D29, Patrick: D24 shared their bylaws with our bylaws committee. Things are moving along.

D30, Michael: All meetings are still participating on Zoom. D30 meeting went well on Zoom. We're looking forward to getting back into the rooms. We are doing our best with collecting money. Most meetings are OK.

D33: no report

D34: read report. Monthly meeting 5/13. Fellowships are doing Zoom meetings. Due to State recommendations most groups are not opening. One has remained open. Some groups started meeting in parks, practicing social distancing. In the next couple weeks a few groups will be opening the doors. We are in good standing financially. Our hotline answering service is down due to a phone company error. We are working on it. D34 meets the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 7 p.m. (Alano Club, 1660 Herndon Rd, Ceres)

D36, Julie: Meetings are being held through Zoom. Central Valley Intergroup has a meeting schedule. We continue to have newcomers attending. Discussions are being held about re-opening physical meetings.

D37, Larry: Most meetings are being held via Zoom. One is still meeting face to face, about 8-10 members present. There was a pretty good turnout for the GSR School. (Thank you, Claudio.) We will be glad to hopefully get back to meeting in the new normal, whatever that might be. I try and forward all info from our Area or NY to the GSRs.

D40: read report from Jackie: I have decided to step down from the DCM position. Due to recent health concerns and other stressors, I have reached out to my sponsor and other mentors and have come to the conclusion that it would be in my best

interest to step down. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve.

D41, Joshua G.: D41 meets 2nd Tuesday of the month via Zoom. Several regular meetings continue well-attended via Zoom. Starting 5/16: Fresno Fellowship, the district's largest meeting, is closing virtual operations and opening in-person meetings. They removed tables and padded chairs, taking temperatures, limited to 50 people, will not serve coffee. Fresno P.D. has announced there will no longer be arrests for violations. The steering committee is willing to attempt to defend a citation. District finances are well. We have approved our district business meetings by Zoom for the next 4 months. Holly, DCM D21 was at our last meeting. We are always looking to share ideas.

E-Services, Emily: We met twice since the last ACM, update a couple things on the website and update the calendar with events and Zoom meeting IDs.

Finance: Patrick K: The entire committee is here. We met and will meet again.

Written Translation: Amanda: I've received items and they have been translated.

Verbal Translation: No report

Literature: Julie: Hello, my best wishes to everyone during these interesting months! I am willing and ready to bring our literature anywhere....as soon as it is deemed safe! 2020 AAWS literature catalog is available. A-Z Index, color-coded Quick Reference Guide. There is no across-the-board price increase (and there hasn't been one since Autumn 2014). New, normalized pricing for AA Literature. Example: Big Book Audiobook CDs, ASL DVDs, Navajo and Braille will all sell for the same price. 20% price decrease on pamphlets and non-book items regardless of quantity. 6% handling fee has been removed. The AAWS Board of Directors, GSO have taken Dr. Bob's message to heart: We're keeping it simple.

Grapevine/La Viña: Brad: I am ready, willing and able to come to events when open. aagrapevine.org has free access to all 2020 issues. I am available to participate in Zoom meetings to talk about anything related to La Viña and Grapevine.

BTG: I have not received any contact information from CNCA Area 06 to pass on. Attended CNCA's BTG meeting. I want to start reaching out

to treatment facilities in our area. We have asked facility staff to forward information to Central Offices and BTG staff. If you would like me to talk about BTG in your district, please contact me.

Archives, Jeff: There is no social distancing at the repository because the room is too small. Due to health issues I am not working right now but I look forward to getting back to work soon.

Accents: no report

OFFICERS

Registrar, Herminia: I updated the Area Committee Contact List and emailed it to Area Officers, DCMs and Past Delegates, 5/15/2020. Group, contacts, mailing lists, and special reports will be updated. GSO rolled out preliminary, view-only capabilities in MyPortal. Their intention was to deliver a fully functional Net Suite by the end of March, but due to the closure of the offices it did not happen. Will be announcing plans to roll out remaining capabilities. I emailed Karen from GSO regarding DCM/GSR packets. The Records Department and warehouse are working through information changes and distribution as of 2/15. I am participating in daily Hispanic Women's meetings (10-11:30 a.m., 3-4:30 p.m.) via Zoom, meeting people from different areas.

Treasurer, Margie: I reimbursed D53 for the Post-Conference Assembly facility down payment. D21 received their Pre-Conference facility down payment refunded. I am waiting for any other assembly expenses. Emailed districts' financial reports in April. I have seen a decline in contributions, but CNIA is solvent. May 2020 financial report shows a

negative, but this is typical due to PRAASA reimbursements and lower contributions in the beginning of the year. Contribute to CNIA on our website or send a check to our PO Box. Working with E-Services to set up a virtual basket with options that will be sustainable for future panels. GSO released a letter pertaining to the financial situation due to decreased contributions and book sales. The letter is available at aa.org. Tom will bring back more information. Margie encouraged us to talk to our groups in regards to contributing excess funds and supporting these entities as individuals.

Recording Secretary, Kendyce: Submitted notes to Tom from Pre-Conference sharing. I received my PRAASA expense reimbursement check from Margie. I acknowledge that I was late to submit my paperwork and I will be more timely on this in the future.

Alt Chair, Claudio: Hosted GSR School 4/28. 10–12 people attended. Attended second sharing session with Tom. I've come to appreciate the way our area gives GSRs an opportunity to share directly with the Delegate. Working w/ E-Services to plan Post-Conference Assembly.

Chair, Matthew: I attended our second sharing session. I'm honored and privileged to be serving with all of you this panel. I talk to our delegate daily and he shares what he is doing to prepare. I have been attending a national area chair meeting weekly. I have chaired several Zoom meetings. I stay in touch with our area officers. Dropped off outdated area laptops to E-Services Chair.

Alt. Delegate, Jenn: PI/CPC: GSO press release issued 5/11. (aa.org, click on Press Releases.) Received Spring 2020 issue of "Sharing Behind the Walls" newsletter. It has sharing about AA, pre-release contact (BTG), corrections correspondence service. Is planning a PI/CPC sharing session about carrying the message of AA regarding the coronavirus and working with public health officials. We are meeting in churches but would we like to consider ourselves in the same way as churches? Jenn shared about Tradition 5. Met 5/14 with E-Services to discuss payment platforms and best practices. Our Zoom account is part of a shared hosting with other areas in the Pacific Region. It includes an interpretation feature that we would not have access to if we were on our own. The Pacific Region areas are considering continuing for a full 12 months. (We signed up for 3 months.) CNIA's portion would be \$20/month. As we are looking at using Zoom for assemblies, sharing sessions and workshops, this fee falls well within the E-Services budget.

LUNCH — Matthew recessed the meeting for lunch at 11:55 a.m. We reconvened at 12:31 p.m.

Delegate, Jenn, reporting for Tom: General Service topic speaker meeting is continuing on Monday evenings. Speakers have included trustees and staff.

Spring 2020 Box 4-5-9:

"Day of Sharing" Dec 2019 at GSO - Included seven other 12-step fellowships. Topics included translation, licensing, conferences. Clement C, heading up GSO's new Communication Services Department, thanked Al-

Anon for sharing their experience setting up their Communication Services Department. Al-Anon Executive Director talked about using Facebook and paid ads, and how that has increased visits to the Al-Anon website. This staffing assignment will be responsible for developing and maintaining Meeting Guide, YouTube and other digital and media projects. It was noted that communication is important for our fellowship. People are frustrated when AA does not use the same communication channels they see in their everyday lives.

International Convention is not happening in 2020

BB milestones: 40 millionth copy FAQs about the Big Book. \$3.50 original price. Current \$9.50 hardcover

Communications: AA.org will be updated. Redesign should be launched in 2020. The first AA website was published in 1995. Based on 2018 communications audit, there is an effort to make updates to connect with different audiences. "AA jargon" can be confusing to people because they are predicated on a historical context that newcomers and outsiders don't possess.

Enterprise Resource Planning: The system will integrate existing databases

Two articles on Informed Group Conscience.

"Fingerprints of AA" article: February 2020 sharing session. David N, General Service Trustee sharing on "Our Group Conscience in Changing Times."

Jenn pointed out that all the articles in Box 4-5-9 were written before the COVID-19 pandemic. As we start thinking about meeting in person, on Zoom, or any other decisions that we make, we consider what is good for our group but also what is best for AA as a whole.

Seventh Tradition — New service piece (developed during coronavirus): *FAQs on Practicing the 7th Tradition at Virtual Meetings*. It has shared experience from all over, links to NY intergroup, SF-Marín office, Guidelines on Finance (pre-Covid-19). GSO letter 5/12/2020 from Greg T., General Manager: \$3 million emergency drawdown from reserve fund: General Service Board approved 4/30/2020. Looking toward a true group conscience on 7th Tradition.

Q&A/Comments

My home group decided not to use electronic payments but to mail a check to the group's PO Box.

A Chico meeting is asking 7th Tradition contributions to go to GSO, Area and intergroup

My home group has decided to use Zelle, Venmo and Paypal, as most were familiar with these platforms and could access them

How many groups have announced the birthday envelope at birthday meetings over zoom?

I'm interested to see crossover with *Quarterly Report from GSO* and *Box 4-5-9*, and how opinions would change, considering the articles were all written before COVID-19. The quarterly report had a comment

about technology and secret groups on social media.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion: Change dates of General Service Conference Reyna B., GSR for the Harvest Group D42 read a letter proposing to change the dates of the General Service Conference because of the limited amount of time for feedback from our GSRs. Matthew requested the GSR email their letter to the Area Chair and Recording Secretary. The item will be taken up as old business to discuss in June.

GSR packets

Matthew informed us that Area Registrar, Herminia, updated GSR contact information in the older database. At this time, the old and new databases are not being updated.

Multiple people shared a link to aa.org for the list of items in GSR packets.

Discussion: CNIA involvement in Hispanic Women's Workshop

The workshop is asking CNIA for a contribution of \$365. Area spending plan has \$1,000 to support it, including a woman liaison and her travel expenses to attend planning meetings and to the workshop. Event date, 12/5/2020

An event is being held 5/30 to come up with a logo.

A DCM said she wants to be the liaison and is confident listening to Spanish-to-English interpretation.

We should encourage people to bring it to their meetings, not just choose someone at today's ACM call.

The Area also has \$2,000 for Hispanic Local Forum (Foro)

Action: Lorri A., D40, agreed to represent CNIA at the May 30 event and report back in June. DCMs will reach out to their districts and see if people are interested.

WHAT'S ON YOUR MIND?

We shared about the passing of Lee Wilson, Past Delegate Panel 58. We also shared about the state's stay-at-home order, using online meetings after reopening in-person meetings, GSO workers being furloughed and laid off, encouraging GSRs to keep sharing about the Seventh Tradition, and participation of far-away districts at assemblies and ACMs.

ADJOURNMENT — The meeting was closed at 1:58 p.m. with the Responsibility Declaration.

GSR Preamble

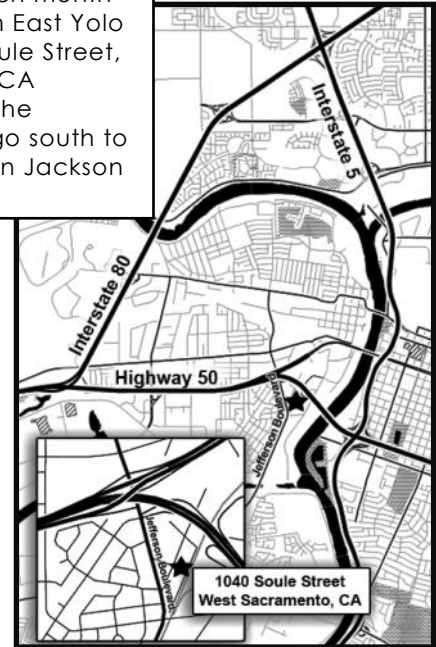
We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.
