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## ***CNIA Chair Report February 2024***

What a Great Event hosted by District 53 for our Winter Assembly in Merced to kick off the year for general service in our area. Twenty-seven districts in Area-07 were represented, and there was an overwhelming number of trusted servants attending their very first area assembly!!! We started out with *Getting to Know You Bingo*, and I hope everyone had a chance to *meet someone new, learn something new, and do something new*. Thank you to Emily, our Alternate Chair, for setting the tone, leading our GSR School, and setting up some terrific panels.

We heard our delegate, Matthew's, report about his journey in general service. The Final Agenda Items and Background material will be available mid-February, so GSRs can start planning their agenda topic discussion meetings to prepare for the Pre-Conference Assembly on April 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> in Modesto. We heard from our past delegate, Tom A., who presented background information regarding AAWS's finances and their recent letter calling for support. He led an informal discussion as members shared ideas on how AAWS could increase revenue and/or reduce expenses. These are questions our delegate will be faced with when he attends the General Service Conference.

Our Area Archives is looking for a new home, and we started a dynamic discussion to explore our relocation options. We are forming an ad-hoc committee to "explore location options, including to accommodate our archives, ACMs and AV storage," and make a recommendation at the next assembly. We also discussed 1) the possibility of forming an Accessibilities Committee in our area, and 2) considerations with regard to our assembly structure – length and duration. We can discuss these items over the next few months, and we will revisit them as old business at our Post Conference Assembly in May.

We have gotten off to an amazing start this panel, and this is only the beginning. Stay informed and stay enthusiastic. We do important work in Alcoholics Anonymous, safeguarding our program of recovery for those to come, and we can have a lot of fun doing it!

Thank you to everyone who participates to make this service work possible, and thank you for the opportunity to serve with you.

## Plannning Meeting Minutes 2023 (Unapproved)

**The December Area Planning Meeting** was held Saturday, Dec 16. The ACM was called to order by the Chair at 10am. "Why Do We Need a Conference?" was read by a member. The 12 Traditions were read by a member. The 12 Concepts were read by a member. The 12 Steps were read by a member.

Introductions: Past delegates (Inez, Tom P70, Vikki P66), guests and visitors, and anyone whose first time it was to the ACM were introduced. Sobriety milestones were recognized.

Announcements were heard.

Consideration of Minutes: The Post Conference dates under assembly reports should be May 18-19. Moved by a member to approve the October ACM minutes with this correction, it was seconded by a member. Approved by substantial unanimity

### **• Discussion:**

- It was asked the reason we do one fall assembly in Oct and one in Nov. Some of the reasons discussed were to accommodate the schedule of the Pacific Regional Trustee that facilitates elections - and the other year we can have it earlier so there's a shorter stretch after the post conference with no assembly. It was suggested the new delegate reach out to the other Areas on our same election schedule to see when their elections are.

- Would it make sense to have newly elected DCMs attend Area Planning Meetings so they could weigh in on the schedule?

**Delegate Report**, Jenn: we received a summary of financial reporting for the office - it shows what reports are available, when they come out, and who gets them. Finance F is continuing discussion about what to do with the founder's literature - there are a set of questions from the GSB that Jenn read aloud and will be posted on the website (Delegates Page > Confidential Downloads); it's the hope that we can have sharing sessions on these topics.

2025 Assembly Bids:

- **Winter Assembly**: D15, D21, D22, D33, D37 were available. D33 was voted to host

- **Pre Conference**: D9/11, D15, D37, D47 were available. D9/11 were voted to host

- **Post Conference**: D20, D37, D47, D53, were available. D20 was voted to host

- **Election Assembly**: D15, D22, D37, D53 were available. D37 was voted to host

What's On Your Mind:

- The email that came out about the spending plan deficit - I hope the office and board are

open to reflecting on this. I encourage groups and districts to think about regular contribution changes not just a one time change

- Many members thanked the area for the opportunity to serve in their positions as they were rotating out, and their appreciation for general service

### **The 7th tradition was conducted.**

Reports were not heard at the ACM but the following DCMs, Officers, and Appointed Chairs submitted reports:

- **Archives**, Nancy: I attended the Pacific Region Archives Committee, which is offering a training session on computerized presentations. Our Archives Committee would like to create a non-rotating archivist position. Relocating from our current unsafe, non- ADA compliant repository is ongoing. We've looked at several places so far, but nothing ideal. I want to thank Herminia N., Sue G., Mike K., Inez Y., Jeff P., and all those who have volunteered for us these past two years.

- **Grapevine**, Jorge: It was a beautiful experience to be part of this panel, thank you for the opportunity to be of service

Literature, Beth: As winter assembly approaches, I was in need of literature. I did a full inventory this month. As I did my inventory I noticed that there are 4 pamphlets that are not available in Spanish.

- **Written Translation**, Amanda: I translated the minutes for the election assembly.

- **Registrar**, Loren: What an honor and privilege it has been, to not only serve but to get

to know many of you. One quote by CNCA Past-delegate Teddy that has stuck with me is, "I got sober in the rooms of AA and grew-up in General Service". My point being that I've grown up more in the last 6 years than in the previous 16. All registration requests and inquiries have been processed and responded to. As usual, District Committee Members, I've posted your District's group & service reports on our Area Google Workspace. Remember to remind all new trusted servants in your district to sign up for our Area's Newsletter Accents.

- **Treasurer**, Holly: I adjusted the 2024 Spending Plan based on the plan approved at our Fall assembly last month. - Some adjustments are still pending based on 1) appointed chair position mileage, and 2) updates based on the post conference venue change.

- Removed Accents Appointed Chair line items

- Reinstated cost for Oral Translation Chair

- Added Special Conference for Archives Chair

- Includes mileage for a 2 nd day 8x/year for our Archives Chairs to work in our archives office

- Bottom line so far: increased deficit \$8,560

- Presented <15,935>

- Approved/Adjusted <24,495>

Worked with literature and AAWS to audit an outstanding literature order and paid up thru December. Doing a pass it on to the new treasurer. Placed an ad for a Special Worker position in the CCFAA By the Way. Another thought - the area could consider increasing our Delegate contribution to attend the GSC:

GSC Increasing expense from \$1800 to \$2200 (2.2%); We pay \$3500; Suggest we increase at same 2.2% to \$4200; Still about ½ of what it costs to fully fund our delegate to the GSC; Propose increase contribution to \$4200 which is in line with our current elevated contribution, closer to self-support, and opportunity to spend down or accumulated funds.

- **D11, Gayle**: D11 is still concerned about the way that the plain language book had been voted on - thank you to the officers that came out to talk to the district. Some members feel that they were not heard at the pre-conference, which our Area delegate voted for, and thought the vote was against it, a "No" the delegate voted for a "Yes" for the Area. We are contacting as many groups as possible, to get more input on the subject so we can band together and try again, have the issue reevaluated, or evaluated however it may be. Much feedback was still in opposition to change any of Bill's writings. We have many alcoholic members that feel that AA should not get involved as, "AA is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. District 11 feels and believes the changing verbiage directly engages in controversy and causes.

- **D17, Ryan**: District 17 held its election for panel 74 trusted servants in conjunction with its regular monthly business meeting at 6pm on Monday 11/21. We filled our positions

other than DCM and alt DCM. During business, we discussed the proposed district 17

spending plan for 2024 prepared by our treasurer.

- **D19, Steve:** The District finances are being reconciled by the interim Treasurer. All Groups that reported were doing well financially. There were several new GSRs/Alt GSRs present. The Message to GSRs was to register for the Winter Assembly and attend the GSR workshop. The All AA groups holiday party will be held on December 9th at Franklin Hall at the Yuba-Sutter Fairgrounds.

- **D20, Lisette:** District 20 has elected new Officers for Panel 74. Our District is planning ahead already for fun and educational events.

- **D21, Sam:** D21 Welcomes Christina A as the Panel 74 DCM! Additionally, the district elected an Alt DCM and Recording Secretary. Treasurer and Registrar positions are still open. Christina will identify our appointed chair positions shortly

- **D22, Peter:** Thanks to all who helped make the CNIA Election Assembly a smashing success. Check out our new website at [wsd22.org](http://wsd22.org)

- **D25, Don:** Finances are stable. We had elections. Open service positions for literature, webmaster, YPAA, archivist, PI/CPC and maybe special events.

- **D27, Kayla:** Claudio and Emily came out to mediate district elections. Excited to announce our new DCM, Sarah T, along with an incredible panel of officers. We are currently meeting on zoom only and no longer at the location in Fair Oaks due to the lack of attendance.

- **D30, Titia:** District 30 held our last meeting of Panel 72 last Saturday. We had what we called a Pass-It-Forward, eating meeting. We also gave each GSR a copy of the 30 Anniver-

sary Edition of the new book "The Home Group: Heartbeat of AA".

- **D34, Ada:** we still have a few openings at the District, and the new trusted servants are ready to take their positions. Our district is doing well.

- **D36, Michael:** District 36/doing well adding new meetings, had elections new, DCM, Robert and other officers. Working on the April 6 and 7th pre-conference coming up in Denair California

- **D42, Bill:** Elected a Treasurer. Discussed attendance at Winter Assembly. Participation increased, morale improved. Members volunteered to reach out at meetings to encourage fellows to enter general service.

Area Planning Meeting closed at 2:40pm with the responsibility declaration in Spanish and English.

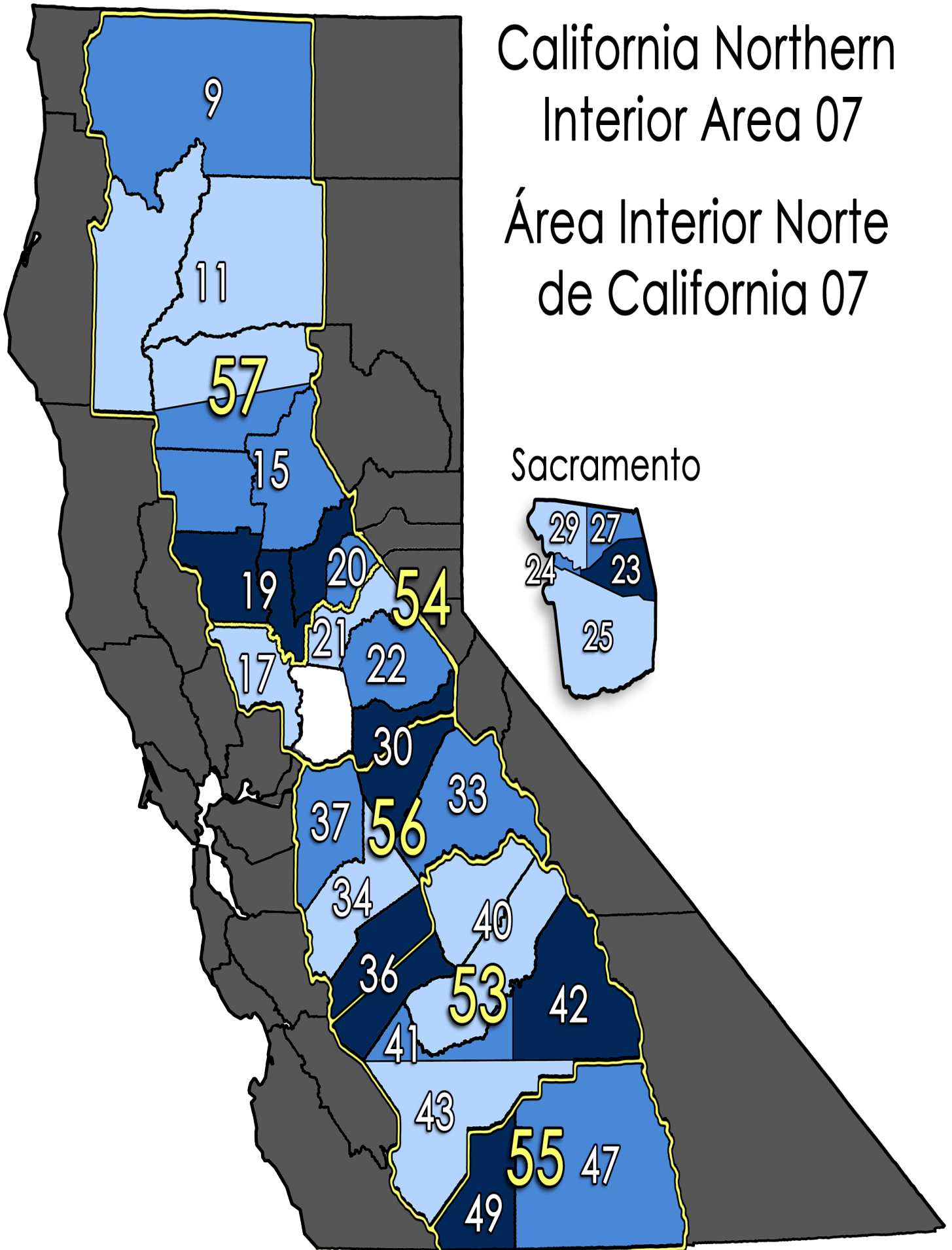
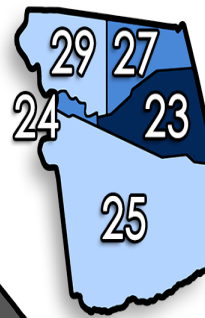

## GSR Preamble

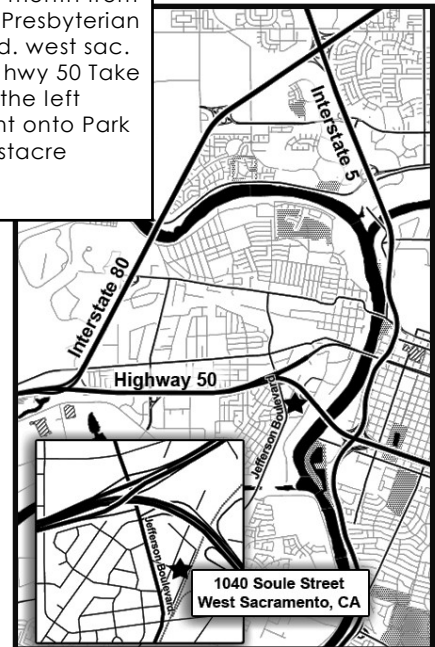
We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.

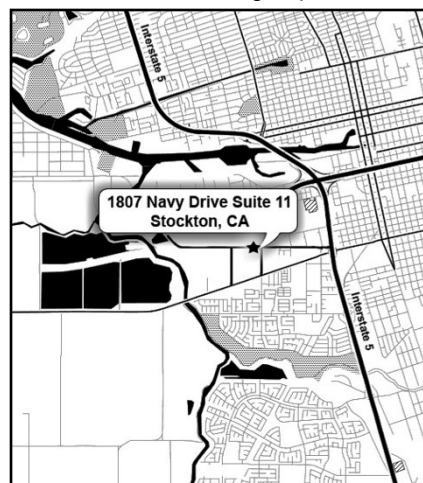
