

The first NCCAA Conference was held in 1947, Bill W. was the keynote speaker. The idea for group representation for AA has evolved into our General Service structure. Today, NCCAA conferences are held for one purpose, to carry the message. Two conferences are held each year. The next conference is:

Spring 2026 – San Ramon March 20, 21, and 22, 2026 (San Ramon Marriott) The speakers are Jeffrey B from Vancouver, BC, Megan H from Hollywood, CA and Nick H from Tiburon, CA.

The Expense/Revenue summary report, as of December 1st, is 97% revenue and 92% expenses:

Contributions are solid at \$64774.08 year to date (101% of raise to \$64,000) – thank you!

End of the month balances were: checking (\$10,156.98) prudent reserve (\$15,003.50) and prepaid reserve for the Forum (sinking, \$1,098.34); total \$26,258.82.

Regarding the 2026 Spending Plan, thank you for both the support and concerns about the plan at the Assembly, as well as

the ACMs since June in putting it together. It passed and includes:

-Overspending by \$4,167; last year it was \$3,402.52; most were okay with up to \$5,000.

-Contributions are requested of \$66,000.

-2 ACMs going virtual (-\$3,500).

-Only 8 officers/chairs attending PRAASA.

We suggested sending 7 officers and pick 1 chair out of the hat; there are other ways to decide who goes.

♦ 4 special conferences are budgeted:
Bridge the Gap, Grapevine/La Vina, Archives (only the Alternate Chair attends), National AA Technology Workshop (NAATW).

-That leaves the Archives, Accessibility, Literature, Written Translation (Oral Translation not filled) and AV Tech not attending any conference; it does not seem fair to some & our heart goes out to them.

-The Finance Committee received mixed input on past such assemblies (e.g., Hawaii, Alaska) – we were told all went and that only half went – interesting.

Let's keep the group conscience going, please – and thank you for helping us be of service!


