March 2026 ACM Minutes (Unapproved)

The March ACM was held Saturday, March 21st, 2026. The ACM was called to order by CNIA Chair Emily, at 10am.

Introductions: Past delegates, guests, and visitors were introduced.

Consideration of Minutes: Moved by Evan and seconded by Curtis approved with substantial unanimity. Motion passes.

Assembly Reports:

Pre-Conference, Marie (D19): Please check ALL preconference flyers for incorrect information. There are several mistakes on them. The first being the address of District 19. The P.O. Box number is 3422! There have been several versions of this flyer included in the Accents over the last few months with incorrect information. I apologize for any confusion this situation has caused. Our next committee meeting will be held on March 25th. We are ahead of schedule with regards to the guidelines provided by our Area, Back-to-Basics housings, availability is our focus at this time.

Post-Conference, Hector (D53): I have flyers on the table for post-conference. Everything is ready including food. The hotels are on the back. No hotel discounts because graduation is in May.

Liaison Reports:

NCCAA, Sue B: The fall NCCAA Conference will be held in Fresno October 9-11, 2026. Sacramento will be hosting the fall NCCAA conference at the Wyndham Hotel October 15, 16 & 17, 2027.

Central Valley Intergroup, Beth: Happy 24 hours you can find our website at cviaa.org Family Fun Day is in April flyer is on area website along with our website. Our CVI meeting happens every 4th Monday of the month with Alanon, district 36 and district 56 participation. Looking into opening back up 5 days a week at least for 3 to 4 hours a day.

CCFAA, Wendy: At the CCFAA Board of Directors meeting on 03/17/2026 there was discussion of the 24-hour AA hotline experiencing some issues with meeting locations not being current and that separate district meeting websites and how that data is reported to central office could be the issue. Because of this, CCFAA wants to understand, through district feedback, what prompted their district's decision to list meetings on their own websites separate from CCFAA intergroup. We will use this feedback to work together with districts and explore solutions.

Appointed Chair Reports:

Archives, Valerie: Attended the mock conference and learned a lot. Connected with Archivist with Area 06. Met YPAA members at Spring Fling and working to preserve their history. Reaching out to Intergroups in our Area. We have Wi-Fi! In January we had more visitors than entire previous year.

Alternate Archives, Michael: The Archives were open on Saturday, March 7th. Recent contributions include: Historical material from Melody (Past Delegate, Panel 60) and Sandy M. A CD of CCFAA digital historical material from Al E. (CCFAA Archivist) and Mike. Valerie, Mike L., and I met to discuss implementing WiFi access at the Archives location. This will allow for better research, digital record management, and access for our guests. WiFi should be ready by April. PROPOSED COSTS: One-time Hardware Expense: \$160. Monthly Service: \$10/month (\$120/year). Total Upfront Cost: Approx. \$280 - \$300. Ongoing Yearly Cost: \$120

AV Tech, Ron: We have a new sound board that is working much better. Fingers crossed that Starlink will continue to work.

Bridging the Gap (BTG), Valerie: Attendance at District 40's monthly meeting provided an opportunity to introduce and cultivate Bridging the Gap. Follow-up is ongoing with contacts at Sacramento County Jail and Triple C facilities to schedule presentations. Communication has been initiated with Area 06 to gather suggestions and strengthen service efforts. The first monthly Bridging the Gap meeting was held, with four members in attendance. Seven blue cards were received from other areas and distributed to districts. An invitation was extended to participate in the local Hospitals and Institutions Area 42 meeting to provide a Bridging the Gap presentation. Work is underway to develop a potential workshop within the area to increase volunteer engagement and support.

March 2026 ACM Minutes (Unapproved)

Tech Chair, Doug: I have to step down. We hard wired to the internet instead of being on Wi-Fi. working on changes to online forms and they will be in Spanish. I will still be around and I will be at Pre-Conference.

Grapevine, Christina: AA Grapevine & LaViña sales at the Winter Assembly totaled \$544, and an order for books is being prepared for the Pre-Conference Assembly (Spanish "Language of the Heart" is in particular demand). I attended the Grapevine/LaViña Roundtable at PRAASA, where we discussed funding for the magazines and their related activities. Our Chair, Emily L, was recently featured on the AA Grapevine Half-Hour Variety Hour Podcast! AAGV also has a weekly "open meeting" podcast on Wednesdays at 9:00am Pacific Time. Agenda Topics workshops are in high gear, and Grapevine-related topics, particularly the item that we consider accepting contributions to AAGV, Inc., are in demand for presentations. I have been invited to host a table at the Auburn Fellowship's Unity Day on March 28, and expect to be available for local "Writing for the Grapevine/LaViña" workshops after the Pre-Conference Assembly. I have also begun work to offer regular Grapevine/LaViña Representatives' meetings, which should begin later in Spring 2026.

Literature, Carrie: I placed my first literature order to be ready for the Pre-Conference Assembly. I am hoping to digitize our inventory in Square and streamline the sales process a bit. I would like to put together poster boards showcasing Literature racks from groups throughout the Area. So, spruce them up and email photos of your group's literature racks to me at literature@cna.org. Something to consider when seeking out information relating to Alcoholics Anonymous from Box 459 Winter 2026: The official Alcoholics Anonymous World Services website is <https://www.aa.org>. Some websites may use similar wording or different endings (such as ".com" instead of ".org") or include extra words or characters. Taking a moment to notice the exact address can help you understand whether a site is an A.A. resource." A.A. co-founder Bill W., who often called the influence of A.A. literature "incalculable," wrote in the May 1964 issue of the Grapevine, "Suppose, for instance, that during the last twenty-five years A.A. had never published any standard literature...Without its literature, A.A. would certainly have bogged down in a welter of controversy and disunity." (The Language of the Heart, p. 348).

Accessibilities, Christine: We are meeting on the 3rd Wednesday of the month on Zoom from 6:30-7:30. We are addressing accessibility needs for future assemblies. At the next assembly, those with mobility needs to have the opportunity to get in the dinner line first. Many participants commented on the loud cowbell from District 20. We are not here to police or ask that to stop. Instead, we will be providing earplugs to the surrounding tables and checking to see that anyone who may be affected by the bell be seated further away from the bell. I have reached out to the tech committee via the tech request form to see about having the zoom screens to display closed captions for those with hearing needs. We have tried it in our monthly zoom meeting, and it works well and clearly translates the voice to text. Officer Reports:

Registrar, Debbie: I appreciate all of you who have embraced the new online registration forms. The Technology Committee is working closely with me to make some updates to some of the forms as well as establishing a best practice for development of a Spanish template. When submitting your request, please remember to enter the Group ID (not the old FNV Service Number) to avoid delays in processing your registration requests. You can find the Group ID on our Group LookUp page at cna.org/cna-area-07/districts/group-number-lookup.

Treasurer, Drew: This past Monday night, I met with the new Panel 76 Finance Committee and we elected Laura U. (District 34) as the Finance Chair. Thank you also to Terri (District 29), Fernando R (District 56) and Matthew L (Past Delegate). Due to the heavy Assembly and PRASSA schedule in the first few months of every year, the Area Checking account is presently below \$5,000. I anticipate decent group contributions at the end of the quarter. Our Prudent Reserve account is intact at \$15,000, the Sinking Fund is \$1,000 and Credit Card balance is \$0. Reserve Fund As of September 30, 2025, the Reserve Fund Assets totaled \$12.078M, consisting of cash and certificates of deposit. Less the liability for unfulfilled Grapevine subscriptions of \$540K, the Reserve Fund Balance was \$11.538M. Based on the expense budgets for GSO, Grapevine and La Viña (total \$22.330M), the reserve fund balance is equal to 6.2 months of operating expenses. Note that the calculation is influenced equally by the size of the Reserve Fund balance and the level of GSO, Grapevine and La Viña expenses.

Recording Secretary, Raechyl: Reminder about minutes and how they go ACM to ACM and Assembly to Assembly. We ran into some hiccups last month and minutes did not go out early as we had planned. We are going to try again with the March minutes! Don't forget to submit your reports to me by 8 pm the night before the ACM or Assembly. Alternate

Old Business:

GSR Scholarship Fund:

Curtis made a motion: Amend the 2027 Spending Plan to include a financial assistance/scholarship fund. This fund would be for District Committee Members (DCMs) and General Service Representatives (GSRs) that may not be able to attend Area Assemblies. On a case by case basis determined by the Finance Committee, the fund may award up to 50% of expenses to attend. This fund would allow financially strained districts/groups within CNIA 07, that otherwise would not be able to attend these pertinent functions, to be better represented and included. The proposed amount for this fund is \$3000 with rules and guidelines to be determined by the CNIA financial committee.

- Clarification Needed: Members requested a clear definition of what “50% of expenses” includes (hotel, registration, meals, travel, etc.).
- Financial Impact: The Area currently operates with a projected deficit. Members questioned whether the additional cost (approx. \$3,000) is sustainable and how it fits into the spending plan.
- Eligibility Criteria: Participants asked for a definition of “financially strained” districts or groups and how eligibility would be determined.
- Equity & Participation: Some noted that remote or financially disadvantaged districts may benefit, while others suggested Zoom as a lower-cost alternative.
- Motion Not Ready: Many felt more information is needed—criteria, process, financial details, and whether districts receiving support also contribute to the Area.
- Mixed Views: Some supported the idea to improve participation; others were concerned about increasing the deficit or preferred district-level solutions.
- Additional Considerations: Questions were raised about whether PRAASA funding could be adjusted and whether any DCMs or GSRs have requested financial help

Took a vote on if we are ready to vote. 2/3 voted that we are not ready to vote. To be tabled until the June ACM.

New Business: None

Several people shared their experience at PRAASA in Hawaii.

Motion to close by Curtis. Motion passed.

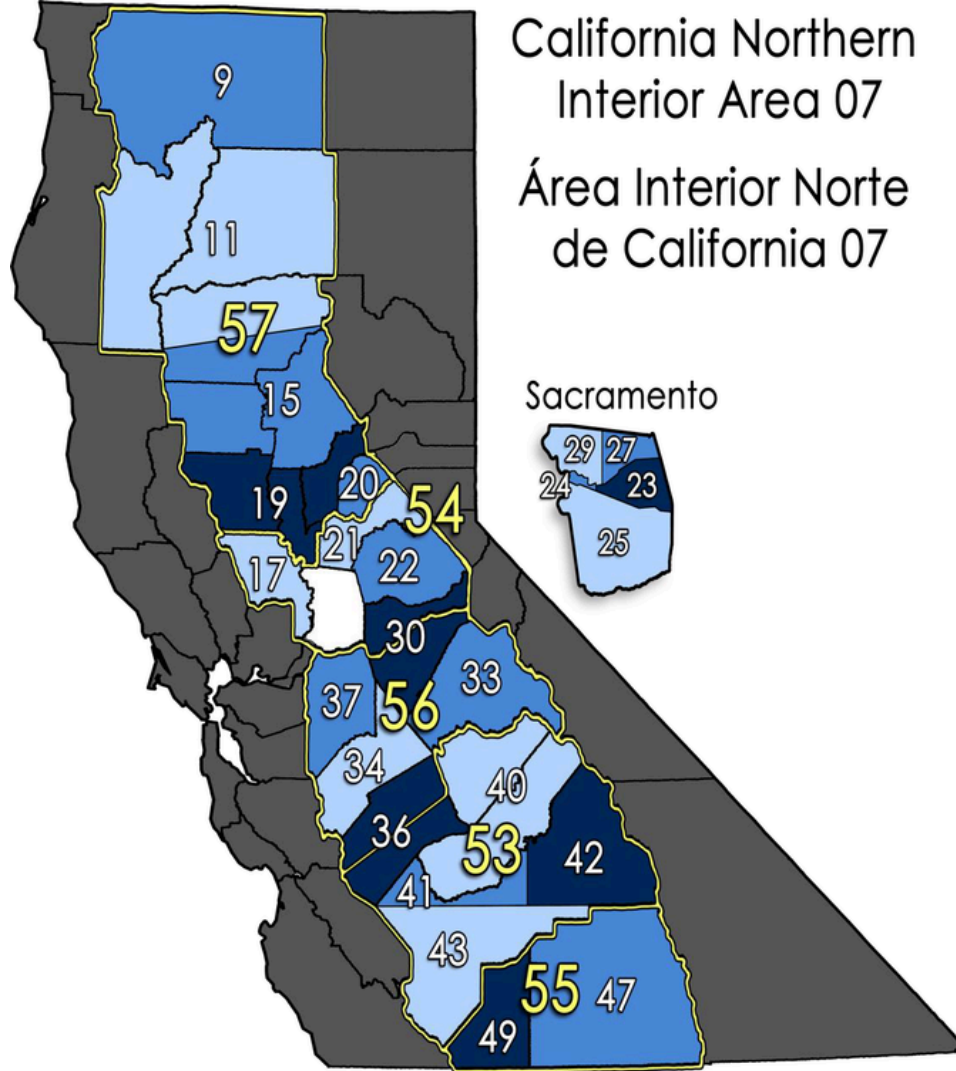
